Re: Application of GFM Caring Transportation LLC, t/a GFM Caring Transportation for **Paratransit** authority, 911 Old Silver Spring Road, Mechanicsburg, Cumberland County, Pennsylvania 17055. (929) 395-6685

To whom it may concern:

The purpose of this Letter is to advise you that your application for **Paratransit** authority at Docket No. A-2026-3059730 has been **DENIED** by the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (Commission). The Commission has determined that a Certificate of Public Convenience shall not be granted for the following reason(s):

- **Failure to establish financial fitness to operate.** Under 52 Pa. Code §41.14(1) The Commission is to determine whether an applicant possesses the technical and financial ability to provide the proposed service. On January 13, 2026, the application of GFM Caring Transportation LLC was accepted for filing and docketed with the Public Utility Commission. In this application, the applicant failed to complete the required Statement of Financial Position. On January 21, 2026, the applicant was issued a data request directing them to provide a completed statement of financial position, as well as supporting documentation that verified the applicant's financial position. In this request they were also informed that if they had not fully funded and equipped the business that now was the time to do so, and failure to do so was grounds for their application being denied. In the applicant's subsequent response, they once again failed to provide evidence of their financial position, as such, the Commission has no choice but to determine that the applicant does not possess the required financial fitness to provide safe, efficient, and reliable transportation.
- **Failure to establish fitness to operate.** Under 52 Pa. Code §41.14(4) The Commission is to determine whether an applicant possesses the technical and financial ability to provide the proposed service. On January 21, 2026, the applicant was issued a data request directing them to provide compliant policies/plans for the hiring/employment of

drivers of its vehicles. In its request, the Commission provided the relevant statutory citations and relevant guidance for the applicant to reference when preparing its revisions. In their response to the Commission's data request the applicant has been unable to provide policies for the hiring/employment of its drivers that complied with the Commission's regulations, specifically when it comes to the frequency of criminal history record checks [52 Pa. Code §29.505(a)(2)], the record retention of criminal history checks [52 Pa. Code §29.505(a)(4)], and the maintenance of driver history checks [52 Pa. Code §29.504(a)(3)]. Therefore, it is has been determined that the applicant lacks the technical fitness required to provide safe, efficient, and reliable transportation.

For this reason(s), your application is **DENIED** and **DISMISSED**.

APPEAL RIGHTS

If you disagree with this determination, you may send a Petition for Reconsideration from Staff Action (Petition) to: Secretary, PA Public Utility Commission, 400 North Street, Harrisburg, PA 17120. Such a Petition is a written statement asking the Commission to change its determination.

ALL Parties to proceedings pending before the Commission are advised to open and use an e-filing account through the Commission's website, OR you may submit your filing by mail. If a filing contains confidential or proprietary material, the filing is required to be mail.

The Petition must be filed with the Commission within twenty (20) days of the date of this letter. If no timely request for reconsideration is made, this action will be deemed to be the final action of the Commission.

The Petition **MUST** include: (1) a written statement (divided into numbered paragraphs) outlining the reasons for the request, (2) the case docket number(s) (they are provided for you at the top right-hand corner of this letter), (3) the name of the person on whose behalf the petition is made, (4) copies of relevant documentation, and (5) a verification with original signature. *See* 52 Pa. Code §§1.31 and 5.44. Below is a sample Verification:
