The responses to questions 5(a), 5(b), 5(c), 5(d) and 5(e) of the verified statements are insufficient. Title 52 Pa. Code § 29 provides detailed requirements. Please provide a system which incorporates code specified compliance requirements in regard to frequency and retention of those driver records. Each of your answers to sections of this question were insufficient:

- § 29.504. Driver history
- § 29.505. Criminal history.

5(a) Drivers must possess a valid driver's license and be a minimum of 21 years of age with a clear driving record and criminal history. Driver skill level will be evaluated by RHS management.

5(b) RHS shall obtain and review criminal histories from the Pennsylvania State Police and any other state the person resided in for the past 12 months. RHS shall obtain and review criminal histories every 2 years from the date of the last criminal history check and every 2 years thereafter. Any person convicted of a felony or misdemeanor to the extent that it adversely affects that persons suitability to provide services safely and legally will not be permitted to operate a vehicle. Copies of criminal histories will be maintained and secured for a minimum of 3 years at RHS Safety offices.

5(c) Driver training will be conducted by RHS Management prior to operating a vehicle in service. Training will cover familiarization with vehicle controls and characteristics, safe operation of the vehicle in all driving conditions, daily safety checks. Drivers will be evaluated for safe driving techniques, knowledge of the vehicle and attentiveness to the safety of the passengers and themselves.

5(d) RHS shall obtain and review a driver history from the appropriate agency of every state in which that person held a motor vehicle operator's license or permit during the preceding 3 years. RHS shall review driver history reports within 12 months of the initial driver history report for each driver and every 12 months thereafter. Copies of the driver history will be maintained and secured for a minimum of 2 years at RHS Safety offices.

5(e) A driver may not use alcohol or controlled substances, be under the influence of alcohol or controlled substance, or have any measured alcohol or controlled substance concentration or detected presence of alcohol or controlled substance, while operating a vehicle in passenger service. Drivers who are in violation of this will face

grounds for immediate termination. Any employee may be drug tested following an accident, incident or reasonable suspicion. Applicants will be subject to drug and alcohol testing prior to becoming a driver.

Additional Notes

- (a) RHS Safety's insurance agent has confirmed with insurance company they will provide Liability Form E for leased vehicles.
- (b) RHS Safety has a signed contract pending with PennHighlands, to be approved at their next Board meeting
