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

NOW COME Shipley Choice, LLC d/b/a Shipley Energy (“Shipley”) and Interstate Gas Supply, LLC d/b/a IGS Energy (“IGS”) (collectively “EGS Parties”), by and through their counsel, HMS Legal LLP, and hereby petition the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (“Commission”) to intervene in the above-captioned proceeding pursuant to 52 Pa. Code §5.71. *et. seq.* In support of this Petition to Intervene, the EGS Parties’ state and aver as follows:

1. On February 3, 2026, FirstEnergy Pennsylvania Electric Company (“FirstEnergy” or “the Company”) filed a Petition for Approval of Default Service Plan (“Petition”) at the Docket Number identified above. The Petition was filed pursuant to Section 2807(e) of the Public Utility Code, and concerns the rates, energy procurement and other aspects of FirstEnergy’s default service plan.

2. On February 10, 2026, Presiding Administrative Law Judges, The Honorable Mark A. Hoyer and The Honorable Erin L. Gannon, issued a Telephonic Prehearing Conference Notice setting the date and time for a Call-In Telephonic Prehearing Conference on March 19, 2026, at 10:00 AM.

3. The EGS Parties are represented in this matter by the following counsel:

Todd S. Stewart, PA Attorney I.D. No. 75556
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4. Each of the EGS Parties currently serves customers on at least one of the Companies' systems. As such, individually and collectively, they have a direct and immediate interest in any modifications to the terms and conditions of the Companies' default service programs, which will have a direct impact on their ability to serve customers. The EGS Parties have a clear interest in any tariff provisions or other requirements, whether new or existing, that directly have impacted or will impact the ability EGS Parties to reasonably and fairly serve customers on the Companies' systems.

5. In particular, the EGS Parties are concerned that the Companies are proposing modifications to the requirements for EGSs to serve customers on the FirstEnergy system and that these proposals are contrary to the Electricity Generation Customer Choice and Competition Act (66 Pa. C.S. § 2801, et seq.), and Commission Regulations promulgated under the authority granted therein.


6. The EGS Parties reserve the right to address any and all aspects of the FirstEnergy filing and other positions, whether taken by FirstEnergy or any party hereto, and as may be warranted through testimony, briefs, and other submissions as appropriate.

7. Because the EGS Parties serve customers in the service territories of the Companies, and because the proposals in the Companies' default service plans will have a direct and immediate impact on each of the EGS Parties, the EGS Parties' interests are therefore

substantial, and cannot be represented by any other party to this proceeding. The EGS Parties clearly will be bound by any decision that the Commission might make with regard to the Companies' proposed changes. Therefore, the EGS Parties request that their intervention be granted and that they be granted full party status in this matter.

WHEREFORE, Shipley Choice, LLC d/b/a Shipley Energy ("Shipley") and Interstate Gas Supply, LLC d/b/a IGS Energy ("IGS") (collectively "EGS Parties") hereby request that the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission grant their Petition to Intervene in the above-captioned matter and grant their request for full party status.
