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**JOINT PETITION TO INTERVENE OF  
THE MET-ED INDUSTRIAL USERS GROUP,  
THE PENELEC INDUSTRIAL CUSTOMER ALLIANCE, AND  
THE WEST PENN POWER INDUSTRIAL INTERVENORS**

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Pursuant to Sections 5.71 through 5.74 of the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission's ("PUC" or "Commission") Regulations, 52 Pa. Code §§ 5.71-5.74, the Met-Ed Industrial Users Group ("MEIUG"), the Penelec Industrial Customer Alliance ("PICA"), and the West Penn Power Industrial Intervenors ("WPPII") (collectively, the "Industrial Customer Groups"), hereby file this Petition to Intervene in the above-captioned proceeding. In support of their Petition to Intervene, the Industrial Customer Groups assert the following:

1. The Industrial Customer Groups are *ad hoc* associations of energy-intensive commercial and industrial customers receiving electric service in FirstEnergy Pennsylvania Electric Company's ("FE PA" or "Company") service territory. The Industrial Customer Groups have been active in many Commission proceedings addressing the terms and conditions of the Company's service.

2. The Industrial Customer Groups consume substantial amounts of electricity on an annual basis. MEIUG members receive service under the Met-Ed Rate District's GP and TP rate schedules; PICA members receive service under the Penelec Rate District's GP and TP rate schedules; and WPPII members receive service under West Penn Power Rate District's TP and 46 rate schedules. For purposes of these proceedings, MEIUG, PICA, and WPPII membership is

listed on the attached Appendices A, B, and C, respectively. MEIUG, PICA, and WPPII will update the appendices as needed throughout the course of this proceeding to reflect changes in membership.

3. The names and address of attorneys for the Industrial Customer Groups are:

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The Industrial Customer Groups request that the names and address of their attorneys be added to the Commission's and all parties' service lists.

4. On February 3, 2026, FE PA petitioned the Commission for approval of a proposed plan for the terms and conditions under which FE PA would supply default service from June 1, 2027, through May 31, 2031.<sup>1</sup>

5. As users of substantial volumes of electricity in FE PA's service territories, the Industrial Customer Groups are directly impacted by changes to the terms and conditions of their electricity service, and, thus, are concerned with the resolution of the Company's proposed DSP VII. The Commission's final disposition of FE PA's DSP VII may affect the rates, terms, and conditions of service that FE PA imposes on the Industrial Customer Groups, whether or not they receive default service. In addition, other parties' recommendations could adversely impact

the Industrial Customer Groups. As some of the Company's largest customers, the Industrial Customer Groups are in a unique position to address the effect of FE PA's proposed DSP VII on Large Commercial and Industrial ("C&I") customers.

6. The Industrial Customer Groups have an interest in this proceeding that is not represented by any other party of record. Thus, the Industrial Customer Groups satisfy the standards for intervention under Section 5.72 of the Commission's Regulations. 52 Pa. Code § 5.72.

**WHEREFORE**, for the reasons stated above, the Met-Ed Industrial Users Group, the Penelec Industrial Customer Alliance, and the West Penn Power Industrial Intervenors respectfully request that the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission:

- (1) Grant this Petition to Intervene, providing the Met-Ed Industrial Users Group, the Penelec Industrial Customer Alliance, and the West Penn Power Industrial Intervenors with intervenor-party status in this proceeding; and
- (2) Provide other such relief as it deems necessary.
