O R D E R

BY THE COMMISSION:

By this application filed on March 8, 1994, Paging Network of Pittsburgh, Inc., Pittsburgh, seeks a certificate of public convenience pursuant to Section 1102(a)(1)(i) of the Public Utility Code, evidencing Commission approval of the right to furnish one-way radio-telephone service to the public within the reliable service area of five additional transmitters, two located in Greensburg, two located in Indiana Borough and one in Connellsville as defined by 20 mile radius contour maps submitted with the application.

Notice of the filing of the application was published in the Pennsylvania Bulletin. No protests were filed and no hearing was held. No motions or petitions have been filed in this proceeding.

Applicant is a Delaware corporation which is a wholly owned subsidiary of Paging Network, Inc. Applicant is presently authorized to furnish paging service from numerous transmitter sites in western Pennsylvania pursuant to certificates of public convenience issued by the Commission at A. 330013, Folders 0002, 0003, 0004 and 0005. By this application applicant seeks approval to operate two new transmitters in Greensburg, two in Indiana and one in Connellsville to improve reliability of service in its present service area and to extend service availability to additional areas. Applicant has received Federal Communications Commission approval to operate the five additional transmitter sites.

Applicant has personnel with the technical, financial and managerial experience to operate the proposed facilities and will finance the new equipment with internally available funds or advances from the parent company. Applicant will charge the current rates on file with the Commission for service in the additional areas.

Upon full consideration of all matters of record, we find that approval of this application is proper for the service and convenience of the public; THEREFORE,


IT IS ORDERED:

1. That the application of Paging Network of Pittsburgh, Inc. is hereby approved.

2. That a certificate of public convenience be issued authorizing applicant to furnish one-way mobile radio-telephone service to the public within the reliable service area of five new transmitters located in Greensburg, Indiana and Connellsville as defined by 20 mile radius contour maps submitted with the application.

3. That within 90 days of the entry date of this order applicant file with the Tariff Section of the Office of Special Assistants a tariff supplement to include the areas herein certificated.
