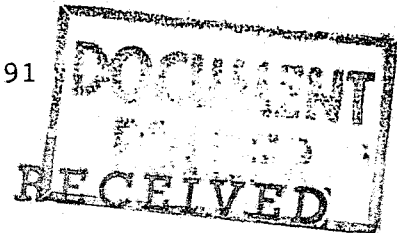

3. Paging Network of Pittsburgh, Inc. ("PageNet of Pittsburgh"), a Delaware Corporation, is a wholly owned subsidiary of Paging Network, Inc. Attached as Exhibit 1 hereto are PageNet of Pittsburgh's Articles of Incorporation.

4. By this application, PageNet of Pittsburgh seeks the grant of a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to begin providing regulated radio common carrier service within the Pittsburgh metropolitan area and adjacent areas of western Pennsylvania.

5. Attached as Exhibit 2 is a service contour map showing PageNet of Pittsburgh's proposed reliable service area.

PageNet of Pittsburgh will provide service from all of the facilities listed below. All Federal Communications Commission applications for these facilities are currently pending and copies of the authorizations to construct will be filed upon receipt.

6. To the best of PageNet of Pittsburgh's ability to determine from available Commission records, listed in Exhibit 3 are the persons and/or entities that hold non-exclusive Certificates of Public Convenience and Necessity from the Commission to provide radio common carrier services in those counties included in the Applicant's proposed service area.

7. The facilities set out in Paragraph 5 above will be used to furnish service in the proposed service area. PageNet of Pittsburgh estimates that it will serve approximately 7,200 subscribers in the proposed service area within one year of operation.

8. Capital costs for PageNet of Pittsburgh operations are estimated at \$2,288,874.00 for the first year and \$1,182,048.00 for the second year. The applicant estimates additional preoperating and application expenses in the first year at \$100,000.00. Based on past experience PageNet of Pittsburgh estimates that approximately six additional transmitters at a cost of \$192,000.00 will be required in the first year of service and approximately three additional transmitters at a cost of \$96,000.00 will be required in the second year of service. The capital costs for the additional transmitters have been included in the estimated capital costs stated above. As these additional facilities

will be added on an "as needed" basis to improve system reliability, PageNet of Pittsburgh will be unable to determine the exact location of each site until the facilities proposed herein have been constructed and tested.

9. In its first year of operation, PageNet of Pittsburgh estimates revenues in the amount of \$504,494.00, which will offset preoperating and operating costs to total a cumulative negative cash flow of \$784,157.00. In its second year of operation, the Applicant estimates revenues of \$1,689,222.00 which will provide a positive cash flow of \$60,618.00.

10. To demonstrate its financial qualification to build and operate the proposed system, PageNet of Pittsburgh has obtained from its parent, Paging Network, Inc., a commitment to provide the necessary funding in excess of the Applicant's estimated revenues. See letter of George M. Perrin, President, Paging Network, Inc., attached hereto as Exhibit 4. Specifically, Paging Network, Inc. has committed to provide funding of up to \$5.3 million, well in excess of the estimated costs for the operation set out in Paragraph 8 above. Funding shall be provided by Paging Network, Inc. upon receipt of PageNet of Pittsburgh of a Commission Order granting this application.

11. PageNet of Pittsburgh will provide service in the proposed service area pursuant to Tariff Radio-Telephone Pa. P.U.C. No. 1. A copy of the applicant's proposed tariff, which includes service rates, will be filed upon the grant of this application and is attached hereto as Exhibit 5.

12. PageNet of Pittsburgh will complete construction of the proposed facilities and begin offering service in the proposed service area as soon as possible after grant of this application and its construction permit applications currently pending before the FCC.

13. No further developments with reference to this application are anticipated. No other proceedings concerning PageNet of Pittsburgh are pending before the Commission. However, Paging Network of Philadelphia, Inc. ("PageNet of Philadelphia"), another wholly owned subsidiary of PageNet, Inc. currently holds a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity issued by the Commission (A-330644) and has pending an application to extend its service area (A-330644F004).<sup>1/</sup> Further, PageNet of Philadelphia is a party in Docket R-90-1817 concerning

proposed tariff revisions of Digital Paging Systems of Philadelphia, Inc.

14. PageNet of Pittsburgh will comply with all existing laws with respect to its right to do business in Pennsylvania and there is attached hereto as Exhibit 6 a copy of PageNet of Pittsburgh's foreign corporation registration that will be filed with the Department of State Corporation Bureau upon the grant of this application.

15. PageNet of Pittsburgh's customer services, accounting, and administration will be maintained at an office location in the Pittsburgh metropolitan area.

16. Routine system maintenance will be provided by one or more technicians, located in the Pittsburgh metropolitan area, directly employed by the Applicant, working under the direct supervision of the Applicant's General Manager/Vice President. During normal office hours, technical staff will be located at PageNet of Pittsburgh's principal place of business and will be performing their duties within the authorized service area. Mr. Geoff

Network of Philadelphia, Inc. pursuant to a Commission Order authorizing the transfer adopted March 10, 1988.

Bennett, Regional Systems Manager-Central Region, will provide additional support for technician supervision and systems installation as necessary.

17. Technicians will be trained on the proposed equipment at the time of installation by factory representatives to insure familiarity with maintenance procedures. If necessary for further technical support, PageNet may call on technicians employed by PageNet of Philadelphia.

18. The proposed facilities will be routinely tested and monitored for indications of service impairment or system failure during the business day. Automatic alarm equipment will be incorporated in the control equipment to notify service personnel of technical difficulties after regular office hours. In addition to the above, calls to PageNet of Pittsburgh's offices after business hours will be answered by an answering service, which will contact a technician for immediate action if necessary.

19. Customer calls will be received at the PageNet of Pittsburgh business office during normal business hours. After hours call will be taken by an answering service which, as stated in paragraph 16, will contact a designated technician "on call" if necessary.

20. PageNet of Pittsburgh intends to market its proposed service by advertising in local newspapers, and in local yellow pages directories, as well as other medium, if appropriate. In addition, the applicant will employ sales personnel for direct sales to potential subscribers.

21. PageNet of Pittsburgh proposes to offer the residents of the Pittsburgh metropolitan area and adjacent areas of western Pennsylvania high quality state-of-the-art paging service operations and to provide paging services over the widest possible service area at competitive prices.


22. PageNet of Pittsburgh submits that the information contained in the instant application establishes that it is financially, managerially and technically fit to provide regulated radio common carrier service; however, it will submit any additional information as may be required by the Commission. Based on its belief that the public will benefit from the facilities proposed herein, PageNet of Pittsburgh hereby requests that the Commission issue it a Certificate of Public Convenience authorizing its provision of radio common carrier service.

WHEREFORE, applicant prays your honorable Commission pursuant to the provisions of the Public Utility Code, 66 Pa. C.S. Sections 1101-1103 and the Pennsylvania Code, 52 Pa. Code Section 69.85, issue a Certificate of Public Convenience hereinbefore set forth.





Articles of Incorporation

CERTIFICATE OF INCORPORATION  
OF  
PAGING NETWORK OF PITTSBURGH, INC.

The undersigned, in order to form a corporation under and pursuant to the provisions of the General Corporation Law of the State of Delaware, does hereby certify as follows:

FIRST: The name of the corporation is  
Paging Network of Pittsburgh, Inc.

SECOND: The registered office of the corporation in the State of Delaware is located at 1209 Orange Street, Wilmington, New Castle County, Delaware 19801. The name of its registered agent at such address is The Corporation Trust Company.

THIRD: The nature of the business to be conducted or promoted and the purposes of the corporation are to engage in any lawful act or activity for which corporations may be organized under the General Corporation Law of Delaware.

FOURTH: The total number of shares of stock which the corporation shall have the authority to issue is 3000 shares of Common Stock, \$.01 par value per share.

FIFTH: The name and mailing address of the incorporator is as follows:

SIXTH: The following provisions are inserted for the management of the business and for the conduct of the affairs of the corporation, and for creating, defining, limiting and regulating the powers of the corporation, the directors and the stockholders.

(a) Directors need not be stockholders of the corporation.

(b) Subject to any limitation contained in the by-laws, the board of directors may make by-laws, and from time to time may alter, amend or repeal any by-laws, but any by-laws made by the board of directors may be altered, amended or repealed by the stockholders at any meeting of stockholders by the affirmative vote of the holders of a majority of the stock present and voting at such meeting, provided notice that an amendment is to be considered and acted upon is inserted in the notice or waiver of notice of such meeting.

(c) The board of directors shall have power from time to time to fix and determine and to vary the amount of the working capital of the corporation, to direct and determine the use and disposition thereof, to set apart out of any funds of the corporation available for dividends a reserve or reserves for any proper purposes and to abolish any such reserve in the manner in which it was created.

(d) The board of directors may from time to time determine whether and to what extent and at which times and

places and under what conditions and regulations the accounts and books of the corporation, or any of them, shall be open to the inspection of the stockholders, and no stockholder shall have any right to inspect any account, book or document of the corporation except as conferred by statute or as authorized by the board of directors.

(e) No contract or other transaction between the corporation and one or more of its directors or officers, or between the corporation and any other corporation, partnership, association or other organization in which one or more of its directors or officers are directors or officers, or have a financial or other interest, shall be void or voidable solely for this reason, or solely because the director or officer is present at or participates in the meeting of the board or committee thereof which authorized the contract or other transaction, or solely because his or their votes are counted for such purpose, provided that the material facts as to such relationship or interest and as to the contract or other transaction are disclosed or are known (1) to the board of directors or the committee, and the board or committee in good faith authorizes the contract or other transaction by the affirmative vote of a majority of the disinterested directors, even though the disinterested directors be less than a quorum, or (2) to the stockholders entitled to vote thereon, and the contract or other transaction is specifically approved in good faith by vote of the stockholders.

(f) Any contract, act or transaction of the corporation or of the directors may be ratified by a vote of a majority of the shares having voting power at any meeting of stockholders, or at any special meeting called for such purpose, and such ratification shall, so far as permitted by law and by this certificate of incorporation, be as valid and as binding as though ratified by every stockholder of the corporation.

(g) Any vote or votes authorizing liquidation of the corporation or proceedings for its dissolution may provide, subject to (i) any agreements among and between stockholders, (ii) the rights of creditors and (iii) rights expressly provided for particular classes or series of stocks, for the distribution pro rata among the stockholders of the corporation of the assets of the corporation, wholly or in part in kind, whether such assets be in cash or other property, and may authorize the board of directors of the corporation to determine the value of the different assets of the corporation for the purpose of such liquidation and may divide or authorize the board of directors of the corporation to divide such assets or any part thereof among the stockholders of the corporation in such manner that every stockholder will receive a proportionate amount in value (determined as aforesaid) of cash or property of the corporation upon such liquidation or dissolution even though each stockholder may not receive a strictly proportionate part of each such asset.

(h) Elections of directors need not be by ballot.

(i) The corporation shall, to the maximum extent permitted from time to time under the law of the State of Delaware, indemnify and upon request shall advance expenses to any person who is or was a party or is threatened to be made a party to any threatened, pending or completed action, suit, proceeding or claim, whether civil, criminal, administrative or investigative, by reason of the fact that he is or was or has agreed to be a director or officer of this corporation or while a director or officer is or was serving at the request of the corporation as a director, officer, partner, trustee, employee or agent of any corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust or other enterprise, including service with respect to employee benefit plans, against expenses (including attorney's fees and expenses), judgments, fines, penalties and amounts paid in settlement or incurred in connection with the investigation, preparation to defend or defense of such action, suit, proceeding, claim or counterclaim initiated by or on behalf of such person. Such indemnification shall not be exclusive of other indemnification rights arising under any by-law, agreement, vote of directors or stockholders or otherwise and shall inure to the benefit of the heirs and legal representatives of such person. Any repeal or modification of the foregoing provisions of this Section (i) of Article SIXTH shall not adversely affect any

right or protection of a director or officer of the corporation existing at the time of such repeal or modification.

SEVENTH: No holder of stock of the corporation shall be entitled as of right to purchase or subscribe for any part of any unissued stock of the corporation or any additional stock to be issued by reason of any increase of the authorized capital stock of the corporation, or any bonds, certificates of indebtedness, debentures or other securities convertible into stock or such additional authorized issue of new stock, but rather such stock, bonds, certificates of indebtedness, debentures and other securities may be issued and disposed of pursuant to resolution of the board of directors to such persons, firms, corporations or associations, and upon such terms as may be deemed advisable by the board of directors in the exercise of their discretion.

EIGHTH: Meetings of stockholders may be held without the State of Delaware, if the by-laws so provide. The books of the corporation may be kept (subject to the provisions of the Delaware General Corporation Law) outside of the State of Delaware at such place or places as may be from time to time designated by the board of directors.

NINTH: The corporation reserves the right to amend, alter, change or repeal any provisions contained in this Certificate of Incorporation in the manner now or hereafter prescribed by statute, and all rights conferred upon stockholders herein are granted subject to this reservation.

FIRST: The Certificate of Incorporation of Paging Network Pittsburgh, Inc. was filed with the Secretary of State of Delaware on the 11th day of February, 1991, and a certified copy thereof was duly recorded in the office of the Recorder of Deeds of the County of New Castle.

SECOND: The By-Laws annexed hereto are hereby adopted as the By-Laws of the Corporation.

THIRD: The following named person is hereby elected the sole director of the Corporation, to serve until the first annual meeting of stockholders or until his successor is elected and qualified:

BY-LAWS  
OF  
PAGING NETWORK OF PITTSBURGH, INC.

ARTICLE I.

Certificate of Incorporation

These by-laws, the powers of the corporation and of its directors and stockholders, and all matters concerning the conduct and regulation of the business of the corporation shall be subject to such provisions in regard thereto as are set forth in the certificate of incorporation filed pursuant to the General Corporation Law of Delaware which is hereby made a part of these by-laws.

The term "certificate of incorporation" in these by-laws, unless the context requires otherwise, includes not only the original certificate of incorporation filed to create the corporation but also all other certificates, agreements of merger or consolidation, plans of reorganization, or other instruments, howsoever designated, filed pursuant to the General Corporation Law of Delaware which have the effect of amending or supplementing in some respect the corporation's original certificate of incorporation.

ARTICLE II.

Annual Meeting

An annual meeting of stockholders shall be held for the election of directors and for the transaction of any other business for the transaction of which the meeting shall have been properly convened on the fourth Thursday in April in each year, within or without the State of Delaware, and at such time as shall be fixed by the board of directors and specified in the notice of the meeting, if such date is not a legal holiday and if a legal holiday, then at the same hour on the next succeeding day not a legal holiday. Any other proper business may be transacted at the annual meeting. If the annual meeting for election of directors shall not be held on the date designated therefor, the directors shall cause the meeting to

be held as soon thereafter as convenient.

### ARTICLE III.

#### Special Meetings of Stockholders

Special meetings of the stockholders may be held either within or without the State of Delaware, at such time and place and for such purposes as shall be specified in a call for such meeting made by the board of directors or by a writing filed with the secretary signed by the president, by any vice president or by a majority of the directors.

### ARTICLE IV.

#### Notice of Stockholders' Meetings

Whenever stockholders are required or permitted to take any action at a meeting, a written notice of the meeting shall be given which shall state the place, date and hour of the meeting and, in the case of a special meeting, the purpose or purposes for which the meeting is called, which notice shall be given not less than ten nor more than sixty days before the date of the meeting, except where longer notice is required by law, to each stockholder entitled to vote at such meeting, by leaving such notice with him or by mailing it, postage prepaid, directed to him at his address as it appears upon the records of the corporation. In case of the death, absence, incapacity or refusal of the secretary, such notice may be given by a person designated either by the secretary or by the person or persons calling the meeting or by the board of directors. When a meeting is adjourned to another time or place, notice need not be given of the adjourned meeting if the time and place thereof are announced at the meeting at which the adjournment is taken. At the adjourned meeting the corporation may transact any business which might have been transacted at the original meeting. If the adjournment is for more than thirty days, or if after the adjournment a new record date is fixed for the adjourned meeting, a notice of the adjourned meeting shall be given to each stockholder of record entitled to vote at the meeting.

An affidavit of the secretary or an assistant secretary or of the transfer agent of the corporation that the notice has been given shall, in the absence of fraud, be prima facie evidence of the facts stated therein.

## ARTICLE V.

### Quorum of Stockholders; Stockholder List

At any meeting of the stockholders, a majority of all shares issued and outstanding and entitled to vote upon a question to be considered at the meeting shall constitute a quorum for the consideration of such question when represented at such meeting by the holders thereof in person or by their duly constituted and authorized attorney or attorneys, but a less interest may adjourn any meeting from time to time, and the meeting may be held as adjourned without further notice. When a quorum is present at any meeting a majority of the stock so represented thereat and entitled to vote shall, except where a larger vote is required by law, by the certificate of incorporation or by these by-laws, decide any question brought before such meeting.

The secretary or other officer having charge of the stock ledger shall prepare and make, at least ten days before every meeting of stockholders, a complete list of the stockholders entitled to vote at the meeting, arranged in alphabetical order, and showing the address of each stockholder and the number of shares registered in the name of each stockholder. Such list shall be open to the examination of any stockholder, for any purpose germane to the meeting, during ordinary business hours for a period of at least ten days prior to the meeting, either at a place within the city or town where the meeting is to be held, which place shall have been specified in the notice of the meeting, or, if not so specified, at the place where the meeting is to be held. Said list shall also be produced and kept at the time and place of the meeting during the whole time thereof and may be inspected by any stockholder who is present. The stock ledger shall be the only evidence as to who are the stockholders entitled to examine the stock ledger, the list of stockholders required by this Article or the books of the corporation, or the stockholders entitled to vote in person or by proxy at any meeting of stockholders.

## ARTICLE VI.

### Proxies and Voting

Except as otherwise provided in the certificate of incorporation, each stockholder shall at every meeting of the stockholders be entitled to one vote for each share of the capital stock held by such stockholder. Each stockholder entitled to vote at a meeting of stockholders or to express dissent to corporate action in writing without a meeting may

authorize another person or persons to act for him by proxy but (except as otherwise expressly permitted by law) no proxy shall be voted or acted upon after three years from its date, unless the proxy provides for a longer period or so long as it is coupled with an interest sufficient in law to support an irrevocable power.

Unless otherwise provided in the certificate of incorporation, any action required by law to, or which may, be taken at any annual or special meeting of stockholders may be taken without a meeting, without prior notice and without a vote, if a consent in writing, setting forth the action so taken, shall be signed by the holders of outstanding stock having not less than the minimum number of votes that would be necessary to authorize or take such action at a meeting at which all shares entitled to vote therein were present and voted. Prompt notice of the taking of such action without a meeting by less than unanimous written consent shall be given to those stockholders who have not consented in writing.

#### ARTICLE VII.

##### Stockholders' Record Date

In order that the corporation may determine the stockholders entitled to notice of or to vote at any meeting of stockholders or any adjournment thereof, the board of directors may fix a record date, which record date shall not precede the date upon which the resolution fixing the record date is adopted by the board of directors, and which record date shall not be more than sixty nor less than ten days before the date of such meeting.

In order that the corporation may determine the stockholders entitled to receive payment of any dividend or other distribution or allotment of any rights or the stockholders entitled to exercise any rights in respect of any change, conversion or exchange of stock, or for the purpose of any other lawful action, the board of directors may fix a record date, which record date shall not precede the date upon which the resolution fixing the record date is adopted, and which record date shall be not more than sixty days prior to such action.

If no record date is fixed:

(1) The record date for determining stockholders entitled to notice of or to vote at a meeting of stockholders shall be at the close of business on the day next preceding the day on which notice is given, or, if notice is waived, at the close of

business on the day next preceding the day on which the meeting is held. A determination of stockholders of record entitled to notice of or to a vote at a meeting of stockholders shall apply to any adjournment of the meeting; provided, however, that the board of directors may fix a new record date for the adjourned meeting.

(2) The record date for determining stockholders entitled to consent to corporate action in writing without a meeting, when no prior action by the board of directors is necessary, shall be the first date on which a signed written consent setting forth the action taken or proposed to be taken is delivered to the corporation by delivery to its registered office in this State, its principal place of business, or an officer or agent of the corporation having custody of the book in which proceedings of meetings of stockholders are recorded. Delivery made to the corporation's registered office shall be by hand or by certified or registered mail, return receipt requested.

(3) The record date for determining stockholders entitled to consent to corporate action in writing without a meeting, when prior action by the board of directors is required, shall be at the close of business on the day on which the board of directors adopts the resolution taking such prior action.

(4) The record date for determining stockholders for any other purpose shall be at the close of business on the day on which the board of directors adopts the resolution relating thereto.

#### ARTICLE VIII.

##### Board of Directors

Except as otherwise provided by law or by the certificate of incorporation, the business and affairs of the corporation shall be managed by the board of directors.

The number of directors shall be such number, not fewer than one nor more than seven, as may be fixed for any corporate year and elected by the stockholders at the annual meeting. During any year the board of directors may be enlarged and additional directors elected to complete the enlarged number, to not more than the maximum number above specified, by the stockholders at any meeting or by a vote of a majority of the directors then in office. The stockholders may, at any meeting held for the purpose during such year, decrease, to not fewer than the minimum number above specified, the number of directors as thus fixed or enlarged and remove directors to the

decreased number. Each director shall hold office until his successor is elected and qualified or until his earlier resignation or removal. Any director may resign at any time upon written notice to the corporation. No director need be a stockholder.

#### ARTICLE IX.

##### Committees

The board of directors may, by resolution passed by a majority of the whole board, designate one or more committees, each committee to consist of one or more of the directors of the corporation. The board may designate one or more directors as alternate members of any committee who may replace any absent or disqualified member at any meeting of the committee and may define the number and qualifications which shall constitute a quorum of such committee. Except as otherwise limited by law, any such committee, to the extent provided in the resolution appointing such committee, shall have and may exercise the powers of the board of directors in the management of the business and affairs of the corporation, and may authorize the seal of the corporation to be affixed to all papers which may require it. In the absence or disqualification of a member of committee, the member or members thereof present at any meeting and not disqualified from voting, whether or not he or they constitute a quorum, may unanimously appoint another member of the board of directors to act at the meeting in the place of any such absent or disqualified member.

#### ARTICLE X.

##### Meetings of the Board of Directors and of Committees

Regular meetings of the board of directors may be held without call or formal notice at such places either within or without the State of Delaware and at such times as the board may by vote from time to time determine.

Special meetings of the board of directors may be held at any place either within or without the State of Delaware at any time when called by the president, treasurer, secretary or two or more directors, reasonable notice of the time and place thereof being given to each director. A waiver of such notice in writing, signed by the person or persons entitled to said notice, whether before or after the time stated therein, shall be deemed equivalent to such notice. In any case it shall be

deemed sufficient notice to a director to send notice by mail at least forty-eight hours, or to deliver personally or to send notice by telegram at least twenty-four hours, before the meeting, addressed to him at his usual or last known business or residence address.

Unless otherwise restricted by the certificate of incorporation or by other provisions of these by-laws, (a) any action required or permitted to be taken at any meeting of the board of directors or of any committee thereof may be taken without a meeting if all members of the board or of such committee, as the case may be, consent thereto in writing and such writing or writings are filed with the minutes of proceedings of the board or committee, and (b) members of the board of directors or of any committee designated by the board may participate in a meeting thereof by means of conference telephone or similar communications equipment by means of which all persons participating in the meeting can hear each other, and such participation shall constitute presence in person at such meeting.

#### ARTICLE XI.

##### Quorum of The Board of Directors

Except as otherwise expressly provided in the certificate of incorporation or in these by-laws, a majority of the total number of directors at the time in office shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business, but a less number may adjourn any meeting from time to time. Except as otherwise so expressly provided, the vote of a majority of the directors present at any meeting at which a quorum is present shall be the act of the board of directors, provided, that the affirmative vote in good faith of a majority of the disinterested directors, even though the disinterested directors shall be fewer than a quorum, shall be sufficient to authorize a contract or transaction in which one or more directors have interest if the material facts as to such interest and the relation of the interested directors to the contract or transaction have been disclosed or are known to the directors.

#### ARTICLE XII.

##### Waiver of Notice of Meetings

Whenever notice is required to be given under any provision of law or the certificate of incorporation or by-laws, a written waiver thereof, signed by the person entitled to

notice, whether before or after the time stated therein, shall be deemed equivalent to notice. Attendance of a person at a meeting shall constitute a waiver of notice of such meeting, except when the person attends a meeting for the express purpose of objecting, at the beginning of the meeting, to the transaction of any business because the meeting is not lawfully called or convened. Neither the business to be transacted at, nor the purpose of, any regular or special meeting of the stockholders, directors or members of a committee of directors need be specified in any written waiver of notice unless so required by the certificate of incorporation or the by-laws.

#### ARTICLE XIII.

##### Officers and Agents

The corporation shall have a president, chairman of the board, secretary and treasurer, who shall be chosen by the directors, each of whom shall hold his office until his successor has been chosen and qualified or until his earlier resignation or removal. The corporation may have such other officers and agents as are desired, each of whom shall be chosen by the board of directors including one or more vice presidents, assistant treasurers, and assistant secretaries and shall hold his office for such term and have such authority and duties as shall be determined by the board of directors. The board of directors may secure the fidelity of any or all of such officers or agents by bond or otherwise. Any number of offices may be held by the same person. Each officer shall, subject to these by-laws, have in addition to the duties and powers herein set forth, such duties and powers as the board of directors shall from time to time designate. In all cases where the duties of any officer, agent or employee are not specifically prescribed by the by-laws, or by the board of directors, such officer, agent or employee shall obey the orders and instructions of the president. Any officer may resign at any time upon written notice to the corporation.

#### ARTICLE XIV.

##### President

The president shall, subject to the direction and under the supervision of the board of directors, be the chief operating officer of the corporation and shall have general and active

control of its affairs and business and general supervision over its officers, agents and employees. The president shall have custody of the treasurer's bond, if any.

#### ARTICLE XIV A.

##### Chairman of the Board

The Board of Directors may appoint a chairman of the board and may designate the chairman of the board as chief executive officer. If the Board of Directors appoints a chairman of the board, he shall perform such duties and possess such powers as are assigned to him by the Board of Directors. Except as otherwise voted by the board he shall preside at all meetings of the stockholders and of the board of directors at which he is present. If the Board of Directors appoints a vice-chairman of the board, he shall, in the absence or disability of the chairman of the board, perform the duties and exercise the powers of the chairman of the board and shall perform such other duties and possess such other powers as may from time to time be vested in him by the Board of Directors.

#### ARTICLE XV.

##### Secretary

The secretary shall record all the proceedings of the meetings of the stockholders and directors in a book, which shall be the property of the corporation, to be kept for that purpose; and perform such other duties as shall be assigned to him by the board of directors. In the absence of the secretary from any such meeting, a temporary secretary shall be chosen, who shall record the proceedings of such meeting in the aforesaid book.

#### ARTICLE XVI.

##### Treasurer

The treasurer shall, subject to the direction and under the supervision of the board of directors, have the care and custody of the funds and valuable papers of the corporation, except his own bond, and he shall, except as the board of directors shall generally or in particular cases authorize the endorsement thereof in some other manner, have power to endorse for deposit or collection all notes, checks, drafts and other

obligations for the payment of money to the corporation or its order. He shall keep, or cause to be kept, accurate books of account, which shall be the property of the corporation.

#### ARTICLE XVII.

##### Removals

The stockholders may, at any meeting called for the purpose, by vote of a majority of the capital stock issued and outstanding and entitled to vote thereon, remove any director from office.

The board of directors may, at any meeting called for the purpose, by vote of a majority of their entire number remove from office any officer or agent of the corporation or any member of any committee appointed by the board of directors or by any committee appointed by the board of directors or by any officer or agent of the corporation.

#### ARTICLE XVIII.

##### Vacancies

Any vacancy occurring in any office or any directorship of the corporation by death, resignation, removal or otherwise and newly created directorships resulting from any increase in the authorized number of directors, may be filled by a majority of the directors then in office (though less than a quorum) or by a sole remaining director and each of the incumbents so chosen shall hold office for the unexpired term in respect of which the vacancy occurred and until his successor shall have been duly elected and qualified or for such shorter period as shall be specified in the filling of such vacancy or, if such vacancy shall have occurred in the office of director, until such a successor shall have been chosen by the stockholders.

#### ARTICLE XIX.

##### Certificates of Stock

Every holder of stock in the corporation shall be entitled to have a certificate signed by, or in the name of the corporation by the chairman or vice-chairman of the board of directors (if one shall be incumbent) or the president or a vice-president and by the treasurer or an assistant treasurer,

or the secretary or an assistant secretary, certifying the number of shares owned by him in the corporation. If such certificate is countersigned (1) by a transfer agent other than the corporation or its employee, or (2) by a registrar other than the corporation or its employee, any other signatures on the certificate may be facsimile. In case any officer who has signed or whose facsimile signature has been placed upon a certificate shall have ceased to be such officer before such certificate is issued, it may be issued by the corporation with the same effect as if he were such officer at the date of issue.

If the corporation shall be authorized to issue more than one class of stock or more than one series of any class, the designations, preferences and relative, participating, optional or other special rights of each class of stock or series thereof and the qualifications, limitations or restrictions of such preferences and/or rights shall be set forth in full or summarized on the face or back of the certificates which the corporation shall issue to represent such class or series of stock or there shall be set forth on the face or back of the certificates which the corporation shall issue to represent such class or series of stock, a statement that the corporation will furnish, without charge to each stockholder who so requests, the designations, preferences and relative, participating, optional or other special rights of each class of stock or series thereof and the qualifications, limitations or restrictions of such preferences and/or rights. Any restriction imposed upon the transfer of shares or registration of transfer of shares shall be noted conspicuously on the certificate representing the shares subject to such restriction.

## ARTICLE XX.

### Loss of Certificate

The corporation may issue a new certificate of stock in place of any certificate theretofore issued by it, alleged to have been lost, stolen or destroyed, and the directors may require the owner of the lost, stolen or destroyed certificate, or his legal representative, to give the corporation a bond sufficient to indemnify it against any claim that may be made against it on account of the alleged loss, theft or destruction of any such certificate or the issuance of such new certificate in its place and upon such other terms or without any such bond which the board of directors shall prescribe.

ARTICLE XXI.

Seal

The corporate seal shall, subject to alteration by the board of directors, consist of a flat-faced circular die with the word "Delaware" together with the name of the corporation and the year of its organization cut or engraved thereon. The corporate seal may be used by causing it or a facsimile thereof to be impressed or affixed or reproduced or otherwise.

ARTICLE XXII.

Execution of Papers

Except as otherwise provided in these by-laws or as the board of directors may generally or in particular cases authorize the execution thereof in some other manner, all deeds, leases, transfers, contracts, bonds, notes, checks, drafts and other obligations made, accepted or endorsed by the corporation, shall be signed by the president or by the treasurer.

ARTICLE XXIII.

Fiscal Year

Except as from time to time otherwise provided by the board of directors, the fiscal year of the corporation shall end on the last day of December of each year.

ARTICLE XXIV.

Amendments

Except as otherwise provided by law or by the certificate of incorporation, these by-laws, as from time to time altered, amended or repealed may be altered, amended or repealed or new by-laws may be adopted by the affirmative vote of the holders of a majority of the shares of the capital stock of the corporation issued and outstanding and entitled to vote at any annual or special meeting of the stockholders called for the purpose, of which the notice shall specify the subject matter

of the proposed alteration or amendment or new by-law. If the certificate of incorporation so provides, these by-laws may also be made, altered, amended or repealed or new by-laws may be adopted by a majority of the whole number of directors. Such action may be taken at any regular or special meeting of the board of directors at which a quorum is present, of which notice shall have been given as for a meeting of stockholders.



There are no concurring, connecting or participating carriers, except to the extent that the facilities of The Bell Telephone Company of Pennsylvania are made available for interconnection with the Carrier's facilities.

EXPLANATION OF SYMBOLS, REFERENCE MARKS AND ABBREVIATIONS  
OF TECHNICAL TERMS USED IN THIS TARIFF

The following symbols shall be used in this tariff for the purposes indicated below.

- (I) to signify Increase
- (D) to signify Decrease
- (C) to signify Change

A. APPLICATION OF TARIFF

This tariff applies to Domestic Public Land Mobile Radio Service (one-way communications) furnished by Paging Network of Pittsburgh, Inc. (herein referred to as "Carrier") from its land radio-telephone station(s) located in or near Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania to portable receivers within the service area thereof.

B. REGULATIONS1. Definitions

Domestic Public Land Mobile Radio Service. A public communication service for hire for the transmission of signals from base radio stations to portable receivers, which includes the following types of one-way communications: tone only, tone and voice, digital display and alphanumeric display.

Call. One-way communication from a base station or from a landline telephone station through a base station to a portable receiver which will activate such receiver, producing an alert signal. A call may include a digital display message, an alphanumeric display message, or a voice message.

Tone-Only One-Way Communication. One-way communication from a base station or from a landline telephone station through a base station to a portable receiver which will activate such receiver, producing an alert signal.

Tone and Voice One-Way Communication. One-way communication from a base station or from a landline telephone station through a base station to a portable receiver which will activate such receiver producing an alert signal followed by a voice message not to exceed 10 seconds in length.

Digital Display One-Way Communication. One-way communication from a base station or from a land line telephone station through a base station to a portable receiver which will activate such receiver producing an alert signal followed by a numeric display message.

Alphanumeric Display One-Way Communication. One-way communication from a base station or from a landline telephone station through a base station to a portable receiver which will activate such receiver producing an alert signal followed by an alphanumeric display message. The alphanumeric message may consist of letters, numbers, punctuation or spaces, or a combination thereof, not exceeding 80 characters in length.

B. REGULATIONS (continued)

1. Definitions (continued)

Receiving Unit. A portable receiver capable of delivering alert signals and producing digital or alphanumeric displays or voice messages.

2. Availability of Service

Service is available to any person who wishes to become a subscriber. The service is available to persons within range of the central land stations located in or near Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, through which such service is furnished and subject to transmission, atmospheric, terrain, propagation, and other like limitations.

3. Provision of Equipment

Subscribers have the option of providing their own equipment compatible with the Carrier's service. When the portable receiver is provided by the subscriber, it must be compatible with the proper operation of the service and is subject to approval by Carrier. Carrier assumes no liability if subscriber's portable receiver is rendered obsolete by changes to Carrier's operating system. Equipment rates, rentals, maintenance, installation, special options or removal costs are not subject under the carrier's tariff to Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission rate regulation.

4. Undertaking of Carrier

The obligation of Carrier to furnish service is dependent upon its ability to secure and retain suitable facilities and rights for maintenance of the necessary circuits and the construction of the necessary equipment.

5. Obligation of Subscriber

The subscriber will assume responsibility for the loss of, or damage to, portable receivers owned by Carrier by fire, theft, collision and similar causes, as well as for loss or damage caused by the deliberate action or negligence of the subscriber.

B. REGULATIONS (continued)6. Liability of Carrier

- a. Because of unavailability of errors incident to the service, and to the use of the facilities furnished by Carrier, the services and facilities furnished by Carrier are subject to the terms, conditions and limitations herein specified.
- b. In the event of an interruption to the service, which is not due to the negligence or willful act of the subscriber, there will be allowed after due notice by the customer a pro rata adjustment of the monthly charges involved, for the service rendered useless and inoperative by reason of the interruption, during the time said interruption continues in excess of twenty-four hours from the time it is reported to Carrier, or detected by it.
  - (1) In computing the amount of the pro rata adjustment, the following formula shall be used. The adjustment shall be a fraction of the minimum monthly charge for service. The numerator of the fraction shall be the total number of hours of the interruption to the service in excess of 24 hours from the time the interruption is reported to Carrier or detected by it. A period of time less than 30 minutes shall be disregarded and a period of time of 30 minutes or more shall be considered an additional hour. The denominator of the fraction shall be 720 hours.
- c. The liability of Carrier for damages arising out of delays in installation or restoration of service and/or facilities or out of mistakes, omissions, interruptions, or errors or defects in transmission occurring in the course of providing service and/or facilities shall in no event exceed the allowance, if any, available under 6.b preceding. There shall be no liability of Carrier for damages arising out of the fault of facilities or equipment furnished by other than the Carrier. Carrier shall in no event be liable for interruption or delays in transmission, or errors or defects in transmission, or failure to transmit when caused by acts of God, flood, fire, war, riots, acts of Government, or other causes beyond its control, whether similar to the foregoing or not.

B. REGULATIONS (continued)

6. Liability of Carrier (continued)

d. Carrier is not liable for damage for any accident or injury occasioned by a portable receiver or by supplementary apparatus provided in connection therewith when such accident or injury is not due to the negligence of Carrier.

7. Reserved

B. REGULATIONS (continued)8. Deposits

- a. Carrier may, in order to safeguard its interests, require a deposit. In no event will deposits be required in excess of the estimated gross bill for any single billing period plus one month (the maximum period not to exceed four months), with a minimum of \$5.00.
- b. Deposits shall be returned to a depositor when he shall have paid undisputed bills for service over a period of twelve consecutive months; and any depositor having secured the return of a deposit shall not be required to make a new deposit unless the service has been discontinued or the subscriber's credit standing impaired, in the Carrier's opinion, through a failure to comply with tariff provisions.
- c. The payment of any undisputed bill shall be payment of the bill with or without discount or penalty within thirty days following the period for which the bill was rendered or payment within thirty days following presentation of the bill, or the payment of any contested bill, payment of which is withheld beyond the period herein mentioned and the dispute is terminated substantially in favor of the subscriber and payment made by the subscriber within ten days thereafter.
- d. Interest shall be paid on deposits at the rate of nine percent per annum without deduction for any taxes thereon. Interest is payable at the termination of the deposit.

9. Initial Contract Period and Termination by Subscriber

- a. Contract Periods - The initial contract period for service and facilities is one month.

B. REGULATIONS (continued)9. Initial Contract Period and Termination by Subscriber (continued)

- b. Termination by Subscriber - Service or facilities may be terminated by the subscriber at any time, subject to payment of full charges for that period service is rendered, except that, if termination occurs within the initial contract period, charges apply for the full initial contract period.

10. Denial of Service

In the event of abandonment of the equipment provided by Carrier, the nonpayment of any sum due, or of any violation of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, or of the rules and regulations of the Federal Communications Commission and the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission, Carrier may either temporarily deny service or may terminate the Contract.

11. Payment of Bills

- a. Monthly recurring charges for service are billed monthly in advance and are payable when the service has been rendered.
- b. A late payment penalty of one and one quarter percent (1 1/4%) a month (simple interest) on the unpaid balance of any bill not paid within thirty (30) days after the bill is rendered may be imposed. If a bill is paid by mail, the date of the postmark will be considered the date of payment.

e. Category 5 - Industrial

Gas or oil producing or drilling operators; producers and distributors of fuel and lumber and other construction materials and equipment; food processing, distribution and storage organizations, producers of substantial quantities of food, business concerns engaged in construction of housing and industrial or public works, taxicabs and livery service.

f. Category 6 - Traveling Public

Trains and watercraft where service is made available to passengers.

g. Category 7 - All Others

After initial establishment of service in accordance with the foregoing table of priorities, when the facilities of Carrier are insufficient to furnish service to all who desire radio dispatch service to mobile receivers, new or additional mobile receivers shall be ranked within the categories noted above in order to date of filing of applications for service and service shall be afforded such applicants as facilities become available in descending order of precedence.
