





Pursuant to the provisions of Title 52 (Public Utilities) of the Pennsylvania Code, Commonwealth Telephone Company submits for filing Supplement No. 96 to Tariff Telephone - Pa. P.U.C. No. 22. This Supplement is filed pursuant to the Pennsylvania Public Utilities Commission's December 17, 1987 adoption of Docket No. A-310800, Application for Merger and Amendment thereto. This Supplement is issued by Commonwealth Telephone Company under the date of February 11, 1988 to become effective March 25, 1988.

This tariff filing is submitted in compliance with the PA P.U.C. Docket No. A-310800 - Application for Merger and Amendment thereto Adopted December 17, 1987, which requested that one-way EAS be established from CTCO's Coopersburg exchange to Bell of PA's Quakertown exchange.

Comments (Summary)

This supplement provides the necessary tariff information to provide for one-way EAS from our Coopersburg exchange to Bell's Quakertown exchange. This service is being established without an increase in basic local service rates as specified in the Secretarial letter (Attachment 2).

Comments (Detail)

- This supplement which provides for one-way EAS from Coopersburg to Quakertown is the end result of Docket No. A-310800 and Amendment thereto in which CTCO agreed to provide the one-way EAS to Quakertown.
- The August 26, 1987 Coopersburg Toll Usage Study to Quakertown showed that the combined Business and Residence Average Number of Calls per Customer was 6.79 with 68.51 percent of the customers making one (1) or more calls.
- The Coopersburg and Quakertown exchanges are contiguous.


The Commission, in Public Meeting held on December 17, 1987, acted to permit the transfer by merger of all property and rights of Coopersburg and Lewisberry Telephone Companies to the Commonwealth Telephone Company as set forth in your Application for Merger, dated March 19, 1987, and subsequently amended on October 1, 1987.

The Application for Merger and the Amendment thereto specifically requested:

1. That Coopersburg and Lewisberry Telephone Companies be merged into Commonwealth Telephone Company through transfer of all issued and outstanding shares of stock of Coopersburg and Lewisberry to Commonwealth Telephone Company. Commonwealth will succeed, without other transfer to all the rights and property of the former two companies and the former two companies will cease to exist.
2. That Commonwealth Telephone Company combine the Coopersburg and Lewisberry Tariffs into Commonwealth tariffs.
3. The introduction of an "alternate plan" for Extended Area Service between Coopersburg exchange and the Emmaus exchange, which is served by Continental Telephone Company of Pennsylvania.
4. The implementation of a one-way Extended Area Service between Coopersburg exchange and the Quakertown exchange, which is served by The Bell Telephone Company of Pennsylvania.

5. The State Tax Adjustment Surcharge for customers of the Coopersburg Exchange be reduced to zero through December 31, 1989.
6. The local exchange service rates of all customers in the Coopersburg exchange be held at their existing levels for one full year after the completion of the merger of the Applicants.
7. The elimination of separate books and records with respect to the assets and operations of Coopersburg and Lewisberry Telephone Companies following the merger.
