

NOTICE OF MOTOR CARRIER COMPLAINT

- A. You must file an Answer within twenty (20) days of the date of service of this Complaint. The date of service is the mailing date as indicated at the top of the Secretarial Cover Letter for this Complaint and Notice, 52 Pa. Code §1.56(a). An Answer is a written explanation of circumstances wished to be considered in determining the outcome. The Answer should raise all factual and legal arguments that you wish to claim in your defense and must include the reference number of this Complaint. Your Answer must be verified, and the original **mailed to:**

- B. If you fail to answer this Complaint within twenty (20) days, the Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement will request that the Commission issue a Secretarial Letter imposing a penalty. The penalty could include a fine, the suspension or revocation of your certificate of public convenience or other such remedy.
- C. If applicable, you may elect not to contest this Complaint by paying the fine proposed in this Complaint by certified check or money order. **Payment must be made to "Commonwealth of Pennsylvania"** and should be forwarded to:

- D. Your payment is an admission that you committed the alleged violation and an agreement to cease and desist from further violations. Upon receipt of your payment, the Complaint proceeding shall be closed.
- E. If you file an Answer, which admits or fails to deny the allegations of the Complaint, the Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement will request that the Commission issue a Secretarial Letter imposing a fine and/or other such remedy.
- F. If you file an Answer which contests the Complaint, the matter will be assigned to an Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) for hearing and decision. The ALJ is not bound by the optional fine set forth above.

MOTOR CARRIER COMPLAINT

The Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (Commission or “PUC”) is a duly constituted agency of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania empowered to regulate public utilities within the Commonwealth. The Commission has delegated its authority to initiate proceedings which are prosecutory in nature to the Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement and other bureaus with enforcement responsibilities. Pursuant to that delegated authority and Section 701 of the Public Utility Code, the Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement-Motor Carrier Division hereby represents as follows:

1. That KEYSTONE TRANSPORTATION LLC, Respondent, maintains its principal place of business at 2304 Walnut Street, Harrisburg, PA 17103.
2. That on November 13, 2020, Respondent was issued a certificate of public convenience by this Commission for paratransit authority among various counties in Pennsylvania to points in Pennsylvania and return, at PUC 6418669.
3. That on January 20, 2026, PUC Motor Carrier Enforcement Officer Travis Griffith conducted a random inspection on Paxton Street, Harrisburg, Dauphin County, of a 2013 Dodge van, bearing PA registration number BA91699, and having vehicle identification number ending in the last 4 digits 4272, operated by driver Alfonso Rivera. At the time of inspection, the following violations were found:
 - a. Vehicle was operated by a driver with a license restriction, special equipment was required, but vehicle was not equipped, violating 52 Pa. Code §29.502; 75 Pa. Code§1512(b). The penalty for this violation is \$200.
 - b. Vehicle failed to display Respondent’s name and associated PUC certificate of convenience number, violating 52 Pa. Code §29.71(a). The penalty for this violation is \$50.
 - c. Vehicle had an expired Pennsylvania inspection decal, violating 52 Pa. Code §29.405; 75 Pa. Code 4703(a). The penalty for this violation is \$250.
 - d. Vehicle failed to display consumer information as required, violating 52 Pa. Code §29.356. The penalty for this violation is \$50.

WHEREFORE, the Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement hereby requests that the Commission fine KEYSTONE TRANSPORTATION LLC the sum of five hundred fifty dollars (\$550.00) for the illegal activity described in this Complaint and order such other remedy as the Commission may deem to be appropriate.
