By this letter, UGI Utilities, Inc. – Gas Division (“UGI Gas”), as Applicant in the above-captioned matter, has agreed to provide Procter & Gamble Paper Products Company (“P&G”) an additional 30 days, from March 9, 2026, to April 8, 2026, to file an intervention or protest in this proceeding.


UGI Gas was notified by P&G of potential concerns regarding the Application on March 5, 2026. As such, UGI Gas did not have any opportunity to address P&G’s concerns or provide additional information. P&G has an interest in the proposed transfer of the Auburn City Gate Station as an industrial customer of UGI Gas that receives gas through the Auburn City Gate Station. The voluntary extension will provide P&G time to obtain additional information from UGI Gas and to further analyze whether any interest of P&G might be affected by the proposed transaction.

The agreement by UGI Gas to voluntarily extend the intervention and protest date applies only to P&G, as no other customer or party has contacted UGI Gas regarding the Application.
