PREHEARING CONFERENCE ORDER

You are receiving this Order because you have been identified as a person who may have an interest in the above captioned proceeding filed with the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (Commission). This Order will describe the process the Commission will follow in considering this Application, the options you may have for involvement, and how to become a party to this case. There is no requirement that you participate, however, if you do not, then the case will proceed and be decided without your input.

Application Summary

On March 3, 2026, NextEra Energy Transmission MidAtlantic, Inc., (NEET MA or Applicant) filed an Application pursuant to Chapter 57, Subchapter G of the Commission’s regulations. 52 Pa. Code §§57.71-57.77. The Application requests that the Commission approve the siting and construction of a new 500 kilovolt (kV) transmission line associated with the MidAtlantic Resiliency Link Project (MARL Project) in Dunkard Township in Greene County, and Springhill Township in Fayette County, Pennsylvania.

The MARL Project involves the construction of a new approximately 107.5-mile 500-kV transmission line across Maryland, Pennsylvania, West Virginia, and Virginia, as well as a new Woodside 500/138 kV Substation in Virginia. The Pennsylvania portion of the MARL

Project will extend from the existing FirstEnergy Corp. 502 Junction Substation in Greene County, Pennsylvania for approximately 2.7 miles to the West Virginia border, extend through West Virginia for 3.1 miles, and then re-enter Pennsylvania in Greene County, and traverse through Greene and Fayette Counties for 8.0 miles, and then proceed back into West Virginia (the Pennsylvania Portions). NEET MA seeks approval of the siting and construction of the approximately 10.7 miles long Pennsylvania Portions of the MARL Project.

NEET MA seeks an in-service date for the Pennsylvania Portions of December 2029 or earlier. NEET MA requests that the Commission issue a final order in this matter no later than the latest March 2027 public meeting date.

Prehearing Conference / Protest Deadline

The Parties and Public may review filings and further requirements or Orders entered in these proceedings at the Docket number referenced above, on the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission website at: www.puc.pa.gov/search/document-search/.

The Prehearing Conference is for the discussion and planning of the litigation of the case. No testimony will be taken. Lawyers representing parties of record and individual persons representing themselves as full litigants will be permitted to participate in the Prehearing Conference. The Prehearing Conference is open to the public. At the Prehearing Conference, the parties should be prepared to discuss all relevant issues related to this proceeding and any related proceedings a litigation schedule, any request to consolidate this proceeding with other related proceedings, any objections to Protests or Petitions to Intervene, and the scheduling of public input hearing(s) or any other appropriate requests or proceedings to be conducted prior to the evidentiary hearing.

In response to this Prehearing Conference Order, you may proceed in one of three ways:

(1) Do nothing. If you do nothing after receiving this Prehearing Conference Order, your name will be removed from the service list. After the Prehearing Conference, you will not receive any pleadings, filings, discovery requests, written testimony or orders and decisions in this matter. You may still attend and testify at a public input hearing, if one is scheduled, as explained in the next paragraph.

(2) Attend a public input hearing if one is scheduled. Public input hearings, if scheduled, may be held in geographical areas affected by the filings for the purpose of giving members of the public who do not wish to participate in the formal litigation an opportunity to express their opinions regarding the Company's proposal. Public input hearings may also be conducted by telephone. If a public input hearing is scheduled, the Commission will publish a notice which includes instructions for how to tell the Commission that you wish to testify. If you testify at a public input hearing, you will not be permitted to also testify at the evidentiary hearings. The Commission notice will also include instructions if you want to listen to the public input hearing but do not wish to testify. Notice of the public input hearing, if one is

scheduled, will be published in your local newspaper before it is held and on NEET MA's website.

(3) Become a party of record. As a party of record, you will be served with all of the pleadings, filings, discovery requests, written testimony and orders and decisions served and issued in this proceeding. *These documents will be voluminous.* Your *rights* as a party of record include the ability to present your own testimony or documents and to cross-examine other witnesses at the formal hearings, and to file exceptions to the Administrative Law Judge's decision. Your *duties* as a party of record are that you must answer all discovery requests served upon you in accordance with the rules. You will be required to serve a copy of anything that you file upon the Administrative Law Judge and each party appearing on the service list, as modified after the Prehearing Conference, regardless of the cost of postage. If you intend to present evidence at the formal evidentiary hearings, you will be required to submit your testimony and documents in writing in advance, in accordance with the schedule to be set at the Prehearing Conference and to provide a copy of your written testimony to each party on the service list. You will be expected to participate in accordance with the rules of Commission practice appearing in Title 52 of the Pennsylvania Code Chapters 1, 3 and 5. The Pennsylvania Code is available online at www.pacode.com.

To become a party of record, you must file an appropriate pleading, formal protest or a petition to intervene. Formal protests and petitions to intervene must be filed in accordance with 52 Pa. Code (relating to public utilities) on or before **Friday, May 1, 2026**. All filings must be made with the Secretary of the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission, 400 North Street, Harrisburg, PA 17120, with a copy served on the undersigned and NEET MA, as well as any parties to this proceeding.

You are strongly encouraged to register for the Commission's free eFiling subscription service, which allows users to automatically receive an email notification whenever a document is added, removed, or changed on the Commission website regarding a specific case. Instructions for subscribing to this service are on the Commission's website at http://www.puc.pa.gov/Documentation/eFiling_Subscriptions.pdf.

The parties are further directed to comply with the following requirements:

1. Each party must file and distribute a prehearing memorandum which sets forth a brief history of the proceeding, the issues you intend to present, a listing of your proposed witnesses and the subject of their testimony, and a list of any exhibits or documents you intend to present at the hearing in this proceeding on or before **May 4, 2026**. The undersigned must be served with a copy of prehearing memoranda by email at jcoogan@pa.gov.

2. Prehearing memoranda shall also include a proposed litigation schedule. The parties are directed to confer and attempt to agree to a proposed litigation schedule in advance of the Prehearing Conference, to include proposed times, dates and locations of any evidentiary hearings, proposed public input hearings as agreed to by all parties if possible, and any other proposed or requested proceedings to be conducted prior to the evidentiary hearing.

3. Prehearing memoranda shall address parties' positions on NextEra Energy Transmission MidAtlantic, Inc.'s request to consolidate this proceeding with NextEra Energy Transmission MidAtlantic, Inc.'s Application at Docket Nos. A-2026-3060921, G-2026-3060941, G-2026-3060942 requesting all necessary authority, approvals, and certificates of public convenience authorizing NextEra Energy Transmission MidAtlantic, Inc. to begin to furnish and supply electric transmission services as a Pennsylvania public utility and for certain affiliated interest agreements.

4. Please review the regulations pertaining to prehearing conferences, 52 Pa. Code § 5.221-§ 5.224, and in particular, § 5.222(d) which provides, in part:

(d) Parties and counsel will be expected to attend the conference fully prepared for a useful discussion of all problems involved in the proceeding, both procedural and substantive, and fully authorized to make commitments with respect thereto.

5. Parties should review the regulations relating to discovery, specifically 52 Pa. Code § 5.331(b), which provides, inter alia, that "a party shall endeavor to initiate discovery as early in the proceedings as reasonably possible," and 52 Pa. Code § 5.322, which encourages

parties to exchange information on an informal basis. All parties are urged to cooperate in discovery and advise me at the Prehearing Conference as to discovery problems which have not been resolved. There are limitations on discovery and sanctions for abuse of the discovery process. 52 Pa. Code §§ 5.361, 5.371-5.372.

6. Pursuant to 52 Pa. Code §§ 1.21 & 1.22, if you are an individual, you may represent yourself, or you may be represented by an attorney licensed to practice law in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, or admitted *Pro Hac Vice*. However, if you are a partnership, corporation, trust, association, or governmental agency or subdivision, you must be represented in this proceeding by an attorney licensed to practice law in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania or admitted *Pro Hac Vice*. Unless you are an attorney, you may not represent someone else. Attorneys shall ensure that their appearance is entered in accordance with the provisions of 52 Pa. Code § 1.24(b).

7. Failure of a party to attend the Prehearing Conference or notify the undersigned of their desire to fully participate without good cause shown, shall constitute a waiver of all objections to the agreements reached and matters decided at the Prehearing Conference, including, but not limited to, any special discovery rules and the litigation schedule established for this case. 52 Pa. Code §§ 5.222(e) & 5.224.

8. You must serve the presiding officer directly with a copy of any document that you file in this proceeding. If you send the undersigned any correspondence or document, you must send a copy to all other parties. For your convenience, a copy of the Commission's current service list to this proceeding is enclosed with this Order.

9. If you have a limited ability to speak or understand English or are deaf or hearing-impaired, a qualified interpreter can be provided upon your request. If you want an interpreter, please contact the Scheduling Office at least ten (10) days before the scheduled Prehearing Conference to make your request.
