The Bureau of Audits has reviewed Pike County Light & Power Company's proposed Supplement No. 113 to Tariff Electric – Pa. P.U.C. No. 8 and the supporting rate computations submitted on February 4, 2026 and revised on February 9, 2026, and February 26, 2026, to become effective on April 1, 2026.

Based upon staff review, it appears that the proposed System Benefits Charge (SBC) rate for the twelve-month period of April 1, 2026 through March 31, 2027, is consistent with the tariff and, accordingly, is permitted to become effective as filed.

The SBC is subject to continuous Commission review and audit as well as reconciliation reports in accordance with Section 1307(e) of the Public Utility Code, 66 Pa. C.S. § 1307(e).

Pursuant to the Commission's regulations at 52 Pa. Code § 5.44 (relating to petitions for reconsideration from actions of the staff), you may appeal by filing a petition for reconsideration with the Commission within 20 days of the date of this letter.
