**INTERIM ORDER
ON COMPLAINANT’S MARCH 16, 2026 FILING AND
DEADLINE FOR OBJECTIONS**

A fuller procedural history was provided in the Interim Order on Continuance and Procedural Deadlines issued on January 15, 2026 (January Order). Relevant to the instant order, during the evidentiary hearing held on January 9, 2026, the Complainant stated that he might file applications for subpoenas. Tr. 20-22. In the January Order, I directed that any application for subpoena should be filed with the Secretary of the Public Utility Commission and emailed to the presiding officer and parties by March 2, 2026 and any response or objection to an application should be filed within 10 days of service of the application.

On March 4, 2026, DJ Christopher Norman contacted the Office of Administrative Law Judge for assistance with eFiling. On that date, he eFiled documents titled as Notices of Intent to Serve a Subpoena to Attend and Testify Pursuant to 52 Pa. Code § 5.421, for twelve people (Subpoena Notice). Also on March 4, 2026, Mr. Norman emailed a copy of the Notice to me and counsel for PECO Energy Company (PECO or Respondent), Attorney Margaret A. Morris.

On March 12, 2026, the Respondent filed and served Objections of PECO Energy Company to the Complainant’s Subpoena Request. One of PECO’s objections is that Mr. Norman did not file an application for issuance of subpoena pursuant to 52 Pa. Code § 5.421(b).

On March 16, 2026, Mr. Norman eFiled a Motion to Compel and Response to Objections of PECO Energy Company to Subpoena Request of DJ Christopher Norman (Response to PECO Objections). The filing included a Certificate of Service, which indicated that it was emailed to me and Ms. Morris. The undersigned did not receive the filing by email.

During a review of the docket on March 20, 2026, I became aware of the Response to PECO Objections. Also on March 20, 2026, I emailed both parties a copy of the Response to PECO Objections and advised them that I would issue the instant order addressing procedures related to the filing.

As set forth in the ordering paragraphs below, I deem the Response to PECO Objections to be an application for subpoenas, supplementing the Subpoena Notice filed by the Complainant on March 4, 2026.¹ Any objection by PECO to the application is due by March 30, 2026.

An evidentiary hearing in this matter is scheduled for Wednesday, April 1, 2026, at 10:00 a.m. If the application is granted, the necessity for further hearing will be addressed.

Prior to the hearing, the parties are encouraged to explore whether stipulations of fact or agreement by a party to produce a witness could be used in place of the formal subpoena process. 52 Pa. Code § 5.231(a); Tr. 20-21.

Further, the parties should review the Prehearing Order issued on November 18, 2025 in this matter, which remains in effect and informs the parties about the procedural rules and requirements applicable to the evidentiary hearing.

THEREFORE,

IT IS ORDERED:

1. That the parties shall engage in discussions with each other and pursue a possible settlement of the outstanding issues, and potential stipulations, consistent with provisions in the Commission's regulations in 52 Pa. Code § 5.231(a).

2. That the Prehearing Order issued on November 18, 2025, in Docket No. C-2025-3057175, informing the parties about procedural rules and requirements for hearings in this proceeding, remains in effect.

3. That, **no later than March 25, 2026**, any party wishing to present any documents or exhibits at the hearing must send a copy by email to the presiding officer and parties. This requirement does not apply to documents and exhibits that were provided prior to the initial hearing on January 9, 2026.

4. That the Complainant's Motion to Compel and Response to Objections of PECO Energy Company to Subpoena Request of DJ Christopher Norman, filed on March 16, 2026, is deemed to be an application for subpoenas.

5. That, **no later than March 30, 2026**, any response or objection to the application for subpoenas must be filed with the Secretary of the Public Utility Commission and emailed to the presiding officer and parties.
