

NOTICE OF COMPLAINT

- A. You must file an Answer within twenty (20) days of the date of service of this Complaint. The date of service is the mailing date as indicated at the top of the Secretarial Letter for this Complaint and Notice, 52 Pa. Code §1.56(a). An Answer is a written explanation of circumstances wished to be considered in determining the outcome. The Answer should raise all factual and legal arguments that you wish to claim in your defense and must include the reference number of this Complaint. Your Answer must be verified and the original **mailed to:**

- B. If you fail to answer this Complaint within twenty (20) days, the Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement will request that the Commission issue a Secretarial Letter imposing a penalty. The penalty could include a civil penalty, the suspension or revocation of your operating authority, or other such remedy.
- C. You may elect not to contest this Complaint by paying the civil penalty requested in this Complaint by certified check or money order. **Payment must be made to "Commonwealth of Pennsylvania"** and should be forwarded to:

- D. Your payment is an admission that you committed the alleged violation and an agreement to cease and desist from further violations. Upon receipt of your payment, the Complaint proceeding shall be closed.
- E. If you file an Answer, which admits or fails to deny the allegations of the Complaint, the Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement will request that the Commission issue a Secretarial Letter imposing a civil penalty and/or other such remedy.
- F. If you file an Answer which contests the Complaint, the matter will be assigned to an Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) for hearing and decision. The ALJ is not bound by the requested civil penalty.

COMPLAINT

The Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (“Commission” or “PUC”) is a duly constituted agency of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania empowered to regulate public utilities within the Commonwealth. The Commission has delegated its authority to initiate proceedings which are prosecutory in nature to the Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement and other bureaus with enforcement responsibilities. Pursuant to that delegated authority and Section 701 of the Public Utility Code, the Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement – Motor Carrier Division hereby represents as follows:

1. That Rasier – PA LLC t/a UBER, Respondent, maintains its principal place of business at Uber 3 World Trade Center, 175 Greenwich Street, Floors 43-47, New York, New York 10007.

2. That Respondent was issued a license by this Commission on January 26, 2017, at Application Docket No. A-2016-2580821, PUC Utility Code 6416478, authorizing transportation of persons for compensation within Pennsylvania in Transportation Network Company (“TNC”) service.

3. That on January 30, 2026, PUC Motor Carrier Enforcement Officer Andrew Rosenberger was investigating unauthorized passenger carriers when he observed an Acura MDX bearing PA registration number LME5248, operating with an illuminated “Uber Available” dome light in front of Rivers Casino, Pittsburgh, Allegheny County. Officer Rosenberger photographed the vehicle and then approached the driver to ask how much for a ride to the Sheraton Pittsburgh Hotel at Station Square, Pittsburgh Allegheny County. The driver replied, “I can take you there for \$25”. Officer Rosenberger broke contact with the driver, however, the driver was recognized to be Jerome McCree, Sr. from the distinctive dome light and previous interactions with PUC Motor Carrier Enforcement Officers.

5. That on February 2, 2026, PUC Motor Carrier Enforcement Officer Joseph Zalar discovered that the PA registration number listed at paragraph 3, above, was registered to a 2015 Hyundai passenger vehicle owned by Jerome McCree, Sr.

6. That on February 2, 2026, PUC Enforcement Supervisor Ryan Balestra contacted Respondent, by email, inquiring if the driver, described at paragraph 3, above, and identified as Jerome McCree, Sr., was operating on its app during the encounter with Officer Rosenberger on January 30, 2026. Respondent confirmed that Jerome McCree, /Sr. was operating on its app during the encounter with Officer Rosenberger on January 30, 2026. Subsequently, Officer Rosenberger completed a Driver/Vehicle Compliance Report (“DVCR”) and mailed a copy to the driver, Jerome McCree, Sr.

7. That Respondent, by allowing a vehicle a driver to offer street hails while operating in the TNC service, violated 66 Pa. C.S. §2605(b)(7). The penalty for this violation is \$100.

8. That Respondent, by allowing a vehicle to be operated displaying an illuminated ornamental lamp on the vehicle roof violated 66 Pa. C.S. §2606(c)(2); 175 Pa. Code §175.66(h) . The fine for this violation is \$50.

9. That Respondent, by allowing a vehicle to be operated without a valid registration plate, violated 66 Pa. C.S. §2606(a); 75 Pa.C.S. §1372. The penalty for this violation is \$100.

WHEREFORE, the Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement hereby requests that the Commission impose a civil penalty of two hundred fifty (\$250.00) upon Rasier - PA LLC t/a UBER for the violations described in this Complaint and order such other remedy as the Commission may deem to be appropriate. If payment of the civil penalty is not made, the Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement requests that the Bureau of Administration, Financial & Assessments Office, be directed to refer the matter to the Pennsylvania Office of Attorney General for collection of the civil penalty.
