Re: Affiliated Interest Agreement – L&J Gas Co., LLC and L&J Oilfield Services, Inc.

Dear Mr. Crist:

On October 9, 2025, L&J Gas Co., LLC (L&J Gas) filed with the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (Commission), pursuant to 66 Pa. C.S. §§ 2102, *et seq.*, the above-referenced Affiliated Interest Agreement (AIA or Agreement). By Secretarial Letter of the same date, the Commission extended the statutory consideration period for this Agreement until further action of the Commission.

The proposed Agreement seeks Commission approval for L&J Gas to purchase operational services from L&J Oilfield Services, Inc. (L&J Oilfield).

L&J Gas is a certificated natural gas distribution company operating in Armstrong County. L&J Oilfield is a non-regulated natural gas well and pipeline services company in Armstrong County. L&J Gas and L&J Oilfield are affiliated interests, as defined under 66 Pa. C.S. § 2101, because of their common ownership by Jesse Colangelo.

Under the terms of the proposed Agreement, L&J Gas will purchase certain pipeline construction and repair services, and meter and service installation services from L&J Oilfield. L&J Gas will pay L&J Oilfield at usual and customary rates that do not exceed those charged for similar services provided to other natural gas utilities and natural gas producers. Services rendered to L&J Gas comprise less than 5% of L&J Oilfield's revenues and will be priced at or below prevailing market levels. Pipeline construction and repair services and meter and service installation costs, as well as materials associated with physical plant assets, will be directly allocated to L&J Gas. Shared labor, office supplies, and other administrative overhead costs will be allocated 90% to unregulated entities and 10% to the regulated utility. This division was determined based on the volume of work required by the utilities as compared with the unregulated entities.

The term of the Agreement is one year, commencing upon the date of Commission approval, and shall automatically renew on a year-to-year basis thereafter, unless amended by L&J Gas in accordance with the provisions in the Agreement.

Upon review of the filing, it does not appear that the Agreement is unreasonable or contrary to the public interest. Therefore, this AIA is hereby approved. This approval will apply only to this agreement, services, matters, and parties specifically and clearly defined under this instant proceeding as well as under any associated and previously filed filings. However, approval of this filing does not constitute a determination that the associated costs or expenses are reasonable or prudent for the purpose of determining just and reasonable rates. Furthermore, the Commission's approval is contingent upon the possibility that subsequent audits, reviews and inquiries in any Commission proceeding may be conducted, pursuant to 66 Pa. C.S. §§ 2102, *et seq.*
