

NOTICE OF COMPLAINT

- A. You must file an Answer within twenty (20) days of the date of service of this Complaint. The date of service is the mailing date as indicated at the top of the Secretarial Letter for this Complaint and Notice, 52 Pa. Code §1.56(a). An Answer is a written explanation of circumstances wished to be considered in determining the outcome. The Answer should raise all factual and legal arguments that you wish to claim in your defense and must include the reference number of this Complaint. Your Answer must be verified and the original **mailed to**:

- B. If you fail to answer this Complaint within twenty (20) days, the Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement will request that the Commission issue a Secretarial Letter imposing a penalty. The penalty could include a civil penalty, the suspension or revocation of your operating authority, or other such remedy.
- C. You may elect not to contest this Complaint by paying the civil penalty requested in this Complaint by certified check or money order. **Payment must be made to "Commonwealth of Pennsylvania"** and should be forwarded to:

- D. Your payment is an admission that you committed the alleged violation and an agreement to cease and desist from further violations. Upon receipt of your payment, the Complaint proceeding shall be closed.
- E. If you file an Answer, which admits or fails to deny the allegations of the Complaint, the Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement will request that the Commission issue a Secretarial Letter imposing a civil penalty and/or other such remedy.
- F. If you file an Answer which contests the Complaint, the matter will be assigned to an Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) for hearing and decision. The ALJ is not bound by the requested civil penalty.

COMPLAINT

The Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (“Commission” or “PUC”) is a duly constituted agency of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania empowered to regulate public utilities within the Commonwealth. The Commission has delegated its authority to initiate proceedings which are prosecutory in nature to the Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement and other bureaus with enforcement responsibilities. Pursuant to that delegated authority and Section 701 of the Public Utility Code, the Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement – Motor Carrier Division hereby represents as follows:

1. That LC TRANSPORTATION LLC, Respondent, maintains its principal place of business at 1824 Church Road, York PA 17408.

2. That a certificate of public convenience issued by this Commission is required to transport, as a motor carrier, property between points in Pennsylvania for compensation. Based on review of records maintained by the Commission, Respondent applied for a certificate of public convenience to transport, property, excluding household goods in use, on April 3, 2025, at Application Docket No. A-2025-3054405. Respondent’s application was conditionally approved upon submittal of insurance filings within sixty days of April 8, 2025, to which Respondent failed to comply, and Respondent’s application was dismissed by the Commission on June 17, 2025. Respondent subsequently applied for a certificate of public convenience to transport property, excluding household goods in use, on December 17, 2025, at Application Docket No. A-2025-3059363, Respondent’s application was conditionally approved upon submittal of insurance filings within sixty days of December 22, 2025, to which Respondent failed to comply, and Respondent’s application was dismissed by the Commission on March 5, 2026.

3. That on December 10, 2025, PUC Motor Carrier Enforcement Supervisor Ernest Smith and Officer Joshua Corney conducted an inspection of a 2026 Hino truck, bearing NY registration number 36270NG and having vehicle identification number ending in the last 4 digits 1529, operated by Braillian Lopez Mejia. Supervisor Snyder found Respondent in violation of transporting property between points in the Commonwealth for compensation without a certificate of public convenience granted by this Commission, as Respondent was transporting various tool sets and appliances from Harrisburg, Dauphin County, to various stops within Pennsylvania for \$850.00. Respondent was issued a Driver/Vehicle Compliance Report (“DVCR”) and, in accordance with Pennsylvania’s Motor Carrier Safety Assistance Program, a commercial motor vehicle inspection report.

4. That Respondent, by providing transportation services by vehicle for compensation on December 10, 2025, without first obtaining/holding a certificate/authority from the Commission, has violated 66 Pa. C.S. § §1101and 1102(a). The penalty for this violation is \$1,000.

WHEREFORE, the Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement hereby requests that

1. LC TRANSPORTATION LLC, be ordered to pay a civil penalty of one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) for the violations set forth in this Complaint and order such other remedy as the Commission may deem to be appropriate.
2. Respondent be directed to cease and desist from transporting property between points in Pennsylvania for compensation until such time as the proper authority has been granted by the Commission.
3. If payment of the civil penalty is not made, the Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement requests that:
 - a. The Commission certify Respondent's motor vehicle registrations to the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation for suspension or revocation, pursuant to 75 Pa. C.S. §1375; and
 - b. The matter be referred to the Pennsylvania Office of Attorney General for appropriate action.
