ORDER
GRANTING BKV’S UNOPPOSED MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME TO ANSWER
UGI GAS’S PRELIMINARY OBJECTIONS

On February 6, 2026, UGI Utilities, Inc. – Gas Division (“UGI Gas”) filed an Application seeking approval pursuant to Sections 1102(a)(3), 1103(a), and 2102(b) of the Pennsylvania Public Utility Code (“Code”) to transfer the Auburn City Gate Stations located in Auburn Township, Susquehanna County, Pennsylvania, to UGI Auburn Gathering, LLC (“UGI Gathering”). UGI Gas also seeks approval of a modification of an existing affiliated interest agreement pursuant to Section 2103 of the Code.

Notice of the Application was published in the February 21, 2026, issue of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. The Notice indicated that formal protests and petitions to intervene to the Application were to be filed by March 9, 2026.

On March 9, 2026, BKV Operating, LLC (“BKV”) filed a Petition to Intervene and Protest.

On March 9, 2026, UGI Gas filed a Letter wherein it agreed to extend the deadline for the Procter & Gamble Paper Products Company (“P&G”) to file an intervention or protest, from March 9, 2026, to April 8, 2026.

On March 9, 2026, P&G filed a Petition to Intervene.

On March 19, 2026, a Prehearing Conference Notice was issued, scheduling a prehearing conference in this matter to be held on April 15, 2026, and assigning the matter to me as Presiding Officer.

On March 25, 2026, my Prehearing Conference Order was issued. The Order, amongst other things, directed the parties¹ to file Prehearing Memorandums by April 14, 2026.

On March 27, 2026, BKV filed an Amended Petition to Intervene and Protest.²

On March 27, 2026, BKV filed a Motion for Admission *Pro Hac Vice* of R. Taylor Speer and Cordon M. Smart.

On March 27, 2026, UGI Gas filed Preliminary Objections to the Petition to Intervene and Protest of BKV. The Preliminary Objections contained a Notice to Plead indicating that BKV may file an Answer to the Preliminary Objections with 10 days of the date of service.

On March 30, 2026, BKV filed an Unopposed Motion for Extension of Time to Answer UGI Gas’s Preliminary Objections (“Motion”). BKV requests that the deadline for responding to UGI Gas’s Preliminary Objections be extended from April 6, 2026, to noon on April 10, 2026, due to preplanned vacations scheduled by BKV’s counsel. BKV indicated in its Motion that UGI Gas nor P&G objected to the Motion.

¹ The Prehearing Conference Order indicated that, for the purposes of the Order, the term “parties” referred to UGI Gas, BKV, and P&G.

² BKV, in its Amended Petition to Intervene and Protest, notes that the only modifications made by way of the amended petition was the incorporation of docket numbers and the address of BKV.

The Commission's regulations provide the following concerning requests for extensions of time:

(a) Extensions of time shall be governed by the following:

(1) Except as otherwise provided by statute, whenever under this title or by order of the Commission, or notice given thereunder, an act is required or allowed to be done at or within a specified time, the time fixed or the period of time prescribed may, by the Commission, the presiding officer or other authorized person, for good cause be extended upon motion made before expiration of the period originally prescribed or as previously extended. Upon motion made after the expiration of the specified period, the act may be permitted to be done where reasonable grounds are shown for the failure to act.

52 Pa. Code § 1.15(a)(1)

I agree with BKV that good cause exists to grant its Motion, given the preplanned vacations scheduled by BKV's counsel. Granting the extension would provide BKV with additional time to adequately address the Preliminary Objections. Additionally, it has been considered that UGI Gas and P&G do not object to the Motion.

For the above reasons, BKV's Motion will be granted in the Ordering paragraphs below.
