Bridge structure (BRKEY 3298) and roadway closure at the public crossing (DOT 869 358 A) where Clinton Road (T-881) crosses, above grade, a single track of Buffalo & Pittsburgh Railroad, Incorporated, located in South Buffalo Township, Armstrong County.

To Whom It May Concern:

By Secretarial Letter dated January 30, 2026, the subject bridge was reopened to all vehicular and pedestrian traffic, and Buffalo & Pittsburgh Railroad and South Buffalo Township were directed to provide notice to this Commission within sixty (60) days of the date of the Secretarial Letter regarding the resolution of the disputed final costs.

On March 31, 2026, the Commission received a joint motion from Buffalo & Pittsburgh Railroad and South Buffalo Township requesting additional time to resolve the disputed final costs associated with the alteration of the subject crossing. Buffalo & Pittsburgh Railroad and South Buffalo Township request that the Commission grant an extension of time to April 15, 2026.

We have carefully reviewed the record in this proceeding and will grant Buffalo & Pittsburgh Railroad and South Buffalo Township an extension of time to April 15, 2026, to resolve the disputed final costs.

This Commission issues this Secretarial Letter in accordance with Section 2702 of the Public Utility Code.

THEREFORE:

The joint motion of Buffalo & Pittsburgh Railroad and South Buffalo received by the Commission on March 31, 2026, requesting an extension of time, be and is hereby granted to the extent herein directed:

1. Paragraph 3 of our Secretarial Letter dated January 30, 2026, which reads as follows, to wit:

- “3. Buffalo & Pittsburgh Railroad, Incorporated and South Buffalo Township shall provide notice to this Commission within sixty (60) days of the date of this Secretarial Letter regarding the resolution of the disputed final costs. If notice from the parties is not received by the aforementioned date, the matter will be reassigned to the Commission’s Office of Administrative Law Judge for adjudication of the final costs and the resolution of any other outstanding issues. All parties of record will be served notice of the date on which a hearing is scheduled.”

be and is hereby modified to read:

3. Buffalo & Pittsburgh Railroad, Incorporated and South Buffalo Township shall provide notice to this Commission on or before April 15, 2026, regarding the resolution of the disputed final costs. If notice from the parties is not received by the aforementioned date, the matter will be reassigned to the Commission’s Office of Administrative Law Judge for adjudication of the final costs and the resolution of any other outstanding issues. All parties of record will be served notice of the date on which a hearing is scheduled.

2. In all respects not inconsistent herewith, our Secretarial Letters and Orders docketed at C-20030388 remain in full force and effect.

The Parties are reminded that failure to comply with this or any Order or Secretarial Letter in this proceeding may result in an enforcement action seeking civil penalties and/or other sanctions pursuant to 66 Pa. C.S. § 3301.

All formal documents must be filed with the Secretary of the Commission. Documents must be eFiled, mailed or hand delivered. All filings should be addressed to the Secretary, PA Public Utility Commission, 400 North Street, Harrisburg, PA 17120. The Commission will not accept documents delivered by fax or by e-mail. If your filing contains confidential material, you are required to file by overnight delivery to ensure the timely filing of your submission. There are certain filings that cannot be eFiled, such as filings containing confidential or proprietary material. These must be submitted to the Secretary by overnight delivery, priority, or certified mail to allow tracking of your filing.

If you are dissatisfied with the resolution of this matter, you may, as set forth in 52 Pa. Code §§ 1.31 and 5.44, file a Petition for Reconsideration from Staff Action (Petition) with the Commission within twenty (20) days of the date of this letter. The Petition shall be eFiled with the Secretary of the Commission or sent to: Secretary, PA Public Utility Commission, 400 North Street, Harrisburg, PA 17120, and must be filed within twenty (20) days, or if no timely request is made, the action will be deemed to be a final action of the Commission.

The Petition MUST include: (1) a written statement (divided into numbered paragraphs) outlining the reasons for the request; (2) the case docket number (it is provided for you at the top right-hand corner of this letter); (3) the party on whose behalf the petition is made; (4) a Certificate of Service on the other parties of record; and (5) a Verification with original signature in accordance with 52 Pa. Code § 1.36.
