**RESPONDENT PPL ELECTRIC UTILITIES CORPORATION'S UNCONTESTED
MOTION FOR CONTINUANCE OF THE INITIAL TELEPHONIC HEARING**

Respondent PPL Electric Utilities Corporation ("PPL" and/or "Respondent"), by and through its counsel, Fitzpatrick Lentz & Bubba, P.C., hereby files the instant Uncontested Motion for Continuance of the Initial Telephonic Hearing as follows:

1. On or about December 2, 2025, Complainant Brian Carnahan ("Complainant") filed a Complaint against PPL.
2. On or about December 22, 2025, PPL filed an Answer to the Complaint as well as Preliminary Objections to the Complaint.
3. On or about February 24, 2026, PPL's Preliminary Objections were granted in part, and denied in part.
4. An initial telephonic hearing is scheduled for Tuesday, April 7, 2026, at 10:00 a.m.
5. The parties have engaged in ongoing settlement discussions.
6. Most recently, Complainant made a settlement demand to resolve his remaining claims against PPL.

7. PPL will not be able to fully evaluate and respond to Complainant's most recent demand by the time of the initial telephonic hearing.

8. Accordingly, PPL respectfully requests a 30-day extension of the initial telephonic hearing to allow the parties to continue their settlement discussions without incurring additional expenses to litigate this matter.

9. Counsel for PPL has conferred with Complainant about the instant motion, and Complainant agrees with a 30-day continuance of the initial telephonic hearing.

10. There have been no prior continuance requests made by either party.

11. No party will suffer prejudice if the initial telephonic hearing is continued.

WHEREFORE, PPL Electric Utilities Corporation respectfully requests that the initial telephonic hearing be continued by thirty (30) days.
