4. The Complainant is authorized and directed by the Small Business Advocate Act, Act 181 of 1988, 73 P.S. §§ 399.41 - 399.50, to represent the interests of small business consumers of utility services in matters before the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (“Commission”).

5. This Complaint is filed against the rates, terms, and other provisions of Supplement No. 92 to UGI Electric Tariff – Pa. P.U.C. No. 6 (“Supplement No. 92”), which was filed with the Commission on March 27, 2026, by UGI Utilities, Inc. – Electric Division (“UGI Electric” or the “Company”). The rates set forth in the Company’s March 27th filing, if approved by the Commission, would increase UGI Electric’s annual distribution revenues by \$17.283 million, or by 11.89%.

6. Supplement No. 92 proposes to increase the distribution rates paid by the Company’s small business customers by 14.1%, a larger percentage when compared to the overall system increase of 11.89%.

7. Supplement No. 92 proposes to change the Company’s weather normalization calculation from 15 years to 10 years, merely because 10 years “aligns with [UGI Electric’s] budgeting process.”

8. Supplement No. 92 proposes to “simplify” the rate structure for its large customer class to “reduce intraclass subsidies.” No similar proposals were proposed for the Company’s small business customers.

9. After preliminary review of the materials filed by the Company in support of the proposed Supplements, Complainant believes, and therefore avers, that those materials may be insufficient to justify the rate increase requested and that the Company’s present and proposed rates, rules, and conditions of service may be unjust, unreasonable, unduly discriminatory, and

otherwise contrary to law, particularly as they pertain to UGI Electric's small business customers.

10. Complainant believes, and therefore avers, that UGI Electric's proposed tariff changes, proposed rates, rate design, and revenue allocation are or may be unjust, unreasonable, and unlawfully discriminatory in violation of, *inter alia*, Sections 1301 and 1304 of the Public Utility Code, 66 Pa. C.S. §§1301 and 1304, and, furthermore, are contrary to appropriate public policy, sound ratemaking considerations, and may not be supported by the materials filed by UGI Electric.

11. In view of the foregoing, the Small Business Advocate respectfully requests that the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission:

- A. Suspend and investigate the operation of Supplement No. 92;
- B. At the conclusion of such investigation, reject the proposed new rates and other tariff changes in Supplement No. 92 to the extent required to make certain that UGI Electric's rates are lawful, just, reasonable, and not unduly discriminatory against small business customers; and
- C. Grant such other relief as may be necessary or appropriate.

**PUBLIC STATEMENT OF
THE OFFICE OF SMALL BUSINESS ADVOCATE**

The Small Business Advocate is authorized and directed to represent the interest of small business consumers of utility services in Pennsylvania under the provisions of the Small Business Advocate Act, Act 181 of 1988, 73 P.S. §§ 399.41 - 399.50 (“Act”). The Act further provides that the Small Business Advocate is to issue publicly a written statement stating concisely the specific interest of small business consumers to be protected by her initiation of or intervention in any proceeding involving those interests before the Public Utility Commission (“Commission”) or any other agency or court. This public statement relates to the filing today by the Small Business Advocate of a complaint against the proposed base rate tariff filings of UGI Utilities, Inc. – Electric Division (“UGI Electric” or the “Company”), which would increase the annual operating revenue of UGI Electric by \$17.283 million per year.

The Small Business Advocate files this formal complaint against the Company’s proposed base rate tariff filings to protect the interests of UGI Electric’s small business customers. A thorough inquiry by the Commission into all elements of the Company’s proposed tariff filings is necessary to ensure that the tariff filings are lawful, just, reasonable, and not discriminatory to UGI Electric’s small business customers.

In view of the foregoing, the Small Business Advocate will participate in proceedings before the Public Utility Commission to investigate the reasonableness of the proposed base rate tariff filings. The Small Business Advocate will ask the Commission to deny any proposed new rates and other tariff changes that apply to small business customers that are not proven by UGI Electric to be lawful, just, reasonable, and not discriminatory to the Company's small business customers.
