On March 2, 2026, FirstEnergy Pennsylvania Electric Company (FE PA) filed its 2025 Annual Asset Optimization Plan (2025 AAOP) for its electric operations with the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (Commission), pursuant to 52 Pa. Code § 121.6.

The Commission has delegated the review of AAOPs to the Bureau of Technical Utility Services (TUS). TUS requires additional information to complete its review of FE PA's AAOP, which is listed in Attachment 1. Please respond with the information requested in Attachment 1. To assist the TUS in its review of FE PA's 2025 AAOP, through this letter the consideration period of FE PA's 2025 AAOP is hereby extended to May 29, 2026.

Please forward the information to the Secretary of the Commission **within ten (10) business days** from the date of this letter. All documents requiring notary stamps must have original signatures. The Commission strongly encourages submission through efilings with the Secretary of the Commission by opening an efilings account through the Commission's website and accepting eservice at <https://efiling.puc.pa.gov>. The Commission is accepting all public documents through our efilings system at this time.

If your filing contains confidential material, you are required to either file by overnight delivery or submit it to the Secretary's Share Point File system to ensure the timely filing of your submission. M-1. In Appendix A of FE PA's 2025 AAOP, FE PA indicated that it made the decision to pull forward additional LTIP funding into 2026 to realize the planned reliability benefits earlier. FE PA also stated that its in-servicing target will be \$705 million for 2026, which is a 230% increase from the proposed spending amount for 2026. Please provide responses to the following:

- a. Clarify if FE PA expects that a major modification to its Commission approved LTIP will be necessary; and
- b. If FE PA is not projecting a major modification to its Commission approved LTIP, provide a table depicting FE PA's proposed revised expenditures, by year, for each of its LTIP Initiatives.
