STATUS REPORT

TO ADMINISTRATIVE LAW JUDGE MARK A. HOYER:

Duquesne Light Company submits the following Status Report for the Complaint of Jeffrey Kashuba filed at Docket F-2025-3057512 (“Complaint”).

I. Background

An evidentiary hearing was scheduled for this Complaint on December 16, 2025 in front of Administrative Law Judge Mary D. Long per prehearing order issued on October 16, 2025. On December 16, 2025, in lieu of an evidentiary hearing, a settlement discussion was held upon direction of Administrative Law Judge Long. The Parties were unable to finalize a settlement on that date. Administrative Law Judge Long directed Duquesne Light Company to file a status report advising of progress regarding settlement discussions. On January 20, 2026, Duquesne Light Company submitted a status report indicating that additional time would be required to reach a settlement. On February 4, 2026, Duquesne Light Company submitted a second status report, indicating that settlement discussions are no longer productive and that the Complainant requested a hearing.

On March 26, 2026, a Judge Change Notice and Further Telephonic Hearing Notice was issued, scheduling an evidentiary hearing for March 26, 2026 in front of Administrative Law Judge

Mark A. Hoyer. An evidentiary hearing was held on March 26, 2026. Near the conclusion of the hearing, Administrative Law Judge Hoyer directed Duquesne Light Company to file a status report by April 10, 2026 indicating whether the Complainant has enrolled in the Company's Customer Assistance Program ("CAP").


Status Report.
