PETITION OF PECO ENERGY COMPANY TO WITHDRAW TARIFF NO. 9

Pursuant to 52 Pa. Code § 5.94, PECO Energy Company (“PECO” or the “Company”), respectfully requests leave to withdraw PECO’s Tariff Electric – Pa. P.U.C. No. 9 (“Tariff No. 9”) containing revisions in, additions to, and deletions from certain Rules and Regulations, rate schedules and riders in the Company’s currently effective tariff, without prejudice.

In support of this Petition, PECO states as follows:

1. PECO is a corporation organized and existing under the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania with its principal office in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. PECO provides electric distribution service to nearly 1.7 million customers.
2. On March 30, 2026, PECO filed Tariff No. 9 with the Commission, with all of the supporting data required by the regulations of the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (“Commission”) at 52 Pa. Code §§ 52.52 – 53.53.
3. PECO last filed for a rate increase in 2024. Tariff No. 9 proposed a rate increase of approximately \$429 million to continue significant investments in PECO’s electric distribution system to further enhance safe and reliable electric service.
4. On April 2, 2026, PECO was served with a customer complaint, which was docketed at C-2026-3061487.

5. On April 7, 2026, the Tenant Union Representative Network (“TURN”) and the Coalition for Affordable Utility Service and Energy Efficiency in Pennsylvania (“CAUSE-PA”) filed a formal complaint, which was docketed at C-2026-3061644.

6. On April 8, 2026, the Office of Small Business Advocate filed a Complaint and Public Statement.

7. On April 9, 2026, Carrie B. Wright and Joanna Toft-Funk filed a Notice of Appearance on behalf of the Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement.

8. In the wake of the filing of Tariff No. 9, and reflecting upon concerns expressed by customers, policymakers, regional leaders, and community partners, PECO has determined to seek leave to withdraw Tariff No. 9 and maintain electric distribution rates at current levels at this time.

9. While the proposed rate increases were designed to support necessary long-term investments in the safety, reliability, and resiliency of the electric distribution system and PECO sought to limit bill impacts in its filing, PECO recognizes the priority of affordability for many stakeholders.

10. PECO will continue to make on-going investments required for system safety, system maintenance, operational integrity, and reliability, and PECO remains committed to on-going electric distribution system modernization to meet customer needs.

11. Granting this Petition is in the public interest. Withdrawal of Tariff No. 9 at this early stage of the proceedings, before suspension and investigation by the Commission, will avoid substantial litigation expense for current and potential parties as well as the Commission.

12. PECO requests that Tariff No. 9 be withdrawn without prejudice to filing future changes in rates, rules, and regulations. Withdrawal without prejudice will not prejudice any customer or other potential party in any future proceedings.

WHEREFORE, PECO respectfully requests that the Commission issue an order: (i) granting this Petition for Withdrawal of Tariff No. 9 without prejudice; and (ii) marking the above-captioned proceedings closed.
