ORDER

BY THE COMMISSION:

On March 27, 2026, UGI Utilities, Inc. – Electric Division (UGI), Utility Code 111100, filed proposed Supplement No. 92 to UGI Electric Tariff – PA P.U.C. No. 6, containing proposed changes in rates, rules, and regulations calculated to produce \$17.283 million (11.89%) in additional annual revenues, an average increase in residential customer’s bills using 1,000 kWh/month from \$200.50 to \$226.23/month (12.8%), to become effective June 1, 2026.

On April 7, 2026 and April 8, 2026, the Office of Small Business Advocate and the Office of Consumer Advocate, respectively, filed a Formal Complaint. Various oppositions have been filed.

UGI stated that the requested increase in its base rates is necessary to allow UGI to earn a fair return on investments used and useful to serve the public safely and reliably, to support ongoing Commission-approved infrastructure replacement programs designed to enhance safety and reliability, to recover operating expenses necessary for the provision of safe and reliable electric distribution service, to enhance information technology systems, and to incorporate updates to its rate design and allocations to better align with UGI's anticipated operations in the test year.

Pursuant to 66 Pa. C.S. §1308(d), the filing will be suspended by operation of law until January 1, 2027, unless permitted by Commission Order to become effective at an earlier date.

Further, to inform the Commission in reviewing this proposed rate increase, we direct that the presiding Administrative Law Judge(s) shall include in the Recommended Decision adjudicating this filing, and the parties shall include in any settlement related thereto, the impacts the rates recommended for approval will have on UGI's customers. The rate impact information shall include the average bill impact for residential, commercial, and industrial customers with the percentage increases compared to the rates in effect prior to the filing of the proposed UGI Electric Tariff – PA P.U.C. No. 6.

Investigation and analysis of this proposed tariff filing and the supporting data indicate that the proposed changes in rates, rules, and regulations may be unlawful, unjust, unreasonable, and contrary to the public interest. It also appears that consideration should be given to the reasonableness of UGI's existing rates, rules, and regulations; **THEREFORE,**

IT IS ORDERED:

1. That an investigation on Commission motion be, and hereby is, instituted to determine the lawfulness, justness, and reasonableness of the rates, rules, and regulations contained in the proposed Supplement No. 92 to UGI Electric Tariff – PA P.U.C. No. 6.

2. That the proposed Supplement No. 92 to UGI Electric Tariff – PA P.U.C. No. 6 is suspended by operation of law until January 1, 2027, unless otherwise directed by Order of the Commission.

3. That pursuant to 52 Pa. Code §53.71 tariff supplements shall be filed with the Commission and posted at the company to announce that the aforementioned Original Tariff is suspended until the date stated in the Commission Order. Attached is a sample copy of a suspension supplement which shall be filed in triplicate or, if applicable, e-filed with the Commission within 10 days following the Order entry date.

4. That this investigation shall include consideration of the lawfulness, justness, and reasonableness of the UGI Utilities, Inc. – Electric Division’s existing rates, rules, and regulations.

5. That the case be assigned to the Office of Administrative Law Judge for the prompt scheduling of such hearings as may be necessary culminating in the issuance of a Recommended Decision.

6. That the presiding Administrative Law Judge(s) shall include in the Recommended Decision adjudicating this filing, and the parties shall include in any settlement related thereto, the impacts the rates recommended for approval will have on UGI Utilities, Inc. – Electric Division’s customers. The rate impact information shall include the average bill impact for residential, commercial, and industrial customers with

the percentage increases compared to the rates in effect prior to the filing of the proposed Supplement No. 92 to UGI Electric Tariff – PA P.U.C. No. 6.

7. That a copy of this Order shall be served upon UGI Utilities, Inc. – Electric Division, the Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement, the Office of Consumer Advocate, the Office of Small Business Advocate, and any persons who have filed Formal Complaints against the proposed tariff supplement.
