Importantly, projects like this help sustain consistent employment for construction workers, whose livelihoods depend on a steady pipeline of infrastructure work. Energy infrastructure




development—particularly projects that modernize and enhance existing systems—provides critical opportunities for local workers and contractors while supporting broader economic activity across the Commonwealth.
