Your Honor:

PPL Electric objects to the admission of the evidence submitted by Edward Braskey (the “Complainant”) on April 2, 2026, and April 11, 2026, into the record. PPL Electric further requests that the Complainant’s Motion for Summary Judgement be denied as untimely.

During the evidentiary hearing in the above-captioned matter held on February 23, 2026, Your Honor requested that PPL Electric submit a memorandum explaining the regulatory basis for PPL Electric’s record retention policy, along with any documents tending to show whether other ratepayers were associated with the service address that is the subject of this dispute during the period PPL records indicate the Complainant resided there. (Tr. 113.) The Complainant would also be given the opportunity to offer objections or provide responsive comments on the same. (Tr. 112.)

PPL Electric provided this information on Thursday, April 2, 2026, after being granted a brief extension. The same day, the Complainant submitted a number of screenshots and an argument that the screenshots he submitted prove his case. He submitted additional exhibits and a motion on April 11, 2026. These documents and argument are not directly responsive to PPL Electric’s submission, and as such should not be considered. The Complainant should not be afforded an open-ended opportunity to rehabilitate his case by now being permitted to offer into the evidentiary record exhibits that should have been served prior to the evidentiary hearing for consideration during the evidentiary hearing. PPL Electric’s submission, by contrast, was in response to a specific request by Your Honor. The Complainant’s response should be similarly limited in scope. His exhibits should not be entered into the evidentiary record, and his additional argument not considered.

Further, these exhibits primarily consist of a collection of screengrabs purportedly from the IRS and other websites. They are unauthenticated, lack foundation, appear to be incomplete, and contain hearsay. As such, they are inherently unreliable and should not be admitted into the evidentiary record.

Finally, the Complainant included in his April 11, 2026, submission to Your Honor a Motion for Summary Judgement and Immediate Dismissal. This Motion was not served on PPL Electric by the Complainant (in violation of 52 Pa. Code § 1.54) and does not appear to have been filed at the docket. While these procedural defects are in themselves sufficient to merit disregarding the motion (*See* 52 Pa. Code § 1.38), the motion should be rejected as untimely. Section 5.102 of the Commission's regulations provide that, "[a]fter the pleadings are closed, but within a time so that the hearing is not delayed, a party may move for judgment on the pleadings or summary judgment." (52 Pa. Code § 5.102(b)). Moving for summary judgement following an evidentiary hearing, when a decision can be made on the merits of the evidence presented, makes little procedural sense and is not contemplated by the regulations, which allow for such a motion in the period after pleadings are closed, but before the evidentiary hearing has been held. Therefore, the motion should not be considered or, in the alternative, should be denied.


