## TUS Data Request Set 1

### The Pennsylvania-American Water Company - Wastewater Division Annual Asset Optimization Plan at Docket No. P-2026-3060810

- P-1. Pennsylvania-American Water – Wastewater Division’s (PAWC-WD’s) Annual Asset Optimization Plan (AAOP) projected DSIC-eligible spending of \$30.23 million for 2026, as compared to its Long-Term Infrastructure Improvement Plan (LTIP) projection of \$65.54 million, which is an approximate 54% decrease in funding. PAWC-WD stated that the lower projected expenditures on wastewater replacement and rehabilitation projects were due to the projected expenditures needed on regulatory-driven projects. Please explain and provide specific details on the “regulatory-driven projects” that caused the projected decrease in spending for 2026.
