PROTEST

Before the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (Commission), pursuant to 52 Pa. I don't want my electric rates to go up to pay for data centers in Virginia. I don't want our area's viewshed and landscape ruined for Virginia's benefit

I am also concerned with my property being devalued as many local realtors have said that property values decrease after power lines are installed. I moved to my property after surviving cancer in 2004 to enjoy the natural beauty of our mountains. I feel that the beauty of our area will be destroyed if the power lines are built. I'm also concerned of the health risks of living near the lines such as stray voltage and electro magnetic fields affecting my family and of course, my cancer returning.

5. Set forth the facts establishing the Protestant's standing to protest the Applications.

There is no need for these power lines to be located in Pennsylvania. None of the power is going to Pennsylvania and Pennsylvanians do not benefit from this since the power will flow to data centers in Virginia. Unreasonable risks of danger to the health and safety of the public will be created by extra wind blowing through these mountainous timbered corridors and causing wind damage. Stray voltage and electromagnetic fields will affect livestock and people living near the lines. Studies have shown that power lines are affected by the electromagnetic fields created by the power lines. I myself have been affected by cancer and don't want to live near large electromagnetic fields, which could increase my odds of the cancer returning. I moved to the area where I live to stay away from intense industry and electromagnetic fields. In addition, Pennsylvania has beautiful state parks and forests in the path of this project. Our region heavily relies on tourism and natural beauty to attract visitors and generate revenue. The unredacted look of the power lines directly contrasts the area's tourism industry. Since Pennsylvania does not benefit in any way from these power lines, I feel it would make more sense to build the power generating facilities near the data centers. Hundreds of miles of beautiful property would then remain unaffected. This is private property that people in this area cherish. Industrial areas will remain industrial while beautiful natural landscape where people live will stay intact.



8. **Relief Requested**




