To All Parties:

By Secretarial Letter on March 2, 2026, the Commission issued the Initial Decision of Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) Katrina L. Dunderdale in this matter. Therein, ALJ Dunderdale dismissed the Formal Complaint (Complaint) of Mary Beth Bawden (Ms. Bawden), with prejudice, based upon Ms. Bawden's failure to appear at the hearing scheduled in this matter.

Exceptions to the Initial Decision were filed by Ms. Bawden on March 24, 2026. On April 2, 2026, Duquesne Light Company (DLC) filed a Letter in Lieu of Reply Exceptions noting that it would not be filing Reply Exceptions and a Certificate of Satisfaction advising the Commission that Ms. Bawden no longer wished to pursue her Complaint against DLC and asking the Commission to withdraw the Complaint and mark the case closed. Certificate at 1.


The Commission's Regulations at 52 Pa. Code § 5.24 allow for the parties to a proceeding to file certified statements of satisfaction before or after a hearing. The Commission is not required to render a decision concerning the satisfaction of a complaint absent a request by the parties for a decision. 52 Pa. Code § 5.24(a). The respondent to a proceeding, in this case DLC, may file a certified statement indicating the complainant no longer wishes to pursue the complaint. 52 Pa. Code § 5.24(b)(2). Where a respondent files a Certificate of Satisfaction, a copy shall be served upon the complainant and shall also explain the complainant's right to object within ten days. 52 Pa. Code § 5.24(c). Unless a written objection is filed, the complaint docket will be marked closed. *Id.*

DLC served the Certificate of Satisfaction upon Ms. Bawden by both email and first class mail on April 2, 2026 in compliance with Commission Regulations. Since over ten days have passed and Ms. Bawden has not filed any objection, the Commission

shall consider this matter resolved. Therefore, the Exceptions filed on March 24, 2026, by Ms. Bawden are deemed moot and the Commission's Secretary Bureau shall mark the docket of Mary Beth Bawden v. Duquesne Light Company, at Docket No. C-2025-3057610, as closed.
