

A-7 Reference the Letter of Notification, Paragraph 6. Please explain whether the subject project cost includes work at Bramah Substation. If so, please provide the approximate cost for the substation work.

RESPONSE:

Please see page 2 of the Letter of Notification (“LON”) which states that “[t]he total estimated cost of the Project, as described below, is approximately \$5 million, and the cost for the Project will be paid by Transource PA”. “Project” is defined as “seven aerial lines extending from the previously-approved Transource PA Bramah Substation to points of interconnection (“POI”) with seven nearby PECO Energy Company (“PECO”) high-voltage transmission lines and transmission line structures called ‘Cut-In’ lines (the “Project”).” First paragraph, page 1 of the LON.

Further, paragraph 14 of the LON states as follows: “The Project addresses all issues required in a LON and in Attachment 1– Need Statement. The estimated cost of the Project is approximately \$5 million, and the cost of the Project will be paid by Transource.” The footnote attached to the end of Paragraph 14 states that: “The estimated cost was developed using averages of recent costs for similar projects and without an in-depth analysis or field investigation. The cost is subject to change as the constructability of the Project, sequence of construction, and other factors that may affect cost are identified and analyzed as the Project progresses.” LON Footnote 9.

The project cost specified in the LON relates solely to the Cut-in Lines, which is the “Project” for purposes of the LON. Thus, the identified project costs relate solely to the Cut-in Lines and not to the entire Bramah Substation.
