PREHEARING ORDER FOR FURTHER TELEPHONIC HEARING

AND NOW, this 30th day of April 2026, it is hereby ORDERED:

1. DATE AND TIME OF HEARING. A further telephonic hearing for the purpose of the introduction of additional exhibits will be held in this case on:

Monday, June 22, 2026, beginning at 10:00 AM

To participate in the hearing, you must dial the toll-free number listed below. You will be prompted to enter a Passcode Number, which is also listed below. You will be asked to speak your name, press the # key, and then the telephone system will connect you to the hearing. If you have any witnesses you want to have present during the hearing who are participating from a separate phone, you must provide them with the Toll-free Bridge Number and Passcode Number.

2. SETTLEMENT. The Commission's policy is to encourage settlements. 52 Pa. Code § 5.231(a). The utility shall contact the Complainant at least one week before the scheduled hearing to talk over a possible settlement of this case.

3. VIOLATIONS. A finding of a violation of a Commission Order, regulation or statute may result in the imposition of a civil penalty consistent with 66 Pa.C.S. § 3301 or other provision of the Public Utility Code. **The utility shall be prepared to discuss prior findings of violations.**

4. PRESENTING EXHIBITS. If you intend to present any documents or exhibits at the further hearing, you must email one (1) copy to the Presiding Officer at efarren@pa.gov and one (1) copy each must be sent to the other party. All copies must be received at least five (5) business days before the hearing. Proposed exhibits should be properly pre-marked for identification purposes. Do not include account numbers or any other personally identifiable information (PII), such as social security numbers, in your documents or exhibits. It is the parties' responsibility to redact any PII contained within a document or exhibit before submitting it into the record.

5. FILING AND SERVING DOCUMENTS. When you file a document, you must provide the original to the Commission and serve a copy to the other party or parties.

6. BURDEN OF PROOF. The Complainant (the one filing the Complaint) bears the burden of proof and must present evidence sufficient to demonstrate that the utility has violated the Public Utility Code, or a regulation or order of the Commission. 66 Pa.C.S. § 332(a).

7. CONTACT INFORMATION. If your email address or telephone number changes during the course of the proceeding, you must immediately update the Office of Administrative Law Judge by calling 717.787.1399.

8. ACCOMMODATION. Any party who needs an accommodation for a disability or if you require an interpreter in order to participate in this hearing process may request one by calling 717.787.1399. TTY-based Telecommunications Relay Service number for persons with a hearing and/or speech impairment is 711.

9. HEARING PROCEDURES. Although the hearing is being conducted telephonically for the convenience of the parties, it is a formal hearing. Please be sure to participate from a location where background noise will be minimized, and the reception is clear.
