3. Set out clearly and concisely the facts from which the alleged interest or right of the Protestant can be determined. 52 Pa. Code § 5.52(a)(1).

This proposal will affect me most specifically as a rate payer. My power rates have risen twice this year already and this project will no doubt raise rates on local payers significantly. I am retired and live on a fixed budget and any significant raise in my rates will affect my budget. I also do not think that the local scenery should be a casualty to another state's power needs.

4. State the grounds of the Protest. 52 Pa. Code § 5.52(a)(2).

I am concerned for not only myself, but also for my neighbors and all of the surrounding area due to the promised rate increases that will be associated with this project. Power rates in this area are already high enough without the increase that this project will cause. I also fear that due to our power grid already being old and strained, that this project will make our local power unreliable, as power flow will be straight to the area with the most need, that being the area of Virginia due to the data center power need. Unreliable power with the possibility of blackouts or brownouts is not acceptable in this day and age. Virginia chose to irresponsibly build too many data centers and now is in need of more power. Taking from an already strained grid to feed a need caused by irresponsible decisions in another state is unacceptable.

5. Set forth the facts establishing the Protestant's standing to protest the Applications. 52 Pa. Code § 5.52(a)(3).

The main reason for my protest is that I do not want this project that will no benefit this area whatsoever to raise my power rates. As stated above, I live on a fixed income and any increase in my rates will have an effect on my finances. Also, there is no local need for this project. This will not benefit the residents of Greene county. Taking land from local landowners by eminent domain is wrong as well. This line will also affect the health of local residents in clos proximity to the line. Our local natural resources will also be affected. This line promises to significantly degrade the local landscape and will make areas of natural beauty into places that are ruined with power lines and towers. The effect on the local power grid cannot be overstated as well. This would be less of a problem if we had a surplus of energy, but we do not. Pushing our power to another state to feed their needs due to data centers is wrong and irresponsible.




