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

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**PREHEARING CONFERENCE MEMORANDUM  
OF NEXTERA ENERGY TRANSMISSION MIDATLANTIC, INC.**

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**TO ADMINISTRATIVE LAW JUDGE JOHN M. COOGAN AND ERIN L. GANNON:**

Pursuant to the Prehearing Conference Order of Administrative Law Judges John M. Coogan and Erin L. Gannon (the “ALJs”), dated March 10, 2026, and 52 Pa. Code §§ 5.221-5.224, NextEra Energy Transmission MidAtlantic, Inc. (“NEET MA” or the “Company”) hereby submits its Prehearing Conference Memorandum.

**I. SERVICE ON NEET MA**

1. NEET MA will be represented in this case by the counsel named below. Copies of all documents should be served on MAIT as follows:

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Please be advised that Mr. Garrett P. Lent will speak as the lead attorney for NEET MA for purposes of the prehearing conference. However, other counsel for NEET MA will be participating and available during the telephonic prehearing conference as needed. Appropriate motions for admission *pro hac vice* on behalf of Attorneys Davis and Galanis will be submitted in the near future.

## **II. BACKGROUND**

### **A. CPC APPLICATION**

2. On April 6, 2026, NEET MA filed, pursuant to the Pennsylvania Public Utility Code at 66 Pa.C.S. §§ 1101, 1103, and 2102, an application requesting all necessary authority, approvals, and certificates of public convenience from the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (“Commission”) necessary to authorize NEET MA to begin to furnish and supply electric transmission service as a Pennsylvania public utility within Greene County and Fayette County, Pennsylvania (“CPC Application”).

3. PJM Interconnection, L.L.C. (“PJM”) identified a need to address significant and widespread reliability criteria violations on the Bulk Electric System (“BES”) serving the PJM Region, including Pennsylvania, due to anticipated load growth and resource retirements. To address these projected violations, PJM approved multiple transmission projects and enhancements, including the MidAtlantic Resiliency Link Project (“MARL Project”). NEET MA is obligated to construct the Pennsylvania Portions of the MARL Project and, as such, is seeking Commission approval to begin to furnish and supply electric transmission service to or for the public through the new 500 kV transmission line that is the subject of the MARL Project.

4. On March 26, 2026, the ALJ issued a Prehearing Conference Order providing, among other things, that a Telephonic Prehearing Conference would be held on Wednesday, May 6, 2026 at 10:00 AM. The Prehearing Conference Order further indicated that, due to anticipated overlap in issues and in parties, the Prehearing Conference is being held contemporaneously with the May 6, 2026 Prehearing Conference scheduled for the Application of NextEra Energy Transmission MidAtlantic, Inc., Filed Pursuant to 52 Pa. Code Chapter 5 Subchapter G, for

Approval to Site and Construct a 500 kV Transmission Line Associated with the MidAtlantic Resiliency Link Project Located in Portions of Greene County and Fayette County, Pennsylvania.

5. The Prehearing Conference Order also provided that formal protests and petitions to intervene must be filed in accordance with 52 Pa. Code (relating to public utilities) on or before May 1, 2026.

6. Notice of the above-captioned CPC Application was published in the March 21, 2026 edition of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

7. On April 23, 2026, the County of Fayette filed a Protest to the CPC Application.

8. On April 24, 2026, Thomas John Bozek III filed a Protest and Petition to Intervene in the CPC Application proceeding.

9. On April 28, 2026, the Protests of Keryn Newman, Patrice Nitterhouse, and Dale Bushey were posted to the docket in the CPC Application proceeding. Also on April 28, 2026, Joseph Pennington filed a Petition to Intervene, and a Notice of Appearance was filed on behalf of James E. Rockis, Quarter Pine Tree Farm Christmas Shoppe, LLC, and J.E. Rockis Rental & Supply, Inc.

10. On April 29, 2026, the Comment/Protest of Tylee Ulmer and the Protest of Debra S. Kase were posted to the docket.

11. On April 30, 2026, the Protests of William K. Nitterhouse, Kelly L. Glisan, Karen Nitterhouse Diller, Kelly Holt Tanner, Kristle Krichbaum, Anthony D. Campbell, Raymond Waddell II & Samantha Wright, Patti Hankins, Julia Klein, Andrew Klein, Bradley L. Dennis, Betsy King, Tina & Matt Nicholson, and Deborah J. Campbell, were posted to the docket. In addition, the Comment/Protests of Lori Rice, Dream Farms, Coalition to Protect Franklin County,

Leah Nitterhouse, Brittany Huntoon, Penny M. Harmon, Sophia Sheeringer, Zachary Berkstresser, and Melody F. Shuman were posted to the docket.

12. Also on April 30, 2026, the Petition to Intervene of James E. Rockis, Quarter Pine Tree Farm Christmas Shoppe, LLC, and J.E. Rockis Rental & Supply, Inc. was filed.

13. Finally, on April 30, 2026, a Judge Addition Notice was issued, informing the parties that ALJ Erin L. Gannon has been added as a Presiding Officer in the proceeding.

14. On May 1, 2026, the Protests of Janet Pennington, April Dennis, Judith L. Sanders, Faye & Leroy Glisan, Todd Fedak, and Kristyn Benedict Martin were posted to the docket. In addition, the Comment/Protests of Joseph F. Long, Christine Elmer, Lantz. W. Sourbier, and David & Kimi Siergrist were posted to the docket.

15. Also on May 1, 2026, the Protest and Petition to Intervene of Charity Grimm Krupa and the Petition to Intervene of Harold Harrison were filed.

16. In addition, the Company was served with the Petitions to Intervene of the Elizabeth G. Arthur 2012 Irrevocable Trust, the Center for Coalfield Justice, and Donna Hopkins-Harrison on May 1, 2026, although the Petitions do not appear to have been posted to the docket for this proceeding as of the time of this submission.

17. On May 1, 2026, the Company was served with the Protest and Public Statement of the Office of Consumer Advocate (“OCA”), although they do not appear to have been posted to the docket for this proceeding as of the time of this submission.

18. Also on May 1, 2026, OCA filed a Petition for Interlocutory Review and Answer to Material Question.<sup>1</sup>

19. On May 2, 2026, the Company was served with the Protest and Petition to Intervene of Satel Green, LLC. The Protest and Petition do not appear to have been posted to the docket for this proceeding as of the time of this submission.

20. On May 4, 2026, OCA filed a Corrected Petition for Interlocutory Review and Answer to Material Question.

21. Also on May 4, 2026, the Protest of Stephanie Lynne McCandless was posted to the docket.

22. The Company was served only with the Protests and/or Petitions to Intervene of Fayette County, Raymond Waddell II & Samantha Wright, OCA, Satel Green, LLC, James E. Rockis, Quarter Pine Tree Farm Christmas Shoppe, LLC, & J.E. Rockis Rental & Supply, Inc., and Harold Harrison.

23. Raymond Waddell II & Samantha Wright, the Elizabeth G. Arthur 2012 Irrevocable Trust, and Fayette County are landowners located within the Proposed Route of the MARL Project. No other entities who filed a Protest or Petition to Intervene appear to be landowners within the Proposed Route of the MARL Project.

## **B. SITING APPLICATION**

24. Contemporaneously with the CPC Application, NEET MA filed, pursuant to 52 Pa. Code § 57.72, an application requesting Commission approval of the siting and construction of the Pennsylvania Portion of a new 500 kV transmission line associated with the MARL Project in Dunkard Township in Greene County and Springhill Township in Fayette County, Pennsylvania (the “Siting Application”).

25. As stated in Paragraph 3, *supra*, the MARL Project is being constructed as one of a set of transmission projects and enhancements selected by PJM, which are needed to address

significant and widespread reliability criteria violations within the PJM Region, which includes Pennsylvania.

26. On March 10, 2026, the ALJ issued a Prehearing Conference Order providing, among other things, that a Telephonic Prehearing Conference would be held on Wednesday, May 6, 2026 at 10:00 AM. Similar to the Prehearing Conference Order issued for the CPC Application, the Prehearing Conference Order also provided that formal protests and petitions to intervene related to the Siting Application must be filed in accordance with 52 Pa. Code (relating to public utilities) on or before May 1, 2026.

27. Notice of the above-captioned application was published in the March 21, 2026 edition of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

28. On March 18, 2026, a Protest to the Siting Application was filed by Sara Evans.

29. On March 20, 2026, three more Protests to the Siting Application were filed, by Robert Hetrick, Goldie Keys, and David J. Browne.

30. On April 23, 2026, the County of Fayette and Kelsey Greathouse filed a Protest to the Siting Application.

31. On April 24, 2026, Thomas John Bozek III filed a Protest and Petition to Intervene in the Siting Application proceeding.

32. On April 28, 2026, the Protests of Keryn Newman and Dale Bushey were posted to the docket. Also on April 28, 2026, Joseph Pennington filed a Petition to Intervene, and a Notice of Appearance was filed on behalf of James E. Rockis, Quarter Pine Tree Farm Christmas Shoppe, LLC, and J.E. Rockis Rental & Supply, Inc.

33. On April 29, 2026, the Protests of Andrea Funyak and Debra S. Kase, and the Comment/Protest of Tylee Ulmer were posted to the docket.

34. On April 30, 2026, the Protests of William K. Nitterhouse, Kelly L. Glisan, Leah Nitterhouse, Karen Nitterhouse Diller, Kristle Krichbaum, Kelly Holt Tanner, Anthony D. Campbell, Raymond Waddell II and Samantha Wright, Patti Hankins, Julia Klein, Andrew Klein, Bradley L. Dennis, Betsy King, Tina & Matt Nicholson, and Deborah J. Campbell were posted to the docket. Additionally, the Comment/Protests of Tylee Ulmer, Lori Rice, Dream Farms, Coalition to Protect Franklin County, Brittany Huntoon, Penny M. Harmon, Sophia Sheeringer, Zachary Berkstresser, and Melody F. Shuman were posted to the docket.

35. Also on April 30, 2026, the Petition to Intervene of James E. Rockis, Quarter Pine Tree Farm Christmas Shoppe, LLC, and J.E. Rockis Rental & Supply, Inc. was filed.

36. Finally, on April 30, 2026, a Judge Addition Notice was issued, informing the parties that ALJ Erin L. Gannon has been added as a Presiding Officer in the proceeding.

37. On May 1, 2026, the Protests of Janet Pennington, April Dennis, Faye and Leroy Glisan, Todd Fedak, and Kristyn Benedict Martin were posted to the docket. Additionally, the Comment/Protests of Joseph F. Long, Chrisine Elmer, Lantz W. Sourbier, and David & Kimi Siergrist were posted to the docket.

38. Also on May 1, 2026, the Protest and Petition to Intervene of Charity Grimm Krupa and the Petition to Intervene of Harold Harrison were filed.

39. In addition, the Company was served with the Petitions to Intervene of the Elizabeth G. Arthur 2012 Irrevocable Trust, the Center for Coalfield Justice, and Donna Hopkins-Harrison on May 1, 2026, although the Petitions do not appear to have been posted to the docket for this proceeding as of the time of this submission.

40. On May 1, 2026, the Company was served with the Protest and Public Statement of the OCA, although they do not appear to have been posted to the docket for this proceeding as

of the time of this submission. Also on May 1, 2026, OCA filed a Petition for Interlocutory Review and Answer to Material Question.<sup>2</sup>

41. On May 2, 2026, the Company was served with the Protest and Petition to Intervene of Satel Green, LLC. The Protest and Petition do not appear to have been posted to the docket for this proceeding as of the time of this submission.

42. On May 4, 2026, OCA filed a Corrected Petition for Interlocutory Review and Answer to Material Question.

43. Also on May 4, 2026, the Protest of Stephanie Lynne McCandless was posted to the docket.

44. The Company was served only with the Protests and/or Petitions to Intervene of Fayette County, Raymond Waddell II & Samantha Wright, OCA, Satel Green, LLC, James E. Rockis, Quarter Pine Tree Farm Christmas Shoppe, LLC, & J.E. Rockis Rental & Supply, Inc., and Harold Harrison.

45. Raymond Waddell II & Samantha Wright, the Elizabeth G. Arthur 2012 Irrevocable Trust, and Fayette County are landowners located within the Proposed Route of the MARL Project. No other entities who filed a Protest or Petition to Intervene appear to be landowners within the Proposed Route of the MARL Project.

### **III. ISSUES**

#### **A. CPC APPLICATION**

46. NEET MA intends to demonstrate that there is a public need for the service to be provided through the MARL Project in that it is necessary or proper for the service,

accommodation, convenience, or safety of the public, and that NEET MA is technically, financially, and legally fit to provide electric transmission service in Greene County and Fayette County, Pennsylvania.

47. More specifically, NEET MA intends to demonstrate that the service to be provided through the MARL Project, interconnected with the interstate electric grid serving more than 67 million customers in the PJM Region, including Pennsylvania, is one of several solutions necessary to maintain the reliability of the transmission grid and to prevent thermal overload violations and voltage collapse violations which could impact reliability in Pennsylvania and in the greater PJM Region.

48. Further NEET MA intends to demonstrate its fitness to provide electric transmission service. NEET MA has the requisite technical, financial, and legal fitness. It has existing managerial and technical experience, operates under a support services model, and is able to draw on the significant resources, experience, and project management practices of its parent companies, NextEra Energy Transmission, LLC and NextEra Energy, Inc.

49. Finally, NEET MA intends to demonstrate that the services to be provided through the Affiliated Interest Agreements with its affiliated operating and holding companies, as well as with NextEra Energy Transmission Virginia, Inc., which are the subjects of Docket Nos. G-2026-3060941 and G-2026-3060942, are necessary and proper for NEET MA to successfully construct, own, operate, and maintain the Pennsylvania Portion of the MARL Project.

50. NEET MA reserves the right to raise and respond to additional issues related to the CPC Application if and as those issues should arise.

## **B. SITING APPLICATION**

51. NEET MA intends to demonstrate that the above-captioned Project satisfies the criteria applicable to the Commission’s approval of high-voltage electric transmission lines at 52 Pa. Code § 57.72 *et seq.* and its Interim Guidelines for the Filing of Electric Transmission Line Siting Applications at 52 Pa. Code § 69.3101 *et seq.* NEET MA further submits that it has satisfied these requirements based upon the information included in its initial filing, which includes its written direct testimony and exhibits.

52. More specifically NEET MA intends to demonstrate that there is a need for the MARL Project in that it is necessary to address projected widespread system conditions including thermal overloads and voltage violations leading to blackouts in the greater PJM Region. 52 Pa. Code § 57.76(a)(1).<sup>3</sup>

53. NEET MA also intends to demonstrate that the MARL Project will not create an unreasonable risk of danger to the health and safety of the public in that its design will meet or exceed National Electric Safety Code (“NESC”) requirements, as well as other applicable local and state codes and other standards as described in the Siting Application and in NEED MA Statement No. 6. 52 Pa. Code § 57.76(a)(2).

54. Further, NEET MA will demonstrate that the MARL Project is in compliance with the applicable statues and regulations providing for the protection of the natural resources within the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. 52 Pa. Code § 57.76(a)(3).

55. Finally, NEET MA will demonstrate that the MARL Project will have minimum adverse environmental impact when compared to available alternatives, consistent with 52 Pa. Code § 57.76(a)(4).

56. NEET MA reserves the right to raise and respond to additional issues related to the Siting Application if and as those issues should arise.

### **C. CONSOLIDATION OF THE PROCEEDINGS**

57. NEET MA submitted its CPC Application and Siting Application contemporaneously. The utility service to be provided by NEET MA as a Pennsylvania public utility is related to the service that will be provided through the MARL Project itself. Moreover, the public need for the service NEET MA seeks to provide is directly related to the need for the MARL Project itself.<sup>4</sup>

58. Thus, because the facts, evidence, and approvals required in the CPC Application are interrelated with the issues and evidence to be presented and addressed for the Siting Application, NEET MA has requested, pursuant to 52 Pa. Code § 57.75(i)(1), that both of the above-captioned Applications and associated proceedings be consolidated and considered simultaneously for purposes of hearings and decisions.

## **IV. WITNESSES**
