**COMPLAINT**

The Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (“Commission” or “PUC”) is a duly constituted agency of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania empowered to regulate public utilities within the Commonwealth. The Commission has delegated its authority to initiate proceedings which are prosecutory in nature to the Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement and other bureaus with enforcement responsibilities. Pursuant to that delegated authority and Section 701 of the Public Utility Code, the Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement – Motor Carrier Division hereby represents as follows:

1. That Rasier – PA LLC t/a UBER, Respondent, maintains its principal place of business at Uber 3 World Trade Center, 175 Greenwich Street, Floors 43-47, New York, New York 10007.

2. That Respondent was issued a license by this Commission on January 26, 2017, at Application Docket No. A-2016-2580821, PUC Utility Code 6416478, authorizing transportation of persons for compensation within Pennsylvania in Transportation Network Company (“TNC”) service.

3. That Respondent, on March 26, 2026, permitted a certain 2012 Toyota passenger vehicle bearing PA registration number HYV4606 and having vehicle identification number ending in the last 4 digits 0879 to be operated by driver Mohamed Abdeltawab A Abdelmoula.

4. That the vehicle described in numbered paragraph 3 above, was inspected on that date by PUC Motor Carrier Enforcement Officer Mia Fuller on Airport Boulevard, Findlay Township, Allegheny County. Officer Fuller determined that at the time of the inspection commenced at 12:45 p.m. and concluded at 1:10 p.m., the vehicle in question failed to possess a valid Pennsylvania certificate of inspection, as the sticker had expired in January 2025.

5. That Respondent, by allowing a vehicle to be operated without a valid Pennsylvania certificate of inspection the vehicle, violated 66 Pa.C.S. §2606(c); 75 Pa.C.S. §4703(a). The penalty for this violation is \$250.

**WHEREFORE**, the Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement hereby requests that the Commission impose a civil penalty of two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00) upon Rasier - PA LLC t/a UBER for the violations described in this Complaint and order such other remedy as the Commission may deem to be appropriate. If payment of the civil penalty is not made, the Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement requests that the Bureau of Administration, Financial & Assessments Office, be directed to refer the matter to the Pennsylvania Office of Attorney General for collection of the civil penalty.
