**INTERIM ORDER #2**

This Order directs Zimoras 1 Stop Beauty Bar LLC to have an attorney enter his or her appearance on its behalf **on or before June 5, 2026**.

*Procedural History*

On January 28, 2026, Zimoras 1 Stop Beauty Bar LLC (“Complainant”) filed a Formal Complaint with the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (“Commission”) against PECO Energy Company (“Respondent”). Complainant requested a payment arrangement, that PECO be prohibited from terminating its service during the pendency of the Complaint proceeding, and that the Commission investigate high or incorrect bills and recalculate Complainant’s correct balance. In paragraph 10 of the Complaint form titled “legal representation”, no attorney is listed.

On February 28, 2026, Respondent filed an Answer with New Matter to the Complaint. In its New Matter, Respondent asserted that Complainant is a corporation and is required to be represented by an attorney in Commission proceedings.

On March 20, 2026, this case was scheduled for an evidentiary hearing on May 19, 2026, and was assigned to me.

On March 24, 2026, PECO filed a Motion to Dismiss. PECO argued that corporations like Complainant must be represented by counsel in Commission proceedings. PECO requested that the Commission issue an order directing Complainant to have an attorney enter their appearance on its behalf within 10 days of the order and for the Commission to dismiss the Complaint if Complainant fails to comply with the order.

On April 14, 2026, the Commission issued my Order which directed Complainant to have an attorney enter his or her appearance on its behalf on or before May 7, 2026.

On May 1, 2026, Complainant via email asked for a continuance, or extension, of the May 7, 2026, deadline for which it was to have an attorney enter their appearance on its behalf. Complainant asserted that it has been actively seeking legal counsel but the attorneys that the attorneys it has been in contact with indicated that they will not be able to assist with the case until May 10, 2026.

On May 5, 2026, Respondent objected to Complainant's continuance request, asserting that: (1) Complainant has known since the Answer and New Matter were filed in February that an attorney was required to represent it, (2) the service is commercial so the request for a Commission payment arrangement cannot be granted, and (3) the account balance as of the date of the email is \$38,759.26.

The Commission's regulations provide that extensions of time to perform an act may be extended upon good cause shown. 52 Pa. Code § 1.15(a)(1). Complainant expressed that it is currently in the process of obtaining attorney representation but needs additional time to secure said representation. Therefore, I find that good cause exists to extend the May 7, 2026, attorney representation deadline. Complainant will now have until June 5, 2026, to obtain attorney representation in this matter. As the hearing for this case is currently scheduled for May 19, 2026, the hearing will be continued until a date after June 5, 2026. If Complainant fails to have an attorney enter their appearance by the deadline, the rescheduled hearing will be cancelled.
