Pennsylvania-American Water Company 2025 Wastewater Annual Asset Optimization Plan
at Docket No. M-2026-3060810

P-1. Pennsylvania-American Water – Wastewater Division’s (PAWC-WD’s) Annual Asset Optimization Plan (AAOP) projected DSIC-eligible spending of \$30.23 million for 2026, as compared to its Long-Term Infrastructure Improvement Plan (LTIIIP) projection of \$65.54 million, which is an approximate 54% decrease in funding. PAWC-WD stated that the lower projected expenditures on wastewater replacement and rehabilitation projects were due to the projected expenditures needed on regulatory-driven projects. Please explain and provide specific details on the “regulatory-driven projects” that caused the projected decrease in spending for 2026.

Response: The regulatory-driven projects referenced are non-DSIC-eligible projects that need to be completed by specific deadlines in order to comply with requirements imposed by the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (PA DEP) through Consent Orders and Agreements (COA), Corrective Action Plans (CAP), or Act 537 Plan approval, or by EPA via Administrative Orders for Compliance on Consent (AOCC) or Consent decrees. Please refer to **TUS-P-1-Attachment 1** for a detailed list of regulatory-driven projects scheduled in 2026, which collectively account for projected expenditures totaling \$54.97 million. To fund these regulatory-driven projects while maintaining customer affordability, PAWC forecasted reduced DSIC-eligible spending of \$30.23 million for 2026, as opposed to the LTIIIP Projection of \$65.54 million.
