Code Section 57.76(a)] MARL request to become a P2 Public Utility is based on their use of 15 miles of Transmission lines in the state of Pennsylvania. States of West Virginia, Maryland and Virginia are fighting them on much larger mileage in their states. Why would Pennsylvania allow this. Mineral Rites could be at stake here also. This area is probably the center for Marcellus Shell Natural Gas in Pennsylvania. Can they infringe on these Rites? Our Property also has Coal, Timber and possibly Oil deposits.





