EnergySage has not been involved in any regulatory disciplinary action in the State or other jurisdiction.

Naman Trivedi, President of EnergySage is also affiliated with WattB, Inc. DBA WattBuy. WattBuy has had two instances in which its license was revoked in the past five years.

(1) WattB, Inc DBA WattBuy's Illinois broker license was revoked in April 2022 due to noncompliance with Company's Secretary of State filings. The license was re-awarded its license in March 2024 and has remained in compliance since.

(2) WattB, Inc DBA WattBuy's New York energy consultant license was revoked in October 2025 due to failing to file its annual fee. WattB, Inc DBA WattBuy is still considering whether it intends to participate in this market. If the company intends to participate in this market, it will seek to re-apply in New York.

WattB, Inc has successfully managed a majority of its licenses for a number of years. The Company engages with regulatory consulting firms to assist in maintaining its licenses and is dedicated to maintaining its licenses once approved.

An EGS will file an annual report reporting for customer groups defined by annual usage. Reports must be filed using the appropriate report form that may be obtained from the PUC's Secretary's Bureau or the forms officer, or may be down-loaded from the PUC's internet web site.
 - Reports of Gross Receipts: Applicant shall report its Pennsylvania intrastate gross receipts to the Commission on a quarterly and year to date basis no later than 30 days following the end of the quarter.
 - The Treasurer or other appropriate officer of Applicant shall transmit to the Department of Revenue by March 15, an annual report, and under oath or affirmation, of the amount of gross receipts received by Applicant during the prior calendar year.
 - Net Metering Reports: Applicant shall be responsible to report any Net Metering per the Standards on http://www.puc.pa.gov/consumer_info/electricity/alternative_energy.aspx. Scroll down to the Net Metering Standards Section.

- Applicant shall report to the Commission the percentages of total electricity supplied by each fuel source on an annual basis per 52 Pa. Code § 54.39(b)(4).
- Applicant will be required to meet periodic reporting requirements as may be issued by the Commission to fulfill the Commission's duty under Chapter 28 of the Public Utility Code, 66 Pa.C.S. Chapt. 28, pertaining to reliability and to inform the Governor and Legislature of the progress of the transition to a fully competitive electric market.

- d. **TRANSFER OF LICENSE:** The Applicant understands that if it plans to transfer its license to another entity, it is required to request authority from the Commission for permission prior to transferring the license. 

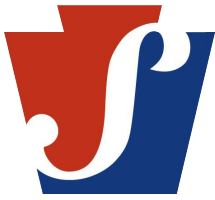
