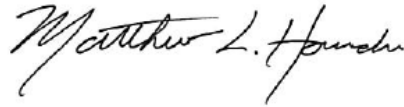

- M-1. Reference Hanover Municipal Waterwork's (Hanover's) Annual Asset Optimization Plan (AAOP).
- a. Hanover projected spending of \$1,938,980 for 2025 and had an actual spend of \$562,071, which is an approximate 70% reduction in spending. Hanover projected spending of \$693,000 for 2026 while its Long-Term Infrastructure Improvement Plan (LTIIIP) forecasted spending of \$1.99 million. This is an approximate 65% decrease in proposed spending. Hanover appears to be approximately \$6.5 million below its overall projected LTIIIP expenditures based on actual amounts reported from the years 2023 through 2025, and the forecast expenditures for 2026. Please state how Hanover will address the shortfall in spending in the last two years of the LTIIIP.
