TUS Request No. 23:

Reference the Application, Paragraph 15. Please quantify any cost savings associated with moving FirstEnergy employees working primarily on transmission from their current work location to the new facility. If so, please explain whether those savings will be accounted for in ATSI's FERC tariff filing. Also, please explain whether there are any of the cost savings will be attributed to PA ratepayers in the same proportion as the costs of this new transaction.

RESPONSE:

As noted in ATSI's previous response to TUS Request No. 17, several options were considered to address the facility needs of the FE transmission business. The option to purchase and renovate NRHQ showed the lowest long-term cost investment. It is not possible at this time to quantify any cost savings. ATSI's actual costs will be reflected in its formula rate updates and therefore all else equal will reflect the savings of this facility purchase option. Therefore, the Pennsylvania ratepayer incurred costs related to facility requirements will result in proportionally lower long-term costs incurred by FE transmission-owning entities in Pennsylvania. This lower cost option will be realized and reflected in rates over time incurred/allocated to Pennsylvania ratepayers.

TUS Request No. 24:

Please explain whether an affiliated interest agreement exists for ATSI's current use of FirstEnergy's headquarters for ATSI's transmission employees and if so please explain whether the agreement will be modified.


RESPONSE:

ATSI's current use of FE's headquarters is governed by the Mutual Assistance Agreement ("MAA") approved by the Commission on March 14, 2024 under Docket Nos. A-2023-3040481, A-2023-3040482, A-2023-3040483, G-2023-3040484, G-2023-3040485, G-2023-3040486. The MAA will not need to be modified as a result of this Transaction.
