Dear Attorneys Schultz and Simon:


The purpose of this Secretarial Letter is to provide notice that the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (Commission) has not received an amended Lead Service Line Replacement Program, modified Long-Term Infrastructure Improvement Plan, and *pro forma* tariff supplement (Compliance Filing) from the City of Lancaster – Water Bureau (Lancaster). By the Commission’s Order entered December 18, 2025, at Docket No. P-2023-3041043 (December 2025 Order), the Commission approved the Amended Joint Petition for Settlement between Lancaster, the Commission’s Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement (BIE), the Office of Consumer Advocate, and the Office of Small Business Advocate. Additionally, pursuant to Ordering Paragraph 3 of the December 2025 Order, the Commission directed Lancaster to file an amended Lead Service Line Replacement Program (LSLR Program) with the Commission, consistent with the following:

“That within thirty (30) days of the entry date of the Commission’s Final Order in this matter, the City of Lancaster shall file an amended Lead Service Line Replacement Program, modified Long-Term Infrastructure Improvement Plan, and tariff supplement at Docket No. P-2023-3041043, that incorporates any modifications thereto consistent with these proceedings and findings herein with the Secretary’s Bureau, and serve a copy upon the Bureau of Technical Utility Services and all active parties in this proceeding..”

Accordingly, Lancaster’s amended LSLR Program was to be filed with the Commission by January 17, 2026. In March 2026, Commission staff from the Bureau of Technical Utility Services contacted Lancaster via telephone and, subsequently via email to determine the expected date for Lancaster to file its amended LSLR Program. The Commission is requesting that Lancaster commit the necessary resources to file with the Commission the required Compliance Filing at the above-referenced docket by June 12, 2026. If the Compliance Filing is not filed by that date, this matter may be referred to the BIE for review and such further action as may be deemed necessary.

If you are dissatisfied with the resolution of this matter, you may, as set forth in 52 Pa. Code § 5.44, file a petition for reconsideration from the actions of staff with the Commission within 20 days of the date this letter is served.
