

JOINT STIPULATION FOR ADMISSION OF EVIDENCE

TO ADMINISTRATIVE LAW JUDGES KATRINA L. DUNDERDALE AND ANN QUIMBY:

Peoples Natural Gas Company LLC (“Peoples” or the “Company”), the Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement (“I&E”) of the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (“Commission”), the Office of Consumer Advocate (“OCA”), and the Office of Small Business Advocate (“OSBA”), all parties in the above-captioned proceeding (hereinafter collectively referred to as the “Joint Petitioners” or “Parties”), hereby submit this Joint Stipulation for Admission of Evidence in the above-captioned proceeding (the “Evidence Stipulation”). In support of the Evidence Stipulation, the Joint Petitioners represent as follows:

1. On January 30, 2026, Peoples made its Purchased Gas Cost (“PGC”) 60-day pre-filing with the Commission in compliance with Section 1307(f) of the Public Utility Code, 66 Pa. C.S. § 1307(f), and the Commission’s regulations at 52 Pa. Code § 53.65.
2. On February 3, 2026, OCA filed a Formal Complaint and Public Statement
3. On February 6, 2026, OSBA filed a Notice of Appearance.

4. On March 2, 2026, Peoples submitted its 30-day PGC pre-filing with the Commission in compliance with Section 1307(f) of the Public Utility Code, 66 Pa.C.S. § 1307(f), and the Commission’s regulations at 52 Pa. Code §§ 53.64 and 53.65.

5. On March 5, 2026, OSBA filed a Complaint and Public Statement.

6. On March 9, 2026, I&E filed a Notice of Appearance.

7. On March 25, 2026, Peoples filed a Notice of Appearance.

8. On March 30, 2026, Administrative Law Judges Katrina L. Dunderdale and Ann Quimby (“the ALJs”) issued an Initial Telephonic Prehearing Conference Notice, setting the date and time for an initial prehearing conference in the above-captioned matter at 9:00 a.m. on Monday, April 13, 2026.

9. Also on March 30, 2026, the ALJs issued a Prehearing Conference Order, requiring Prehearing Memoranda to be submitted by all parties on or before 4:00 p.m. on Friday, April 10, 2026.

10. On April 1, 2026, Peoples filed a Pro Forma Tariff Supplement containing proposed changes to the Peoples Retail Tariff Gas – Pa. P.U.C. No. 48 and the Peoples Supplier Tariff No. S-4. The Tariff Supplement set forth the specific rates proposed by Peoples for recovery of purchased gas costs effective on October 1, 2026.

11. On April 10, 2026, Peoples, OCA, OSBA, and I&E filed their respective prehearing memoranda.

12. Also on April 10, 2026, Peoples filed a Motion for Protective Order pursuant to 52 Pa. Code §§ 5.362(a)(7) and 5.365(a).

13. On April 13, 2026, the ALJs conducted the prehearing conference. At the prehearing conference, the parties considered issues raised by the filings, discussed prehearing matters, and established a litigation schedule.

14. On April 14, 2026, the ALJs issued an In-Person Evidentiary Hearing Notice, setting the date for an in-person evidentiary hearing in the above-captioned matter at 9:00 a.m. on Monday, May 18, 2026.

15. Also on April 14, 2026, the ALJs issued a Prehearing Order, consolidating the Formal Complaints of OCA and OSBA with the above-captioned proceeding for the purposes of a hearing and Recommended Decision, adopting proposed discovery modifications, a litigation schedule, and addressing other matters raised during the prehearing conference.

16. On April 22, 2026, the ALJs issued a Protective Order, granting Peoples' Motion for Protective Order.

17. On April 24, 2026, OCA, OSBA, and I&E each filed a letter advising that they would not be filing direct testimony in the instant proceeding.

18. On May 6, 2026, Counsel for Peoples advised the ALJs that a Settlement in Principle had been agreed to or not opposed by all parties. Peoples' Counsel also informed the ALJs that they did not believe an evidentiary hearing would be necessary.

19. Also on May 6, 2026, the ALJs advised the parties that the Joint Settlement Petition is not due until the reply brief due date, but that a joint stipulation to admit evidence and to waive cross examination is due by May 15, 2026. The ALJs also advised that the evidentiary hearing would be cancelled upon receipt of the joint stipulations.

20. The Joint Petitioners agree to waive all cross examination in this proceeding. Further, the Joint Petitioners request that the ALJ admit the testimony and the exhibits listed below into the record in the above-captioned proceeding:

21. Peoples’ 30-day Prefiling, filed on March 2, 2026, containing the information submitted pursuant to 52 Pa. Code §§ 53.64(c) and 53.65 of the Commission’s regulations and 66 Pa. C.S. 1317(c) in support of 66 Pa. C.S. § 1307(f) Purchased Gas Costs for 2026, sponsored as reflected in **Appendices A-E**. II. Motion

23. The Joint Petitioners request that the above-identified testimony and exhibits be moved into the record without a hearing. All Parties have agreed to waive cross-examination in light of the settlement and the agreement to stipulate evidence into the record.

24. Consistent with the Protective Order that was filed in this proceeding, the Parties request that all filings, statements, and exhibits designated as “CONFIDENTIAL” or “HIGHLY CONFIDENTIAL” be placed in non-public folders by the Secretary’s Bureau of the Commission.

25. Verifications for Peoples’ Direct Testimony and Exhibits are attached hereto as **Appendices A-E**.

26. The admission by stipulation of the foregoing testimony and exhibits is subject to Commission approval of the Joint Petition For Settlement Of Section 1307(f) Rate Investigation that will be filed on or before June 12, 2026. The Joint Petitioners reserve their respective rights to submit additional testimony and to cross-examine witnesses in the event the Joint Petition For Settlement Of Section 1307(f) Rate Investigation is not approved or is otherwise approved with modification causing a Party(ies) to withdraw from the Joint Petition For Settlement Of Section 1307(f) Rate Investigation and proceed to litigation.

WHEREFORE, the Joint Petitioners, by their respective counsel, respectfully request that Administrative Law Judges Katrina L. Dunderdale and Ann Quimby admit the foregoing testimony and exhibits into the record in this proceeding.
