**PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION FROM STAFF ACTION**

TO THE HONORABLE PENNSYLVANIA PUBLIC UTILITY COMMISSION:

Prime Passenger Transport LLC (“Petitioner” or the “Company”), by its member Reginald Jones, pursuant to 52 Pa. Code §§ 1.31 and 5.44 and Section 703(g) of the Public Utility Code, 66 Pa.C.S. § 703(g), respectfully petitions the Commission to reconsider and rescind the Staff Action dated May 6, 2026 that denied and dismissed the Company’s application at the above-captioned docket, and to approve the application or remand it for further review. The corrected and supplemental information set forth below cures each deficiency identified in the Staff Action. In support, Petitioner avers as follows:

**I. BACKGROUND**

1. On April 6, 2026, Petitioner filed an application for paratransit authority with the Commission, docketed at A-2026-3061533.
2. On April 14, 2026, the Commission’s Bureau of Technical Utility Services issued a data request directing Petitioner to clarify and supplement certain answers to its verified statements and to provide a current statement of financial position.
3. On or about April 24, 2026, Petitioner submitted a written response to the data request, together with supporting materials.
4. By letter dated May 6, 2026 (the “Staff Action”), the Bureau denied and dismissed the application, finding that Petitioner had not established the technical fitness required under 52 Pa. Code § 41.14(b) or the financial fitness required under 52 Pa. Code § 41.14.
5. This Petition is timely filed within twenty (20) days of the date of the Staff Action, in accordance with the appeal instructions in the Staff Action and 52 Pa. Code §§ 1.31 and 5.44.

**II. STANDARD FOR RECONSIDERATION**

6. Under Section 703(g) of the Code, a petition for reconsideration may raise any matter intended to persuade the Commission to exercise its discretion to rescind or amend a prior determination, in whole or in part. *Duick v. Pennsylvania Gas and Water Co.*, 56 Pa. PUC


553, 559 (1982). Reconsideration is properly granted where a petitioner presents new or novel arguments not previously considered, newly available evidence, an error of law, or a change in circumstances, or raises considerations that appear to have been overlooked. Petitioner now supplies corrected and supplemental information addressing each ground for the Staff Action.

**IV. RELIEF REQUESTED**

**WHEREFORE**, Prime Passenger Transport LLC respectfully requests that the Commission:

- (a) grant this Petition for Reconsideration;
- (b) rescind the May 6, 2026 Staff Action denying and dismissing the application at Docket No. A-2026-3061533;
- (c) approve the application and issue a Certificate of Public Convenience, or, in the alternative, remand the application to the Bureau of Technical Utility Services for further review in light of the supplemental information provided herein; and
- (d) grant such other relief as the Commission deems just and proper.


