**Re: Annual Asset Optimization Plan for Pike County Light & Power Company  
at Docket No. M-2026-3060746**

Dear Attorney Snyder:

On February 26, 2026, Pike County Light & Power Company (PCLP) filed its Annual Asset Optimization Plan (AAOP) for its electric operations, pursuant to 52 Pa. Code § 121.6. On April 1, 2026, via Secretarial Letter, the Commission extended the consideration period of PCLP's AAOP to June 1, 2026.

By Order entered May 21, 2026, at Docket No. M-2024-3050192 (LTIIIP Order), the Commission determined that PCLP's Long-Term Infrastructure Improvement Plan (LTIIIP) was not adequately designed to ensure and maintain safe, adequate, reasonable, and reliable service and that PCLP had not substantially adhered to its plan. The LTIIIP Order directed PCLP to file a modified or new LTIIIP addressing the issues noted in the body of the LTIIIP Order or to withdraw its LTIIIP.<sup>1</sup>


Consistent with the findings in the LTIIIP Order, we have determined that PCLP's AAOP is not in substantial compliance with the repairs, improvements, or replacements of the specific eligible property in its approved LTIIIP, for the corresponding 12-month timeframe, and shall be rejected. Specifically, the AAOP noted that PCLP expended approximately \$3.5 million in 2025 as compared to the LTIIIP forecast of \$875,000 and the AAOP described several projects completed in 2025 that were not detailed in the LTIIIP. Pursuant to 52 Pa. Code § 121.6(f), PCLP shall comply with the directives in the LTIIIP Order to remedy the deficiencies noted in the AAOP.

If you are dissatisfied with the resolution of this matter, you may, as set forth in 52 Pa. Code § 5.44, file a petition with the Commission within twenty (20) days after the date of this letter.
