ORDER
HOLDING PROCEEDINGS IN ABEYANCE

On February 19, 2026, the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission’s Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement (“I&E”) filed a Formal Complaint against Aero Medical Transportation LLC (“Respondent”). I&E alleged that Respondent failed to pay its assessments for the 2023-2024, 2024-2025, and 2025-2026 Fiscal Years, totaling \$1,442. Further, I&E alleged that Respondent failed to submit an assessment report to the Commission for the 2023 calendar year. For relief, I&E requested: (1) that Respondent be ordered to pay a total of \$2,806 to the Commission, consisting of its outstanding assessment balance and a civil penalty for the cited violations, (2) that Respondent be directed to file assessment reports on a going-forward basis, and (3) that the Commission take certain other actions if payment of the \$2,806 is not made.

The Complaint was served on Respondent on February 20, 2026, by eService. The Complaint was re-served to Respondent on March 4, 2026, by first-class mail and by certified mail.

The Commission’s regulations provide that answers to complaints shall be filed with the Commission within 20 days after the date of service. 52 Pa. Code § 5.61(a). Respondent did not file an Answer to the Complaint by March 24, 2026.

On April 7, 2026, I&E filed a Motion for Default Judgment (“Motion”) against Respondent. I&E requested that the Commission enter a Default Order against Respondent and sustain its Complaint based on Respondent’s failure to file a timely Answer to the Complaint.

I&E’s Motion contained a Notice to Plead, notifying the Respondent that it had 20 days from the date of service of the Motion to file a response. Respondent did not file a response to the Motion.

On May 20, 2026, the Commission issued a Motion Judge Assignment Notice, assigning me as Presiding Officer over this proceeding.

On May 26, 2026, the Commission received payment from Respondent in the amount of the outstanding assessment balance.

On June 8, 2026, I was informed by the parties that a settlement in principle had been reached. Respondent is to satisfy the terms of the settlement by July 8, 2026. As the parties have reached a settlement in principle, a ruling on the Motion is not necessary at this time. This proceeding will therefore be held in abeyance in the Ordering paragraphs below.

ORDER

THEREFORE,

IT IS ORDERED:

1. That this matter is held in abeyance.

2. That Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission's Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement shall inform the undersigned of the status of this proceeding on or before July 9, 2026.
