

In response to the Commission's request, I have included the following explanations.

a. i

A map has been provided that designates the roads to be used in this service.

a. ii.

The primary audience will be patrons of the Pittsburgh Steelers, Pirates, and Pitt Panthers who commute from the Rivers Casino to Acrisure Stadium and PNC Park on the Pittsburgh Northshore.

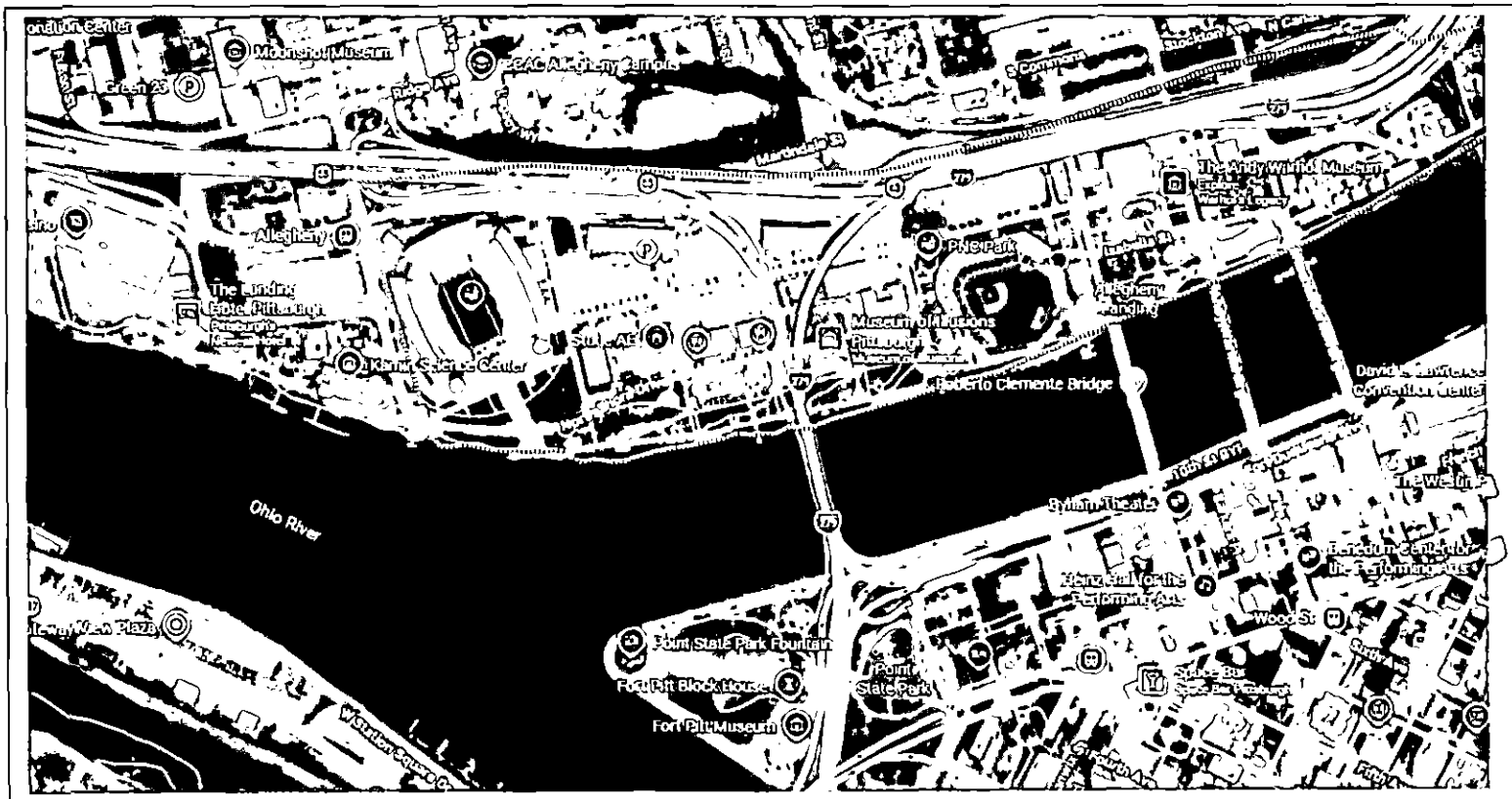
The main roads to be used are Northshore Drive, Mazeroski Way, Reedsdale Avenue, General Robinson Street, and Casino Way. These are highlighted in PINK.

Transportation to downtown locations would be a secondary audience, as some patrons will likely be from out of town, staying in hotels. Roads such as the 6th, 7th, and 9th Street Bridges, along with Forbes Avenue, Liberty Avenue, Wood Street, and Fort Duquesne Boulevard, would likely be utilized.

All these streets have a speed limit of no more than 25MPH, a requirement for street-legal NEVs. These streets are highlighted in blue.

a. iii.

The vehicles to be used are street-legal "golf carts," legally classified as NEVs under HB 573, Act of October 22, 2014, P.L. 2543, No. 154 Cl. 75 – Vehicle Code (75 PA C.S.) – Neighborhood Electric Vehicles. (Pictures included).

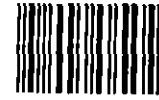
