On June 4, 2026, the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission approved the Joint Petition for Settlement filed by the majority of the Parties to the above-caption Base Rate Case of PPL Electric Utilities, Inc., as modified by the Motion of Commissioner Zerfuss. On June 11, 2026, the Commission published the Final Order in that same case. Both the Motion of Commissioner Zerfuss and the Commission's Order exempt operating agricultural, on site, anerobic digester-fueled electricity generation from the requirements proposed in the PPL filing regarding Maximum Registered Peak Load ("MRPL") which otherwise modifies the classification of customer generators.

The PDMP was a not a signatory of the Joint Petition for Non-Unanimous Settlement of All Issues but does not object to being excluded from the MRPL requirements contained therein, as set forth in the Commission's Order. PDMP thanks the Commission for its consideration of PDMP members' unique position.
