**INTERIM ORDER
SETTING ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS FOR BRIEFS AND SETTLEMENT**

This Order addresses various procedural matters regarding briefs and settlement.

THEREFORE,

IT IS ORDERED:

Due Dates

1. That, as addressed during the evidentiary hearing on June 15, 2026, the litigation schedule is amended as follows:

July 2, 2026	Submission of joint settlement petition executed by representatives of parties thereto, together with all signatory parties' statements in support of joint petition/settlement
July 10, 2026	Submission of proposed findings of fact, conclusions of law and ordering paragraphs in support of briefs and joint petition/settlement
July 10, 2026	Filing and service of main briefs
July 22, 2026	Filing and service of reply briefs

Briefs

2. That the parties must comply with 52 Pa. Code § 5.501, *et seq.*, regarding the preparation and filing of briefs. 52 Pa. Code § 5.501(e) requires that “[b]riefs shall be as concise as possible.”

3. **That all briefs, including headings, subheadings, etc., must be written pursuant to the outline submitted to the Presiding Officers on June 18, 2026.** Parties are not required to address all issues but should use headings and subheadings from the outline and follow the same sequence. Further, the parties are directed to use common abbreviations in their briefs. If a brief does not adhere to those requirements, the Presiding Officers will not read or consider any portion of that brief.

4. That service of briefs must be made electronically by no later than 4:30 p.m. on the due dates. Parties are directed to serve by email a copy of all as-filed briefs to the Presiding Officers in ADOBE or other compatible PDF format in addition to a WORD-formatted document.

5. That all briefs, regardless of length, must contain:

- A. Times New Roman, 13 pt font, 1.5 spaced in both the body and footnotes;
- B. Citations in footnotes at the bottom of the page, rather than embedded in the body of the brief;
- C. A table of contents;
- D. A history of the proceeding;
- E. A discussion of the issues in the order of the common outline;
- F. Proposed findings of fact (with record citations to transcript pages or exhibits where supporting evidence appears);

- G. Proposed conclusions of law (with citations to supporting statutes, regulations or relevant case law); and
- H. Proposed ordering paragraphs specifically identifying the relief sought.

6. That a party's failure to follow these instructions may result in the document not being considered by the presiding officer in adjudicating the matter.

Settlement

7. That the parties are directed to confer amongst themselves in an attempt to resolve all or some of the issues associated with this proceeding. The parties are reminded it is the Commission's policy to encourage settlements. 52 Pa. Code § 5.231(a). The parties are strongly urged to seriously explore this possibility. If a settlement is reached, a joint settlement petition executed by representatives of all parties to be bound thereby, along with proposed findings of fact, proposed conclusions of law, and proposed ordering paragraphs, together with statements in support of settlement by all signatory parties, must be filed with the Secretary for the Commission and served on the Presiding Officers.

8. That stipulated findings of fact must be sufficient to support a finding that the settlement is in the public interest.

9. That statements in support of settlement must make clear, detailed arguments with citations to the record, and must be written in Times New Roman, 13 pt font, 1.5 spaced, with citations in footnotes, not embedded in the body.

10. For settled issues, all statements in support should use headings and subheadings from the outline submitted on June 18, 2026, and follow the same sequence. Further, the parties are reminded of the directive in the Prehearing Order that they must use common abbreviations in their statements in support. If a statement in support does not adhere to those requirements, the Presiding Officers will not read or consider any portion of that statement in support.

11. That service of any settlement must be made electronically by no later than 4:30 p.m. on July 2, 2026. Parties are directed to serve by email a copy of the as-filed settlement to the Presiding Officers in ADOBE or other compatible PDF format in addition to a WORD-formatted document.

Modification

12. That any provision of this Order may be modified upon motion and good cause shown by any party in interest in accordance with 52 Pa. Code § 5.223(a).

Continued Compliance with the Prehearing Order

13. That the parties shall comply with all portions of the Prehearing Order issued on March 23, 2026 not inconsistent with the instant Order.
