PREHEARING CONFERENCE ORDER

A Prehearing Conference for the referenced matters is scheduled for: **Monday, July 13, 2026, at 1:00 p.m.** To participate you must call the following and follow the prompts:

You must call into the conference on the scheduled day and time. Failure of any party to attend the Prehearing Conference without good cause shall constitute a waiver of all objections to the agreements reached and matters decided at the Prehearing Conference.

The parties are directed to comply with the following requirements:

1. Each party must prepare and distribute a prehearing memorandum on or before **Thursday, July 9, 2026 at 4:30 p.m.** Prehearing memorandum shall set forth a brief history of the proceeding, the issues you intend to present, a list of your proposed witnesses and the subject of their testimony, a list of any exhibits or documents you intend to present at the hearing in this proceeding, the party's position¹ on public input hearings, and a proposed litigation schedule.

¹ Include proposed dates, times and locations, if applicable.

2. Parties are expected to confer and attempt to agree to a proposed litigation schedule in advance of the Prehearing Conference, with the deadline for filing and service of reply briefs or submission of joint settlement petition executed by representatives of parties thereto, together with all parties' statements in support of joint petition/settlement set as **Wednesday, November 18, 2026.**
3. Review the regulations pertaining to prehearing conferences, 52 Pa. Code §§ 5.221-5.224, particularly Section 5.222(d) which provides, in part:
 - (d) Parties and counsel will be expected to attend the conference fully prepared for a useful discussion of all problems involved in the proceeding, both procedural and substantive, and fully authorized to make commitments with respect thereto.
4. Review the regulations relating to discovery, specifically Section 5.331(b), which provides, *inter alia*, that "a party shall endeavor to initiate discovery as early in the proceedings as reasonably possible," and Section 5.322, which encourages parties to exchange information on an informal basis. 52 Pa. Code §§ 5.331(b), 5.322. All parties are urged to cooperate in discovery and advise the presiding officers at the Prehearing Conference of discovery problems which have not been resolved. There are limitations on discovery and sanctions for abuse of the discovery process. 52 Pa. Code §§ 5.361, 5.371-5.372.
5. If you are an individual, you may represent yourself, or you may be represented by an attorney licensed to practice law in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania or admitted pro hac vice. 52 Pa. Code §§ 1.21, 1.22. However, if you are a partnership, corporation, trust, association, or governmental agency or subdivision, you must be represented in this proceeding by an attorney licensed to practice law in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania or admitted pro hac vice. Unless you are an attorney, you may

not represent someone else. Attorneys shall enter her/his appearance in accordance with the provisions of Section 1.24(b), 52 Pa. Code § 1.24(b), before the Prehearing Conference.

6. Failure of a party to attend the prehearing conference, or notify the Presiding Officers of the desire to fully participate without good cause shown, shall constitute a waiver of all objections to the agreements reached and matters decided at the prehearing conference, including, but not limited to, any special discovery rules and the litigation schedule established for this case. 52 Pa. Code §§ 5.222(e), 5.224.
7. You must serve the presiding officers directly with a copy, via email to gchiodo@pa.gov and efarren@pa.gov, of any document that you file in this proceeding. For your convenience, a copy of the Commission's current service list of the parties to this proceeding is enclosed with this order.
8. All filings and pre-served testimony must be emailed to the Presiding Officers in PDF and native formats (Word and Excel, as applicable). No later than July 9, 2026, Pike County Light & Power Company is directed to email the Presiding Officers the Word and Excel version of its June 1, 2026 filing.
