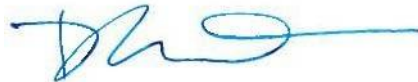

**MOTION IN LIMINE OF
VEOLIA WATER PENNSYLVANIA, INC.**

AND NOW COMES VEOLIA WATER PENNSYLVANIA, INC. (“VWPA” or the “Company”), pursuant to 52 Pa. Code §§ 5.103, 5.243, and 5.403, to file this Motion in Limine (“Motion”) to move for an Order limiting the scope of the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (“Commission”)-ordered public input hearings (“Public Input Hearings”) in the above-captioned proceeding to matters set forth in the allegations in the formal complaints (the “Complaints”) filed by the Office of Consumer Advocate (“OCA”) and the Office of Small Business Advocate (“OSBA”) in this matter. Absent such limitations, the Public Input Hearings risk becoming an improper vehicle to expand the scope of this proceeding beyond the legally cognizable claims at issue.

For the reasons set forth below, VWPA respectfully requests that the Honorable Administrative Law Judge Chad L. Allensworth (the “ALJ”) limit the scope of permissible testimony at the Public Input Hearings as follows:

I. INTRODUCTION AND SUMMARY OF ARGUMENT

1. In its Prehearing Conference Memorandum, the OCA requested Public Input Hearings in this matter. OCA Prehearing Conference Memorandum at p. 8-9.

2. The OSBA likewise requested Public Input Hearings in this matter. OSBA Prehearing Conference Memorandum at p. 4.

3. In its Prehearing Conference Memorandum, VWPA stated as follows:

With respect to the need for a public input hearing, VWPA has already hosted multiple open houses in the affected service territories, and intends to present evidence in this proceeding concerning the operational causes of discolored water events, system infrastructure and flushing protocols, timing and effectiveness of VWPA's response activity, the reasonableness of VWPA's crediting practices, and compliance with DEP directives and applicable water quality standards. Accordingly, VWPA is not requesting a public hearing for this matter, as VWPA believes that a public input hearing would not assist the Commission in resolving disputed facts or in applying the controlling legal standard of reasonable and adequate service.

VWPA Prehearing Conference Memorandum at p. 7.

4. During the Prehearing Conference, the parties argued their respective positions before the ALJ.

5. During the Prehearing Conference, VWPA argued several points and reiterated its position that Public Input Hearings were not warranted, including that it would be atypical to order Public Input Hearings in a complaint matter where the complainants have the burden of proof and that the Public Input Hearings would risk the expansion of issues beyond those that have been properly raised in the complaints. *See* Transcript of Prehearing Conference at p. 13-15, 19, 22. The ALJ ordered that Public Input Hearings be held.

6. After the Prehearing Conference, the ALJ provided additional time for the parties to confer concerning (1) a location for the two anticipated in-person Public Input Hearings, (2) the dates for the anticipated two in-person and two telephonic public input hearings, and (3) the possibility of combining the in-person and telephonic public input hearings. *See* Exhibit 1 (ALJ Email with the parties dated April 23, 2026).

7. The parties advised the ALJ that the OCA, OSBA, and VWPA had agreed that the Public Input Hearings would be held between July 28-30 with two in-person Public Input Hearings at the Susquehanna Township Building, 1900 Linglestown Road, Harrisburg, PA 17110, at 1 p.m. and 6 p.m. and that two telephonic hearings be held at 1 p.m. and 6 p.m. after the occurrence of the in-person Public Input Hearings. *See Exhibit 1.*

8. The parties requested additional time to meet and confer on the form of Notice for the Public Input Hearings. *See Exhibit 1.*

9. On June 23, 2026, the parties submitted the negotiated form of the Public Input Hearing Notice to the ALJ, which states:

The Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (“PUC”) will conduct four Public Input Hearings concerning the complaints filed by the Office of Consumer Advocate (“OCA”) and the Office of Small Business Advocate (“OSBA”) regarding the service quality provided by Veolia Water Pennsylvania, Inc. (“VWPA”) during the period between June 22, 2025 and September 30, 2025 in portions of Susquehanna Township, Lower Paxton Township, Swatara Township, and Marysville Borough. These hearings are intended to receive public comment regarding the adequacy, efficiency, safety and reasonableness of service and facilities provided during the above-referenced period in the identified locations, including:

1. service interruptions, water quality concerns, and operational responses;
2. Veolia’s customer service and communications; and
3. Veolia’s remedial actions.

The public input hearings are intended to address only those issues raised in the complaints.

See Exhibit 2 (ALJ Email with the parties dated April 23, 2026).

10. VWPA subsequently met with the OCA and the OSBA to discuss the Company’s request for appropriate scope limitations with respect to the Public Input Hearings, but the parties could not reach an agreement.

11. Counsel for VWPA consulted with counsel for OCA and OSBA concerning the basis for this Motion and advised the OCA and the OSBA that the instant motion was forthcoming.

II. ARGUMENT

A. Legal Standard for Motion in Limine

12. Under 52 Pa. Code § 5.403, ALJs are vested with the responsibility and authority to control the scope of the evidence admitted to the record and should eliminate proposed evidence and testimony that is either inadmissible or relate to matters that are outside the scope of matters raised in the pleadings:

- a. The presiding officer shall have all necessary authority to control the receipt of evidence, including the following:
 - 1) Ruling on the admissibility of evidence.
 - 2) Confining the evidence to the issues in the proceeding and impose, where appropriate:
 - i. Limitations on the number of witnesses to be heard.
 - ii. Limitations of time and scope for direct and cross examinations.
 - iii. Limitations on the production of further evidence.
 - iv. Other necessary limitations.
- b. The presiding officer will actively employ these powers *to direct and focus the proceedings* consistent with due process.

52 Pa. Code § 5.403 (emphasis added).

13. ALJs have utilized the authority granted by Section 5.403 to exclude evidence or testimony that is inadmissible, improper, or outside the scope of the issues in the proceeding. *See, e.g., Pa. Pub. Util. Comm'n v. PPL Electric Utilities Corporation*, Docket Nos. R-2015-2469275 *et al.*, at 7-10 (ALJ Colwell Sixth Prehearing Order issued July 14, 2015) (granting a motion in limine to exclude testimony on issues that were not properly within the scope of the proceeding); *Pa. Pub. Util. Comm'n v. Phila. Gas Works*, Docket No. M-00021612, 2002 WL 32063825 (Opinion and Order entered Dec. 19, 2002) (affirming ALJ's grant of motion in limine to strike witness statement and certain exhibits in their entirety); *Re Structural Separation of Bell Atlantic-*

Pennsylvania, Inc., Retail and Wholesale Operations, Docket No. M-00001353, 94 Pa. P.U.C. 461, 2000 WL 1687436, (Final Order entered September 28, 2000) (affirming the decision of the ALJ to exclude certain evidence as “beyond the scope of the proceeding”).

B. Evidence Beyond the Scope of the Complaints is Irrelevant and Immaterial

14. Pursuant to the Commission’s Regulations, evidence must be relevant and material and is subject to objection and exclusion by the ALJ if it is irrelevant, immaterial to the matters raised in the pleadings, or exceeds the scope of the proceeding. *See* 52 Pa. Code § 5.401.

15. The scope of the proceeding and the burdens of proof are appropriately established by the pleadings and must be based on the pleadings. Evidence outside those defined issues should be excluded because it is not relevant to the adjudication of the present matter and risks delaying proceedings and obscuring the record.

16. Issues not raised in the Complaints are beyond the scope of the proceeding. *See Sunoco Pipeline, L.P. v. Pub. Util. Comm’n*, 295 A.3d 37, 52-54 (Pa. Cmwlth. Ct. 2023) (reversing Commission order on violation of regulations because such issues exceeded the scope of the proceeding and were not raised in the applicable complaints).

17. Matters not properly plead are not within the scope of the proceeding and may be excluded or dismissed as legally insufficient. *See, e.g., Pa. Pub. Util. Comm’n v. Del. Valley Reg’l Econ. Dev. Fund*, No. 491 M.D. 2018, 2019 WL 2619952, at *5-6 (Pa. Cmwlth. June 27, 2019) (striking statute of limitations argument as insufficiently plead). Moreover, the Superior Court has explained that where there is “a variance between the pleadings contained in a plaintiff’s complaint and the theory that the party later attempts to prove at trial” the adjudicator may preclude “the new theory if it constitutes a new cause of action and is prejudicial to the defense.” *Taylor v. Just About Me Learning Acad., LLC*, 339 A.3d 393 (Table) (Pa. Super. Ct. 2025) (quoting *Reynolds v. Thomas*

Jefferson University Hospital, 676 A.2d 1205, 1210 (Pa. Super. Ct. 1996); *Rachlin v. Edmison*, 813 A.2d 862, 871-72 (Pa. Super. Ct. 2002). An ALJ has the ability to avoid such a variance by limiting the evidence introduced at hearings.

18. The Complaints in these proceedings concern discrete operational events and alleged service quality issues occurring within a defined timeframe and geographic scope. Admission of evidence beyond that scope would not assist the Commission in resolving the issues presented and would instead risk expanding the proceedings into generalized inquiries concerning unrelated matters.

19. While the Company expressly reserves its right to object to specific testimony at the Public Input Hearings, limiting the scope of admissible evidence in advance of the hearing is necessary and appropriate to ensure an orderly, efficient, and fair hearing process, consistent with Commission rules and practice.

C. The Formal Complaints are Limited as to Time and any Evidence Gathered at the Public Input Hearings Concerning Matters Outside of that Timeframe is Irrelevant and Beyond the Scope of the Proceeding

20. The OSBA Complaint refers to water discoloration and other issues affecting small businesses starting on June 22, 2025 and alleges that “[a]s of October 24, 2025, Veolia was still having water discoloration issues in the relevant territory.” OSBA Complaint at ¶ 16.

21. Accordingly, the scope of any testimony concerning the OSBA Complaint should be limited to between June 22, 2025 and October 24, 2025.

22. The OCA Complaint refers to quality of service and other issues experienced in the Summer and Fall of 2025. OCA Complaint at ¶ I, K, Q, R. The earliest date mentioned in the OCA Complaint is June 22, 2025. In the Public Statement of the Office of Consumer Advocate Pursuant to 71 P.S. Section 309-4(e) (“OCA Public Statement”), as attached to the Complaint, the

OCA stated that it “determined to file a Formal Complaint . . . involving the proposed quality of service provided by [the Company] to its customers during and following the service incident events of the Summer/Fall of 2025” and “that the water discoloration events persisted for customers through at least September 2025.” OCA Public Statement at p. 1.

23. Accordingly, the scope of any testimony concerning the OCA Complaint should be limited to between June 22, 2025 and the Fall of 2025. For purposes of this Motion, it is the Company’s position that the OCA’s end date of the Fall of 2025 should coincide with the OSBA’s final stated end date of October 24, 2025.

D. The Formal Complaints are Limited as to Scope and any Evidence Gathered at the Public Input Hearings Concerning Matters Outside that Scope is Irrelevant and Beyond the Scope of the Proceeding

24. The parties conferred on the form of Notice and agreed that the Public Input Hearings should concern: “service interruptions, water quality concerns, and operational responses; Veolia’s customer service and communications; and Veolia’s remedial actions. The public input hearings are intended to address only those issues raised in the complaints.” *See* Exhibit 2.

25. Accordingly, the following list of issues are plainly irrelevant to the current proceeding:

- a. service quality outside the affected service areas during any time period;
- b. service quality within the affected service areas but occurring outside of or not pertaining to the time period between June 22, 2025 and October 24, 2025;
- c. customer service concerns not pertaining to the time period between June 22, 2025 and October 24, 2025;

- d. remedial actions taken by the Company other than in response to service quality between June 22, 2025 and October 24, 2025;
- e. claims for monetary damages or reimbursement not pertaining to the time period between June 22, 2025 and October 24, 2025;
- f. general rate concerns or individual billing disputes not pertaining to the time period between June 22, 2025 and October 24, 2025; and
- g. matters currently pending in other proceedings before the Commission.

26. Public input hearings are not intended to be a fishing expedition to develop new claims or to voice concerns that extend beyond those raised in the pleadings. Rather, public input hearings are intended to inform the Commission and provide relevant, credible evidence regarding the issues framed by the Complaints.

27. Admission of irrelevant testimony and exhibits would dilute the evidentiary record, obscure material facts, and impede the Commission's ability to make findings under Section 1501. Further, such irrelevant testimony and exhibits may introduce issues that are the subject of other existing or prospective proceedings before the Commission, and their introduction into this matter bears the risk of prejudicing the Company. Absent such limitations, the Public Input Hearings risk undue delay, cumulative testimony, prejudice to the Company, and inefficient use of Commission resources.

28. Accordingly, it is appropriate to limit the scope of testimony to exclude the above categories of topics.

E. Testimony from Persons Without Standing or Relevant Nexus Should Be Excluded as Irrelevant and Beyond the Scope of the Proceeding

29. The Commission's proceedings, including public input hearings, must remain confined to testimony that is relevant to the issues properly before the Commission and offered by

persons with a sufficient nexus to those issues. While public input hearings are designed to provide an opportunity for affected customers to be heard, these hearings are not unrestricted forums for testimony from individuals lacking any connection to the matters at issue.

30. Moreover, this matter pertains to Complaints filed by the OCA and the OSBA concerning service quality and water discoloration in a certain geographic area. Under the circumstances it is appropriate to restrict the Public Input Hearings in this case in a manner that pertains strictly to those matters raised in the Complaints.

31. The Commission's regulations permit exclusion of evidence where its probative value is outweighed by: the danger of unfair prejudice; the confusion of issues; and considerations of undue delay or waste of time. *See* 52 Pa. Code § 5.401.

32. As such, testimony offered by individuals who lack standing (*i.e.*, those who are not customers, not affected by the alleged events, or otherwise lack a direct or substantial interest in the subject matter of the Complaint) can have no bearing on the issues that are properly before the Commission, and therefore such testimony is not relevant and should not be permitted.

33. In the context of public input hearings, these principles require that testimony be limited to individuals who are affected customers or otherwise possess a direct and relevant connection to the matters identified in the Complaints. Permitting testimony from individuals without such a nexus would: be unfairly prejudicial; introduce immaterial and non-probative information; risk confusion of the issues and expansion of the proceeding; and undermine the orderly development of a record tied to the Complaints.

34. Testimony with no direct nexus to the subject matter lacks probative value and should be limited. Accordingly, the ALJ should rule that testimony from persons lacking a direct,

relevant connection to the events, service areas, and time period at issue shall be excluded or stricken or otherwise limited to matters within the proper scope of these proceedings.

III. RELIEF REQUESTED

WHEREFORE, for the foregoing reasons, Veolia Water Pennsylvania, Inc. respectfully requests that the ALJ:

A. Limit the Scope of the Public Input Hearings to those issues raised in the Complaints: Direct that testimony, argument, and evidence presented at the Public Input Hearings be strictly limited to matters raised in the formal complaints filed by the Office of Consumer Advocate and the Office of Small Business Advocate.

B. Define the Applicable Timeframe: Establish that permissible testimony shall be confined to events occurring between June 22, 2025 and October 24, 2025, as reflected in the allegations in the Complaints.

C. Define the Geographic Scope: Limit testimony to issues arising within the affected service areas identified in the Complaints, including portions of Susquehanna Township, Lower Paxton Township, Swatara Township, and Marysville Borough.

D. Exclude Irrelevant Categories of Testimony and Exhibits: Exclude, limit, or strike testimony, exhibits, or argument relating to: (i) service quality outside the affected service areas during any time period; (ii) service quality within the affected service areas but occurring outside of or not pertaining to the time period between June 22, 2025 and October 24, 2025; (iii) customer service concerns not pertaining to the time period between June 22, 2025 and October 24, 2025; (iv) remedial actions taken by the Company other than in response to service quality between June 22, 2025 and October 24, 2025; (v) claims for monetary damages or reimbursement not pertaining to the time period between June 22, 2025 and October 24, 2025; (vi) general rate concerns or

individual billing disputes not pertaining to the time period between June 22, 2025 and October 24, 2025; and (vii) matters currently pending in other proceedings before the Commission.

E. Limit Testimony to Relevant Participants: Direct that testimony be limited to customers or persons with a direct and substantial nexus to the service, events, locations, and time period at issue, and exclude, limit, or strike testimony from individuals lacking such nexus.

F. Issue Pre-Hearing Instructions: Commence the Public Input Hearings with limiting instructions to the public including without limitation: a requirement that testimony must relate to the defined timeframe, locations, and issues; advise that reasonable time limits may be imposed on individual speakers; and advise that testimony that becomes irrelevant, repetitive, or outside the scope of this proceeding may be excluded, limited, or stricken.

G. Grant Such Other Relief: Grant such other and further relief as the Administrative Law Judge deems just, proper, and consistent with due process and Commission practice.

Veolia Water Pennsylvania, Inc. expressly reserves its right to object to specific testimony, exhibits, and other evidence offered at the Public Input Hearings, and respectfully submits that pre-hearing limitations on the scope of admissible evidence are necessary to prevent prejudice, avoid undue delay and inefficient use of Commission resources, and ensure an orderly, efficient, and fair proceeding consistent with the Commission's rules and established practice. Accordingly, Veolia Water Pennsylvania, Inc. respectfully requests that the Commission grant the relief sought herein.
