SECOND PROCEDURAL ORDER

On March 3, 2026, NextEra Energy Transmission MidAtlantic, Inc. (NEET MA or Applicant) filed an application pursuant to Chapter 57, Subchapter G of the Commission’s regulations (Siting Application).¹ 52 Pa. Code §§57.71-57.77. The Siting Application requests that the Commission approve the siting and construction of a new 500 kilovolt (kV) transmission line associated with the MidAtlantic Resiliency Link Project (MARL Project) in Dunkard Township in Greene County, and Springhill Township in Fayette County, Pennsylvania.

The MARL Project involves the construction of a new approximately 107.5-mile 500-kV transmission line across Maryland, Pennsylvania, West Virginia, and Virginia, as well as a new Woodside 500/138 kV Substation in Virginia. The Pennsylvania portion of the MARL Project will extend from the existing FirstEnergy Corporation 502 Junction Substation in Greene County, Pennsylvania for approximately 2.7 miles to the West Virginia border, extend through West Virginia for 3.1 miles, and then re-enter Pennsylvania in Greene County, and traverse through Greene and Fayette Counties for 8.0 miles, and then proceed back into West Virginia (the Pennsylvania Portions). NEET MA seeks approval of the siting and construction of the approximately 10.7 miles long Pennsylvania Portions of the MARL Project.

On March 10, 2026, notice was issued that an initial telephonic prehearing conference for the Siting Application would be held on May 6, 2026, with Administrative Law Judge John M. Coogan presiding. On the same date, ALJ Coogan issued a prehearing conference order. On March 21, 2026, notice of the Siting Applications and prehearing conference appeared in the Pennsylvania Bulletin.² The prehearing conference order and Pennsylvania Bulletin notice advised that protests and petitions to intervene must be filed on or before May 1, 2026.

On April 20, 2026, NEET MA filed affidavits stating that notice of the Siting Application, including the protest and petition to intervene deadline and prehearing conference participation information, was published in the Herald Standard on March 20, 2026 and March 27, 2026. On April 30, 2026, NEET MA filed affidavits stating that notice of the Siting Application, including the protest and petition to intervene deadline and prehearing conference participation information, was published in the Observer Reporter on March 17, 2026 and March 24, 2026.

Also on March 3, 2026, NEET MA filed a separate application under Sections 1102 and 1103 of the Public Utility Code, 66 Pa.C.S. §§ 1102, 1103, requesting Commission approval of the necessary authority, approvals, and certificates of public convenience for NEET MA to become a public utility that can furnish and supply electric transmission service for the portions of the MARL Project in Pennsylvania (CPC Application).³ The CPC Application includes requests for approval, pursuant to 66 Pa.C.S. § 2101, of certain NEET MA affiliated interest agreements related to the MARL Project.

On March 21, 2026, notice of the CPC Application appeared in the Pennsylvania Bulletin.⁴ On March 26, 2026, notice was issued that an initial telephonic prehearing conference for the CPC Application would be held jointly with the prehearing conference for the Siting

Application due to the anticipated overlapping of issues and parties, with the potential for formal consolidation of the proceedings to be discussed at the prehearing conference. On March 27, 2026, ALJ Coogan issued a prehearing conference order for the CPC Application proceeding. The prehearing conference order and Pennsylvania Bulletin notice advised that protests and petitions to intervene must be filed on or before May 1, 2026.

On April 20, 2026, NEET MA filed affidavits stating that notice of the CPC Application, including the protest and petition to intervene deadline, was published in the Herald Standard on March 11, 2026 and March 25, 2026. On April 30, 2026, NEET MA filed affidavits stating that notice of the applications, including the protest and petition to intervene deadline, was published in the Observer Reporter on March 12, 2026 and March 26, 2026.

On April 30, 2026, notices were issued to add ALJ Erin L. Gannon as a presiding officer in both application proceedings.

On May 4, 2026, a Corrected Petition for Interlocutory Review and Answer to Material Questions of the Office of Consumer Advocate was filed (OCA Petition).⁵

The prehearing conference convened as scheduled on May 6, 2026. The following parties were present during the prehearing conference: NextEra Energy Transmission MidAtlantic, Inc; the Office of Consumer Advocate (OCA); Center for Coalfield Justice (CCJ); James E. Rockis, Quarter Pine Tree Farm Christmas Shoppe, LLC and J.E. Rockis Rental & Supply, Inc. (James E. Rockis and Rockis Entities); Charity Grimm Krupa; Linda-Maust Jacobs; and Elizabeth Arthur. All parties, except for Elizabeth Arthur, indicated they would like to participate in this proceeding as active parties. James Stickles and representatives from Ponderosa Properties were also present during the conference.

On May 7, 2026, the OCA filed a letter asking the Commission to treat the OCA Petition as inclusive of its brief in support of its petition. On May 11, 2026, NEET MA filed a

brief in opposition to the OCA Petition. On May 14, 2026, the CCJ filed an answer and brief in response to the OCA Petition. Also on May 14, 2026, Charity Grimm Krupa filed both a response to the OCA Petition and a Petition of Proposed Intervenor Charity Grimm Krupa for Stay of Proceedings Pending Final Resolution of Transource Litigation and Resolution of All Petitions to Intervene (Krupa Petition for Stay).

On May 18, 2026, we issued a Procedural Order, which consolidated the proceedings at Docket Nos. A-2026-3060856, A-2026-3060921, G-2026-3060941, G-2026-3060942, and set June 12, 2026 as the due date for filing pleadings in response to protests and petitions to intervene filed with the Commission by May 29, 2026.

On June 1, 2026, the Commission entered an Opinion and Order, ordering that the OCA Petition was improper, and returning the consolidated proceeding to the Office of Administrative Law Judge (June 2026 Order). The Commission further opined that “[a] decision

regarding the [Certificate of Public Convenience] should be finally decided before the Commission considers the merits of a NextEra Siting Application.” June 2026 Order at 11.

On June 3, 2026, NEET MA filed an answer to the Krupa Petition for Stay.

On June 8, 2026, Susan Hager filed a Protest.

On June 11, 2026, notice was issued that a further telephonic prehearing conference would be held on July 29, 2026.

On June 12, 2026, NEET MA filed answers and preliminary objections to 40 parties’ petitions to intervene and/or protests.

On June 16, 2026, Linda Maust-Jacobs filed a response to NEET MA’s preliminary objection.

Also on June 16, 2026, NEET MA filed motions for leave to late-file preliminary objections and answers to three more parties’ protests or petitions to intervene.

On June 23, 2026, Charity Grimm Krupa and Thomas Bozek III filed responses to NEET MA’s preliminary objections.

On June 26, 2026, we issued a Second Prehearing Conference Order regarding requirements for participation in the second Prehearing Conference scheduled for July 29, 2026.

On June 29, 2026, NEET MA filed preliminary objections to Susan Hagar’s Protest.

On July 1, 2026, we issued Prehearing Order #1, which addressed the status of all entities who filed petitions to intervene and protests by May 29, 2026. The party status of all

protestants and proposed intervenors who had filed pleadings before May 29, 2026, was recognized, except for Joni Bowers and Lu Swihart, whose petitions to intervene were denied.

On July 14, 2026, we issued Prehearing Order #2, which denied the preliminary objections to Susan Hager's Protest.

On July 15, 2026, we issued Prehearing Order # 3, which denied the Krupa Petition for Stay.

On July 23, 2026, NEET MA; OCA; CCJ; James E. Rockis and Rockis Entities; Ponderosa Properties; and Charity Grimm Krupa filed prehearing memoranda.

The second prehearing conference convened as scheduled on July 29, 2026. During the conference, various procedural matters were discussed. As discussed further below, the CPC Application proceeding was unconsolidated from the Siting Application proceeding during the July 29, 2026 prehearing conference. Therefore, this order is only being issued at Docket Nos. A-2026-3060921, G-2026-3060941, and G-2026-3060942, and the discussion and ordering paragraphs below provide specific instructions for future participation in the CPC Application only.

Consolidation/Procedural Schedule

Considering the Commission's June 2026 Order, we unconsolidated the CPC Application proceeding from the Siting Application proceeding. We also informed parties that we would hold the Siting Application in abeyance pending the Commission's decision in the CPC Application proceeding.

Given this ruling, NEET MA requested, and no party objected to, additional time for parties to confer regarding a procedural schedule for the CPC Application proceeding. We consented to providing parties additional time to confer regarding a procedural schedule and to provide us a proposed schedule. However, if parties are unable to agree to an acceptable

schedule, or a schedule is not proposed, it may be necessary to schedule a further prehearing conference.

As proposed by the OCA in its prehearing memorandum, two days of in-person public input hearings in Greene and Fayette Counties will tentatively be scheduled, with a morning and evening session in each county. This is subject to Commissioner approval. As was discussed during the prehearing conference, parties are advised that any proposed schedule must include adequate time for the steps needed to confirm suitable public input hearing venues.

Party Status

The following parties were present during the prehearing conference: NEET MA; OCA; CCJ; James E. Rockis and Rockis Entities; Ponderosa Properties; Charity Grimm Krupa; Linda-Maust Jacobs; Elizabeth Arthur; Phillip Tarcy; Christine Tarcy; Raymond Waddell II; Robert Zuchowsky; and Susan Zuchowsky. All parties, except for Elizabeth Arthur, indicated they would like to participate in this proceeding as active parties. Parties that did not participate in the prehearing conference and otherwise have not elected to be active parties will be treated as inactive parties. Further instructions regarding active versus inactive party status are provided in the ordering paragraphs below.

Consistent with the OCA's proposal in its prehearing memorandum, we will allow *pro se* active parties to provide oral testimony at scheduled public input hearings in lieu of submission of written testimony. However, if a party chooses to submit oral testimony at a scheduled public input hearing, they will not also be permitted to submit written testimony.

Discovery Modifications

The OCA proposed discovery modifications in its prehearing memorandum. No party objected to the proposed modifications. The proposed modifications are adopted herein.

Pro Hac Vice Motions

On July 20, 2026, NEET MA filed separate motions for admission *pro hac vice* of Anna E. Galanis, Esq., and Tracy C. Davis, Esq. With no objections from the parties, the *pro hac vice* motions are granted.

Service

No party objected to receiving service through e-mail. Parties were further advised that active party filings only need to be served on other active parties. Inactive parties will only receive documents issued by the Commission.

The below ordering paragraphs set forth the directions regarding these procedural matters, as well as further directions to the parties for participation in this proceeding.

ORDER

THEREFORE,

IT IS ORDERED:

1. That the proceeding at Docket No. A-2026-3060856 is unconsolidated from the proceeding at Docket Nos. A-2026-3060921, G-2026-3060941, G-2026-3060942.

2. That, because the proceedings have been unconsolidated, David J. Browne and Allen Ellsworth will be removed from the service list for this proceeding because their protests were filed only at Docket No. A-2026-3060856 (Siting Application).

3. That an order confirming a procedural schedule for Docket Nos. A-2026-3060921, G-2026-3060941, G-2026-3060942 will be issued either following written presentation to the undersigned of an acceptable proposal by active parties, or, if necessary, following a further prehearing conference.

4. That the active parties of record in this proceeding as of this date are NextEra Energy Transmission MidAtlantic, Inc.; the Office of Consumer Advocate; Center for Coalfield Justice; James E. Rockis, Quarter Pine Tree Farm Christmas Shoppe, LLC and J.E. Rockis Rental & Supply, Inc.; Ponderosa Properties; Charity Grimm Krupa; Linda-Maust Jacobs; Phillip Tarcy; Christine Tarcy; Raymond Waddell II and Samantha Wright; Robert Zuchowsky; and Susan Zuchowsky.

5. That, if you are an individual, you may represent yourself or you may have an attorney representing you. All others, including a partnership, corporation, limited liability company, trust, association, or governmental agency or subdivision, must be represented by an attorney licensed to practice law in Pennsylvania, or admitted *pro hac vice*. 52 Pa. Code §§ 1.21, 1.22. And, unless you are an attorney, you may not represent someone else.

6. That active parties must comply with Commission procedural regulations at 52 Pa. Code Chapters 1, 3, and 5 to participate in this proceeding. Each active party must serve a copy of every document it files and/or serves in this case, including, but not limited to, motions, testimony, and briefs, on the presiding officers and on every other active party. Discovery requests and responses should not be served on the presiding officers or filed with the Commission except as required by Commission regulations.

7. That *pro se* active parties may provide oral testimony at scheduled public input hearings in lieu of submission of written testimony. However, if a party chooses to submit oral testimony at a scheduled public input hearing, they will not also be permitted to submit written testimony.

8. That parties receiving this order who are not active parties will be treated as inactive parties. Likewise, new parties who subsequently file protests or petitions to intervene will be treated as inactive parties.

9. That inactive parties will only receive orders and decisions issued in this matter, and will not receive other documents filed and/or served in this proceeding. Inactive

parties may still attend and testify at a public input hearing, but will not be allowed to conduct discovery, file motions, submit pre-served written testimony, cross-examine active party witnesses at the evidentiary hearing, file briefs, or otherwise fully participate in the proceeding.

10. That if an inactive party wants to change their status to an active party, they shall file a letter to the dockets for this proceeding stating their choice. Alternatively, an inactive party may contact the Office of Consumer Advocate for assistance in choosing active party status, and the Office of Consumer Advocate shall file a letter to the dockets for this proceeding stating which inactive parties have chosen active party status. Letters indicating election of active party status shall also be served on the undersigned and all other active parties to this proceeding. A party that elects to become an active party will be deemed to be an active party unless their status is modified by further order.

11. That service in this proceeding to the presiding officers and by, to, and between the active parties will be email only, with no follow-up hard copy.

12. That the Motion of NextEra Energy Transmission MidAtlantic, Inc. for Admission *Pro Hac Vice* filed by Garrett P. Lent, Esquire, on July 20, 2026 for Anna E. Galanis, Esquire, to represent NextEra Energy Transmission MidAtlantic, Inc. in the above-captioned proceeding is hereby granted.

13. That Anna E. Galanis, Esquire, is admitted *pro hac vice* in the above-captioned proceeding, to appear as an attorney on behalf of NextEra Energy Transmission MidAtlantic, Inc.

14. That the Motion of NextEra Energy Transmission MidAtlantic, Inc. for Admission *Pro Hac Vice* filed by Garrett P. Lent, Esquire, on July 20, 2026 for Tracy C. Davis, Esquire, to represent NextEra Energy Transmission MidAtlantic, Inc. in the above-captioned proceeding is hereby granted.

15. That Tracy C. Davis, Esquire, is admitted *pro hac vice* in the above-captioned proceeding, to appear as an attorney on behalf of NextEra Energy Transmission MidAtlantic, Inc.

16. That in accordance with the provisions of Pa. B.A.R. 301(a) and Pa. R.C.P. 1012.1(d)(1), Garrett P. Lent, Esquire, shall remain as attorney of record for NextEra Energy Transmission MidAtlantic, Inc., and shall be present at all proceedings at which Ms. Galanis or Ms. Davis participate on behalf of NextEra Energy Transmission MidAtlantic, Inc., unless excused by the presiding officers.

17. That parties shall conduct discovery pursuant to 52 Pa. Code §§ 5.321-5.373, subject to the following modifications:

Effective as of July 29, 2026:

A. Answers to written interrogatories and requests for document production, entry for inspection, or other purposes shall be served in-hand within ten (10) calendar days of service.

B. Objections to interrogatories and/or requests for production shall be communicated orally to the propounding party within three (3) calendar days of service of the interrogatories; unresolved objections shall be served in writing to the propounding party within five (5) calendar days of service of the interrogatories and/or requests for production.

C. Motions to dismiss objections and/or direct the answering of interrogatories and/or requests for production shall be filed within five (5) business days of service of written objections.

D. Answers to motions to dismiss objections and/or answering of interrogatories and/or requests for production shall be filed within three (3) business days of service of such motions.

E. Requests for admissions will be deemed admitted unless answered within ten (10) calendar days or objected to within five (5) calendar days of service.

F. Answers to on-the-record data requests shall be served in-hand within five (5) calendar days of the requests.

G. Any discovery or discovery-related pleadings (such as objections, motions, and answers to same) served after 4:30 p.m. Monday through Thursday or after 1:30 p.m. on a Friday or the day before a holiday will be deemed to have been served on the next business day for purposes of calculating the due date for any responsive filing.

Effective as of the date to be established for service of rebuttal testimony:

A. Answers to interrogatories and responses to requests for document production, entry for inspection, or other purposes shall be served within five (5) calendar days of service of the interrogatories or requests for production.

B. Objections to interrogatories and/or requests for production shall be communicated orally to the propounding party within two (2) calendar days of service; unresolved objections shall be served on the propounding party in writing within three (3) calendar days of service of the interrogatories and/or requests for production.

C. Motions to dismiss objections and/or direct the answering of interrogatories and/or requests for production shall be filed within three (3) business days of service of written objections.

D. Answers to motions to dismiss objections and/or direct the answering of interrogatories and/or requests for production shall be filed within three (3) business days of service of such motions.

E. Requests for admission shall be deemed admitted unless answered or objected to within three (3) calendar days of service.

F. Discovery requests and discovery related pleadings (such as objections, motions, and answers to same) served after 4:30 p.m. Monday through Thursday or after 1:30 p.m. on a Friday or the day preceding a holiday shall be deemed to have been served on the next business day.

18. The parties are encouraged to cooperate and exchange information on an informal basis. The parties shall cooperate rather than engage in numerous or protracted discovery disagreements that require formal resolution. Parties represented by counsel are expected to provide *pro se* active parties a reasonable accommodation if *pro se* active parties seek a reasonable extension of time to perform any act required under discovery rules. Nonetheless, if necessary, motions to compel may be presented to the undersigned. All motions to compel shall contain a certification by counsel setting forth the informal discovery undertaken and their efforts to resolve their discovery disputes informally. If a motion to compel does not contain this certification, the parties will be directed to pursue informal discovery. There are limitations on discovery and sanctions for abuse of the discovery process. 52 Pa. Code §§ 5.361, 5.371-5.372.

19. That the parties shall stipulate to any matters they reasonably can to expedite this proceeding, lessen the burden of time and expenses in litigation on all parties and conserve administrative hearing resources. 52 Pa. Code §§ 5.232 and 5.234.

20. That the parties should do their best to avoid the use of **Confidential Security Information (CSI)**, as defined by 35 P.S. § 2141 et seq., in this proceeding. Where possible, the parties should develop alternative means of introducing information into the record, such as joint stipulations or redaction when proposing testimony or exhibits. If the parties cannot avoid the use of CSI, the parties are to contact the undersigned in advance of any submission, and prior to the evidentiary hearing.

21. That any provision of this order may be modified upon motion and good cause shown by any party in interest in accordance with 52 Pa. Code §5.223(a).
